

From the Pastor

REVISED PRAYER OF ABSOLUTION. For over a decade, English translations of all liturgical rites have been revised to be a more actual, rather than literal version of the original

texts which are in Latin, which is still the Church's 'official' language. In 2011, the holy Mass was revised; "And also with you." became "And with your spirit." - one of many revisions. So far, the ritual books for what we now call the 'Order' rather than 'Rite' of these Sacraments have been revised; the year of their mandatory use follows each Sacrament: Confirmation and Matrimony [2016]; Baptism [2020]; Ordination of Deacons, Priests and Bishops [2021]; Penance [2023] and in 2022, the USA's Bishops approved the revision of the Anointing of the Sick and is awaiting approval or 'recognitio' from the Vatican. Here is the slightly altered Prayer of Absolution from the revised Order of Penance:

The Revised Prayer of Absolution

"God, the Father of mercies,
through the death and resurrection of his Son has
reconciled the world to himself
and poured out [currently, sent] the Holy Spirit
among us for the forgiveness of sins;
through the ministry of the Church may God grant
[currently, give] you pardon and peace,
and I absolve you from your sins
in the name of the Father, [+]
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The only changes are: "poured out" will replace "sent," and "grant" will replace "give."

Why the change? While the basic answer is the revised translations are closer to the original Latin texts, the purpose of this process is found in the 2001 Instruction 'Liturgiam Authenticam' which set the norms for translating the Roman Liturgy into local languages. In the past, a very 'relaxed' or 'casual' approach was taken to interpret the Latin into English. Some criticized the texts used from 1968 until recent revisions as awkward, 'dumbed-down,' or even erroneous. As I have often said, in the former translations I felt as if I was "telling God what to do!"

I was glad to see phrases in Eucharistic Prayer III like "we ask you to make them holy by the power of your Spirit ..." changed to "we humbly implore you, O Lord, through the same Spirit graciously make them holy ..." and "Welcome into your kingdom our departed brothers and sisters and all who have left this world in your friendship ..." is now "To our departed brothers and sisters and to all who were pleasing to you at their passing from this life give kind admittance to your kingdom." The words, and the revised Prayer of Absolution are, to me, much more humble, majestic, respectful, soothing, and prayerful.

To say God "SENT the Holy Spirit" made the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity seem 'lesser' than the First Person, the Father. Only a stronger person, or who outranks another, can 'send' them. Since all Three Persons are in their "unity in substance, and equality in majesty," [Preface for the Most Holy Trinity] equal Persons, the revised prayer says God "POURED OUT the Holy Spirit ..." To 'pour out' is a much more lavish, expressive, overflowing term than to 'send.' Through the properly received * Prayer of Absolution, we are bathed in God's gracious forgiveness and mercy!

There is also a subtle but important difference between 'to give' and 'to grant,' which is why I added an * above. Confession is not a 'magic eraser' that simply 'makes sins disappear' without some action on our part. Besides being truly contrite and sincerely avoiding future sins, being 'granted' pardon and peace suggests much more is required. A 'grant' implies that the receiver will use what is 'granted' in specific ways.

Jesus concluded one parable about our need to forgive as we are forgiven by saying, "So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives his brother from his heart." [Matthew 18:35] What will God do to those who do not 'grant' to others what is 'granted' to them? "You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?" Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt." [18:32b-34] This Lent, may we confess our sins - and forgive as we are forgiven!

FIRST EUCHARIST PARENT MEETING





If you have been sexually abused as a minor by a member of the clergy or anyone representing the Catholic Church, or if you know of someone who was, you can report that abuse through the diocesan

The Diocese of Trenton reports any allegations of sexual abuse to the appropriate law enforcement agencies. Anyone with an allegation is also encouraged to provide that information to local law enforcement authorities.

Before coming to Confession on **FRIDAY, MARCH 31** between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the Sacrament, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the *revised Acts of Contrition* PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #2 - from the revised Order of Penance

Remember, Lord, the compassion and mercy
you showed long ago.

Do not recall my sins and failings.
In your mercy remember me, Lord,
because of your goodness.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON THE BAPTISMAL PROMISES

*Do you renounce sin, so as to live
in the freedom of the children of God?*

Have I sought the good life, not only for myself, but for all my brothers and sisters? Have I always acted as a child of God, as another Christ, for all the world to see? Have I shown in my attitudes and actions, in my example and priorities, that I am a Christian? As a child of God, do I speak regularly to my God, my loving Father, in prayer? Do I listen to and heed God's voice as He speaks to me in sacred Scripture and at holy Mass?

*Do you renounce the lure of evil,
so that sin may have no mastery over you?*

Have I given into my temptations? Have I failed to help build God's Kingdom on earth? Have I allowed the idols of money, or property, or color, or class, or position to get in the way of loving others? Have I tried to live by God's truth as taught: in the Ten Commandments; in Gospel values; in Church teaching; and by the dictates of my conscience, God's Spirit within me?

Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin?

Have I given up my struggle against sin, or lost hope that God can, and will, help me to 'sin no more?' Have I tried to seek peace and to live in peace as part of one human family? Have I allowed Satan's prejudices to create a barrier to unity and peace? Have I given my attention and deeper trust to money, superstition, or other false gods? Have I voiced my opposition to all forms of darkness: abortion and euthanasia; all types of abuse and injustice; an 'anything goes' mentality?

*Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth?*

Do I see myself, and others, as children of the one Father, who loves us and cares for us? Do I see the hand of God in all created things: in myself; in my neighbor; in the gift of nature? Have I generously used God's gifts of time, health, strength, fortune, and talent in service for the Gospel? As a co-creator of the world with God, have I tried to further establish His Kingdom in my family, at my workplace or school, and among my relatives and friends?

*Do you believe in Jesus Christ His only Son, our Lord,
who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified,
died, and was buried, rose from the dead,
and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?*

Do I believe "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" [John 3:16] - which includes me? Do I feel unloved, or uncared for, by God? Have I patiently accepted my disappointments and sorrows by which "in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ?" [Colossians 1:24] Do I try to 'make it on my own,' forgetting that Jesus is at God's right hand, interceding and pleading for me?

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Resurrection of the Body and life everlasting?

Have I ignored the Spirit of God who dwells within the Church, who dwells within me? Have I forgotten that we are all connected by Faith to one another and to the whole Church, here on earth and in heaven? Am I so centered on the things of this world that I have forgotten we are created to share eternal happiness with God in heaven for all eternity? Have I lived as a temple of God's Spirit and a channel of God's love for all to see?
