HOW TO PREPARE FOR CONFESSION. By Parish custom, we do not have Penance Services, instead, we offer Examinations of Conscience in the bulletin and on our website in the weeks before our Lent Confessions: which is FRIDAY, March

22nd from 5:30 -7:00 pm. The revised Order of Penance provides two Penitential Celebrations during Lent or PCDLs. This is Part 4 of the 4-part series on the two model PCDLs provided by the Order of Penance, intended to help us more fruitfully celebrate the Sacrament of Penance.

Last week we reflected on the title of the second sample: 'Penance Prepares for a Fuller Participation in the Paschal Mystery of Christ for the salvation of the world', on its Introduction to Prayer and the first of its two Opening Prayers. Today, we start the reflection by commenting on the second of its two Opening Prayers.

Grant, almighty, and merciful Father, that, moved and strengthened by your Spirit, we may always carry in our bodies the Death of Jesus, that his life may also be shown forth in us. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

This prayer's main point is found in its reference to this quote from Saint Paul: we are - or should be "always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body." [2 Corinthians 4:10] It is like the point made in the first Opening Prayer [see last week's article] from another Pauline Letter: "... in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body." [Colossians 1:24] To better understand Saint Paul's point, it helps to recall the challenges faced by the Corinthians,- which we also face these days:

- they were discouraged by their own sins and the sins of others;
- they were shunned for criticizing the immoral and unethical activities of their time;

- ♦ they were frustrated by those who, even among their ranks, ignored God and divinely revealed truths and ordinances;
- they were ignored, due to their own faults and failings, although they recognized that "we hold this treasure in earthen vessels." [2 Corinthians 4:7]
- they confessed that, although they were up against tremendous odds, that, by God's mercy, they would be successful. [Read 2 Corinthians 4:1-18] for Paul's most encouraging words.]

This second Penance Service continues with the Confiteor: "I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do; through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God." It is also permissible to pray any Act of Contrition instead - or in addition to the Confiteor. This is followed by the Lord's Prayer or Our Father and this special conclusion:

Deliver us, Father, from every evil, and through the blessed Passion of your Son, to which we are joined through penance make us share joyfully in his Resurrection. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

This second Penance Service concludes with a suggestion to perform one or two devotional acts: Adoration of the holy Cross as we do on Good Friday - or pray the Stations of the Cross. Every Catholic home should have at least one blessed crucifix: a cross with the image of Christ crucified. A Priest or Deacon can bless it for you; just bring it with you to holy Mass and ask for the blessing afterwards. While we would not have a set of Stations of the Cross in our home, we can have booklets - or go online to a website that provides a Stations of the Cross service. Go to the parish-provided free www.formed.org and type in Stations of the Cross on the search magnifying glass; there are numerous varieties of the Stations just waiting for you to use.

Next week: why it is almost impossible for us to have General Absolution or Absolution without the individual confession of sins to a Priest here and now.

Before coming to Confession on **FRIDAY, MARCH 22** between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the Sacrament, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the revised Acts of Contrition PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #9 - from the revised Order of Penance


Have mercy on me, O God, according to your merciful love; turn your face from my sins and blot out all my guilt; create a pure heart in me, O God, renew an upright spirit deep within me.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON CATHOLIC DOCTRINES

These questions express specific Catholic doctrines - but remember three things: 1] These questions get at what good Catholics should try their best to do; good Catholics cannot be perfect, otherwise only God could be a good Catholic; fidelity to doctrine is a life-long challenge, for which God has provided the Sacrament of Confession. 2] To one extent or another, everyone finds Catholic doctrine challenging; the problem is not the doctrine but our fallen human nature. 3] It is never too late to start becoming faithful to a doctrine.

1. Do I seek the objective truth about all things?
2. Do I recognize and appreciate objective truth, goodness, and beauty outside the Catholic Church as revelations or reflections of the one true God?
3. Do I live to be in union with the one, true God who is three Divine Persons of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and to share in Their perfect love?
4. Do I accept that the one, true God has most fully revealed Himself in Jesus Christ, who is God the Son?
5. Do I accept that Jesus Christ has most fully revealed Himself in His Death and Resurrection?
6. Do I accept that Jesus Christ is best known or revealed in the Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition of the Catholic Church, which Christ Himself founded?
7. Do I accept that only the Magisterium has the God-given authority to interpret Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition and thus to define the Catholic Faith in doctrines that are always and everywhere true?

8. Do I accept the doctrine and discipline taught by the Magisterium while knowing that I do not have to agree with their social analysis and prudential judgments?
9. Do I respect the office of the Magisterium even when it is held by sinful men?
10. Do I accept Catholic doctrine about salvation: Heaven, Hell, Purgatory, and Judgment?
11. Do I accept that the Catholic Faith alone has the fullness of the means of salvation - the most complete creed, worship, morality, and prayer?
12. Do I try to act according to Catholic moral doctrine, which is based on the New Testament's two Great Commandments to love God and love neighbor, and the Old Testament's Ten Commandments? Do I love God more than anything else? Do I love others by treating them as I would want to be treated? Do I obey all of God's Commandments?
13. Do I worship according to Catholic liturgical teachings, especially by participating in Mass every week on the Lord's Day and on Holy Days of Obligation (or their vigils) and by going to Confession regularly?
14. Do I pray daily and try to discover the many forms of prayer in the Catholic Faith?
15. Am I developing a unique personal relationship with God that never contradicts Catholic doctrine?
16. Do I support the Church, especially a Parish, to the degree my time, talent, and treasure allow?
17. Am I a Catholic 24/7? Is my Catholic identity what most defines me - more than race/ethnicity, economic class, gender, sexual orientation, culture, family, personality, physical appearance, job, or anything else?
18. Do I try to convert/invite non-Catholics to the Catholic Church, while respecting the religious freedom of others, by proposing and not imposing what can only be known by Faith?
