

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT



Today's Readings and Gospel Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Reading I: Genesis 22: 1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

Yahweh gives Abraham the ultimate test, that of sacrificing his favorite son Isaac. Observing Abraham's unquestioning obedience, Yahweh calls off the killing, accepting the sacrifice of a nearby ram. He also promises Abraham abundant rewards, including the growth of a great people as his descendants.

Reading II: Romans 8: 31b-34

St. Paul provides his readers a solid basis for their hope, specifying along the way the unique power of Jesus' intercession for us with His Father. He also asks "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

The Gospel: Mark 9: 2-10

The transfiguration of Jesus was such a dazzling experience for Peter that he nervously proposes setting up three tents so that the three persons from the world beyond could stay and prolong it. But immediately after, Jesus brings the three apostles down to earth to complete their earthly mission.

From the Pastor
2nd Sunday of Lent - B
February 28, 2021

REVERENT ROYAL. On March 4, we may commemorate the Patron Saint of Lithuania and one of Poland's many Patron Saints: Saint Casimir. [In Lent, Optional Memorials are called Com- memorations; their orations are only used where there is

strong devotion to that Saint.] Born on October 3, 1458 in the royal palace in Krakow, Poland, he was the 3rd of King Casimir IV and Elizabeth of Austria's 13 children. He and his brothers were well trained in Catholicism; at a young age he was known for his piety and concern for the poor. After praying the Collect for the Mass offered in his honor, we will detail Saint Casimir's brief but bold and beautiful life.

Collect - Saint Casimir

Almighty God, to serve you is to reign;
grant that, with the help of Saint Casimir's
intercession, we may constantly serve you
in holiness and justice.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

SHORT AND SWEET. Like the Collect prayed on his feast day, Saint Casimir's life was also very short and sweet. He died at just age 25, on March 4, 1484, after suffering from tuberculosis, while in Lithuania. Having had a strong devotion to our Blessed Mother, he was interred with a copy of his favorite Marian hymn, which some may know as 'Daily, Daily, Sing to Mary.' Even though he did not write it or compose any music, it is known as 'The Hymn of Saint Casimir.' Destined to be king, either in his father's place or in some other earthly realm, he prayed for the grace - to be - and do - whatever God willed.

ROCKY ROYAL RELATIONSHIP. As expected, Saint Casimir's earthly father had great plans for him, but his son was of another mindset. He shunned regal trappings, preferring to be with the ordinary, simple people. As was common then, he imposed harsh penitential practices on himself that we might find odd: sleeping on the floor; excessive fasting; visiting those sick with communicable diseases; keeping all-night vigils, etc. These probably contributed to his sickness and early death, and raised his father's concerns about his well-being and fitness to reign.

When Saint Casimir was around 15, his father, at the request of Hungarian nobles, sent him as head of the army to help those seeking to overthrow their king, whom they had deemed as evil. Despite his protests, his father prevailed; but when the rebellion seemed doomed to fail, he returned home, whereupon his father imprisoned him! His father also tried to arrange a politically-motivated marriage to an emperor's daughter, but he maintained his self-imposed promise of celibacy, yet he always remained calm and cheerful, respectful and upright. So much so that when his father left Poland to attend to state business in Lithuania, he left Prince Casimir in charge of the realm - for almost 2 years.

NO ROYAL REST FOR THE WEARY. After his funeral, he was buried in the Royal Chapel of Vilnius' Cathedral, where his mortal remains rested for over a century. His cult spread quickly, and his intercession was invoked by Lithuanians during wars with the Russians in the 1500's. In 1604, Pope Clement VIII brought the canonization process to its conclusion, declaring him a Saint in a solemn ceremony at the Vilnius Cathedral. In 1636, his remains were transferred to the newly built Chapel of Saint Casimir, but between 1655 and 1661, Russian military occupiers destroyed that Chapel and the Vilnius Cathedral. However, his relics had been secretly hidden during the war, and were returned to the cathedral in 1667. His body was safeguarded elsewhere during the 18th Century Russian-Sweden war, but his longest 'exile' was the 4-decade long 'Iron Curtain's' brutal, anti-religion Soviet occupation. His coffin was triumphantly returned on March 4, 1989, two years before the collapse of the USSR.

ROYAL ROLE MODEL. In his 1984 address to Lithuanian pilgrims on the 500th anniversary of Saint Casimir's death, Pope Saint John Paul II asked them - and us - to follow Saint Casimir's example by also filtering all we have - and all we can do - through the ideals of our Catholic Faith. He encouraged all who feel pressured by family or friends to misuse their gifts and talents, their position and power, to seek Saint Casimir's intercession. Saint Casimir, pray for us!

A SLIGHT ALTERATION IN OUR PRAYERS

You may have noticed a slight change in the Collect (Opening Prayer) at Mass. Beginning Ash Wednesday, the concluding doxology of orations at Mass and other rites will no longer be, "... in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever" but simply "... in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever."

What's different? Just one word: the word 'one' is removed. Prior to the 1960's Second Vatican Council, our prayers did NOT say "one God" but simply "God" - but while 'one' was added to English translations of the revised orations, it was not added in other languages. This minor alteration will more fully unite us in prayers with our Catholic sisters and brothers around the world, and avoid any misconceptions of the Most Holy Trinity.

While the Blessed Trinity is a mystery beyond our comprehension, adding 'one' to our prayers in reference to God only muddies it the more. Amen.





