



From the Pastor
1st Sunday of Lent - C
March 6, 2022

REVISED BLESSING OF SACRED OILS. As we explained in the 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time - C bulletin

article [January 30, 2022],

the Church has been in the process of revising her sacred texts for Sacraments and other rituals. On March 6, 2019, the revised Rite for Blessing the Sacred Oils went into effect. This Rite and the Annual Renewal of Priestly Promises, usually occurs during the **Chrism Mass**; we never explained the now 'old' Rite or Priestly Promises, so we will do so on these five Lenten Sundays and Sunday of the Passion of the Lord [aka Palm Sunday].

The rubrics call for the **Chrism Mass**, at which a **Bishop** must be the main celebrant, united with his **Priests**, to be held on **Holy Thursday** morning. Its **Blessing of Oils** anticipates our Lord's being anointed before His **Passion and Death**.

However, most dioceses move it to another day in **Holy Week** so more **Priests** can concelebrate. It is one of the most festive, moving clerical events of the year; while not all can come to our **Co-Cathedral in Freehold**, I believe it will be **livestreamed** and recorded. Show your support for the clergy by watching our **Chrism Mass** on **Monday of Holy Week, April 11, at 7:30 pm**.

After the **Chrism Mass**, bottles or 'stocks' of the **Three Oils** are entrusted to each Parish and institution like hospitals where they are kept near the **Baptismal Font** or in an **Ambry**. An **Ambry** is often a recessed cabinet in or near the **Sanctuary** or near the **Baptismal Font**. Older churches had a niche with an opaque door marked 'Olea Sancta' - Latin for 'Holy Oils'.

Current practice is to display them through glass so they can be seen. It is amazing how often a child will ask, "What's in those jars?" which can lead to a lesson about our great **Catholic Faith** and its customs and rituals. **Priests** customarily keep a small 'stock' of the **Oil of the Sick** in their residence, and in their cars, so they have it readily available when the need arises.

In the weeks to come, we will explain each of the **Three Holy Oils**, including the renewed **Prayer of Blessing** for the **Oil of the Sick** and the **Oil of Catechumens**, and the two **Prayers of**

Consecration for the **Sacred Chrism**. What's the difference? A **Consecratory Prayer** is the highest form of a **Blessing**. Thus, the **Eucharistic Prayer**, commonly called 'the **Consecration**' is our greatest prayer and liturgical action.

WHAT DOES 'OI' - 'SC' - & 'OS' MEAN? The jars, stocks or containers of **Holy Oils** are usually engraved or marked with letters to differentiate and identify them. Here are their meanings:

OI = Oleum Infirmorum. English translations render this Latin term as the 'Oil of the Sick' or the 'Oil of Healing'.

SC = Sanctum Chrisma. English translations render this Latin term as 'Sacred Chrism' based on the term 'Christ' or 'Anointed One'. While the other two **Holy Oils** are just pure olive oil, some sort of perfume [i.e., balsam] is added to **Sacred Chrism**, giving it a distinct color from the other two and a pleasing fragrance.

OS = Oleum Sanctum. English translations render this Latin term as simply 'Holy Oil', but I have heard some use the confusing term, 'Oil of the Sacrament'. Since all three **Holy Oils** are used during the celebration of a **Sacrament**, crafters of oil stocks use this designation:

OC = Oleum Catechumenorum. English translations render this Latin term as the 'Oil of Catechumens'. A **Catechumen** is one who has begun the process of preparing for their **Baptism**.

As you will see in the weeks to come, the use of **Holy Oils** is very biblical; the **Prayers of Blessing** or **Consecration** of the **Holy Oils** make numerous references to their scriptural basis. When **Jesus** forgave the **Penitent Woman**, He allowed her to anoint his feet with an alabaster flask of ointment, and scolded **Simon**, His **Pharisee** host, but praised the woman: "You did not anoint my head with oil, but she anointed my feet with ointment." [see Luke 7:36-50] In **Matthew 26:13**, He added: "Amen, I say to you, wherever this gospel is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be spoken of, in memory of her." And when **Jesus** sent the **Twelve** out on mission, "they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them." [Mark 6:13] and one **Apostle** mandated anointings. [see James 5:13-15]. May this **Lent** - and these **Holy Oil** articles - help you grow in faith!

Before coming to *Confession* on *FRIDAY, APRIL 8, between 5:30 - 7:00 PM*, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the *Sacrament*, start with your state in life [i.e., *I'm married, single, parent, etc.*] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the nine official *Acts of Contrition* PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #2 - from the Rite of Penance

Remember, Lord, your compassion and mercy
which you showed long ago.
Do not recall the sins and failings of my youth.
In your mercy remember me, Lord,
because of your goodness.

**EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE
BASED ON THE BAPTISMAL PROMISES**

*Do you renounce sin, so as to live
in the freedom of the children of God?*

Have I sought the good life, not only for myself, but for all my brothers and sisters? Have I always acted as a child of God, as another Christ, for all the world to see? Have I shown in my attitudes and actions, in my example and priorities, that I am a Christian? As a child of God, do I speak regularly to my God, my loving Father, in prayer? Do I listen to and heed God's voice as He speaks to me in sacred Scripture and at holy Mass?

*Do you renounce the lure of evil,
so that sin may have no mastery over you?*

Have I given into my temptations? Have I failed to help build God's Kingdom on earth? Have I allowed the idols of money, or property, or color, or class, or position to get in the way of loving others? Have I tried to live by God's truth as taught: in the Ten Commandments; in Gospel values; in Church teaching; and by the dictates of my conscience, God's Spirit within me?

Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin?

Have I given up my struggle against sin, or lost hope that God can, and will, help me to 'sin no more?' Have I tried to seek peace and to live in peace as part of one human family? Have I allowed Satan's prejudices to create a barrier to unity and peace? Have I given my attention and deeper trust to money, superstition, or other false gods? Have I voiced my opposition to all forms of darkness: abortion and euthanasia; all types of abuse and injustice; an 'anything goes' mentality?

*Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth?*

Do I see myself, and others, as children of the one Father, who loves us and cares for us? Do I see the hand of God in all created things: in myself; in my neighbor; in the gift of nature? Have I generously used God's gifts of time, health, strength, fortune, and talent in service for the Gospel? As a co-creator of the world with God, have I tried to further establish His Kingdom in my family, at my workplace or school, and among my relatives and friends?

Do you believe in Jesus Christ His only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

Do I believe "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" [John 3:16] - which includes me? Do I feel unloved, or uncared for, by God? Have I patiently accepted my disappointments and sorrows by which "in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ?" [Colossians 1:24] Do I try to 'make it on my own,' forgetting that Jesus is at God's right hand, interceding and pleading for me?

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Resurrection of the Body and life everlasting?

Have I ignored the Spirit of God who dwells within the Church, who dwells within me? Have I forgotten that we are all connected by Faith to one another and to the whole Church, here on earth and in heaven? Am I so centered on the things of this world that I have forgotten we are created to share eternal happiness with God in heaven for all eternity? Have I lived as a temple of God's Spirit and a channel of God's love for all to see?
