

HOW TO PREPARE FOR CONFESSION. By Parish custom, we do not have Penance Services, instead, we offer Examinations of Conscience in the bulletin and on our website in the weeks before our Lent

Confessions: March 22, 5:30-7:00 pm. The revised Order of Penance provides two Penitential Celebrations during Lent or PCDLs.

This is Part 3 of our 4-part series on the two model PCDLs provided by the Order of Penance, which are intended to help us more fruitfully celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. Here is the reflection on the second sample Penance Service provides for a PCDL; We start by commenting on its 'theme':

Penance Prepares for a Fuller Participation in the Paschal Mystery of Christ for the salvation of the world.

Lenten Triple Play. We could call this theme the 'Lenten Triple Play,' but that title is used for Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. The triple play in this Penance Service's theme is 1] Our Fuller Participation in 2] Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection which is for 3] the salvation of all people. Notice the 'timing' in this recap of salvation history: we NOW share - in what Christ OFFERED, ONCE FOR ALL* - for the salvation of ALL people of ALL TIMES and PLACES. [*Here's the meaning of "once for all:" "[Jesus] has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself." [Hebrews 7:27]

This puts the onus on us to accept what has already been provided for us, so that through us, more and more people may come to share in the graces Christ won for all of us by His Passion, Death and Resurrection. Let that sink in ... we are invited to enjoy what was already gained for us: forgiveness of all our sins - so that - through us - others may be prompted to enjoy God's gracious pardon and peace. So, by just telling your family and friends that you are going to Confession, you might move them to come and receive Absolution ... and peace of mind and heart.

This second Penance Service begins with an **Invitation to Prayer** that echoes its threefold theme: 1] Our Fuller Participation in 2] Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection which is for 3] the salvation of all people. It stresses the communal aspect of sin and redemption. For our Faith is NOT a 'Me and Jesus' event; it is a family event, which we must share with ALL our sisters and brothers - even those who have yet to join - or who have 'left' or excused themselves from being a part of our Catholic Church family.

My brothers and sisters, let us pray that by penance we may be united with Christ, who was crucified for our sins, and so share with all people in his Resurrection.

By our acts of penance, we are "filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ" [Colossians 1:24] - not that Jesus did not do enough - but the work that Christ began is far from finished. Sadly, sometimes even we 'practicing Catholics' are part of the problem, for our faults and failings hinder the Gospel's proclamation and acceptance. The Good News is our acts of penance, willingness to be forgiven and to forgive others, and other signs of our faith-in-action, is an example to non-believers and those who have fallen away. Here is the first of two Opening Prayers:

O Lord, our God and Father,
who have given us life through the
Passion of your Son, grant that,
joined through penance to his Death,
we may also be sharers, with all people,
in his Resurrection.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sacred Scripture assures us that: "If we have died with him, we shall also live with him." [2 Timothy 2:11] So, let's all die to sin so we can live more fully for - and one day - with Christ! To do this, we must examine our conscience - make a good Confession - perform the penance prescribed for us - and then share our new life in Christ with others. Next week: the rest of the PCDL's second sample Lenten Penance Service.


OCIA News

Before coming to Confession on **FRIDAY, MARCH 22** between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the Sacrament, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the revised Acts of Contrition PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #10 - from the revised Order of Penance

Lord Jesus, Son of God,
have mercy on me, a sinner.

**EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON
THE BEATITUDES: MATTHEW 5:3-12**

*Blessed are the poor in spirit,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.*

Do I truly recognize my complete dependence on God?
Have I been proud, arrogant or self-righteous, selfish, greedy, possessive or self-seeking? Do I crave status, recognition, power, material possessions or wealth?

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Do I endure difficulties and afflictions with faith and patience? Do I have compassion for the poor, the hungry, the addicted, the sick, the lonely, the sinful?

Am I truly sorry for my own sins and faults?

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Am I gentle with others, or am I harsh in my behavior? Do I seek to dominate others at home, school, work, church and elsewhere?

Do I lose my temper, nurse hatred in my heart or the desire for revenge?

Am I impatient, resentful, bitter, unforgiving, insulting or abusive?
Do I try to love my enemies?

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Do I thirst for holiness? Do I truly yearn for God's will to be done, in my life and in all things? Do I try to cultivate a righteous and holy life through prayer, fasting, almsgiving, worship, the reading of Holy Scripture, frequent Confession and Communion? Am I lukewarm in my faith, lazy, negligent or apathetical?

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Do I turn away from those who need my help? Turn my back on the poor, hungry, rejected, lonely and needy?

Do I strive to understand and forgive others? Am I indifferent or judgmental?

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

Do I love purity and honesty? Am I dishonest in my speech or actions? Are the motives or intentions of my actions evil or selfish? Have I given way to lust, impure thoughts, words or deeds - prejudice, hypocrisy, pretense or self-indulgent, sinful passions?

*Blessed are the peacemakers,
for they will be called children of God.*

Am I at peace with God? Do I have God's peace in my heart? Have I been angry, aggressive or impatient? Do I foster peace at home, work, church and community? Have I been irritable or bold? Have I caused division and discord? Is my criticism harmful and disruptive, or does it build up others in charity?

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Have I complained when persecuted for God's sake? Prayed for my enemies? Failed to defend others for fear of humiliation or persecution? Have I had the courage to stand up for the truth despite criticism, ridicule or persecution? Am I afraid to witness my faith in Jesus and His Church?

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me, for your reward will be great in heaven.

Is the joy of Christ in my heart, even in trying moments? Do I give thanks to God at all times, in every circumstance, or do I complain often? Have I been pessimistic, negative, despondent, or despairing? Have I truly delighted in the promise of God's treasures in heaven?
