

From the Pastor
3rd Sunday of
Lent - A
March 12, 2023

REVISED ORDER OF PENANCE. Part 3 of our miniseries on the revised 'Order of Penance' addresses the common question: "Why do I need to confess my sins?" of which there are

innumerable variations. Some are: "Why must I confess to a Priest?" - "Why can't I pray to God directly or choose my own penance?" While Confession is only mandatory for those guilty of serious, grave or mortal sins, it may be most helpful for those struggling with habitual sins ... and those trying to rise above ordinary temptations or venial sins.

HOW IS SIN CONQUERED & FORGIVEN? As we noted last week, sin was first 'attacked' through the Prophets; then it was conquered, along with death, most exceptionally, through our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection. Christ then enabled the graces He won for us by His Paschal Mystery to be channeled into the world through the Apostles and their successors. Now, and until Christ's return in glory, God's grace comes to us primarily through the Sacraments.

BAPTISM. As we profess in the Nicene Creed, "we confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins" by which our old self is crucified with Christ, and we become a new creation. By entering the waters of rebirth, we are washed clean of all sin, and freed from slavery to sin as were our ancestors, who passed dry-shod through the Red Sea waters. Then, risen with Christ, we must strive to continually live for God and in loving service to others - but this is only a beginning!

EUCARIST. To help us 'stay the course,' we are regularly invited to the *Table of the Lord* to be nourished, as newborns feed off their mothers, by the *Body and Blood of Christ*. By receiving His *Body* handed over for us and His *Blood* poured out for us, made present through the sacred mysteries, we are empowered to live our new life in *Christ*. We are also aided by the *Seven Gifts of Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord*, which we receive in *Confirmation*.

However, even all this is not enough to keep us free from sin and in *God's* good graces.

THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE. In one of the most beautiful lines ever written about the need and purpose of Confession, this one-liner from Saint Ambrose [339-397] sums it up perfectly: we Christians are blessed to have "both water and tears: the water of Baptism and the tears of Penance." For although we are washed clean of sin in Baptism, we do not stay clean of sin. In a world of so many temptations, from which Jesus was not, nor are we, exempt, we are likely to fall into sin unlike Jesus, who never sinned. However, since Jesus was tempted, He knows the debilitating, ferocious power of the Evil One and our probability of succumbing to the Devil's wiles, so He gave us a means by which we can be restored to Baptismal grace: Confession.

HOW WE SHED THE 'TEARS OF PENANCE.' We begin most Masses with a Penitential Act or the Rite of Sprinkling, both of which purge us of our everyday, venial sins. We are washed clean of these 'lesser' sins by our works of charity, by fasting, through prayer, and by all other self-imposed penances. Our communal admissions of sinfulness, which we often do in the Psalms we sing or recite, and in many Chants and Hymns, which express our remorse and contrition, attain divine forgiveness for our non-mortal sins.

PERSONAL PREPARATION FOR PENANCE. In the end, "we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil." [2 Corinthians 5:10] So, it is crucial that each one of us meticulously examines his or her own conscience, does penance, performs works of charity, makes amends, and prays for mercy ... before it's too late! That's why in the Church's liturgy, she often refers to our sinful nature, has us acknowledge our sinfulness, and beseechs the Lord's mercy ... not to put us down, but to raise us up!

LENTEN CONFESSIONS. In the grace-filled time of Lent, we are strongly directed to offer the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance, as we will do on Friday, March 31, from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm with several Priests available for Confession; see the Examination of Conscience in today's bulletin.

If you have been sexually abused as a minor by a member of the clergy or anyone representing the Catholic Church, or if you know of someone who was, you can report that abuse through the diocesan

The Diocese of Trenton reports any allegations of sexual abuse to the appropriate law enforcement agencies. Anyone with an allegation is also encouraged to provide that information to local law enforcement authorities.

Before coming to Confession on **FRIDAY, MARCH 31** between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the Sacrament, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the nine official *Acts of Contrition* PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #10 - from the revised Order of Penance

Lord Jesus, Son of God,
have mercy on me, a sinner.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON THE BEATITUDES: MATTHEW 5:3-12

*Blessed are the poor in spirit,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.*

Do I truly recognize my complete dependence on God?
Have I been proud, arrogant or self-righteous, selfish, greedy, possessive or self-seeking? Do I crave status, recognition, power, material possessions or wealth?

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Do I endure difficulties and afflictions with faith and patience? Do I have compassion for the poor, the hungry, the addicted, the sick, the lonely, the sinful?

Am I truly sorry for my own sins and faults?

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Am I gentle with others, or am I harsh in my behavior? Do I seek to dominate others at home, school, work, church and elsewhere?

Do I lose my temper, nurse hatred in my heart or the desire for revenge?

Am I impatient, resentful, bitter, unforgiving, insulting or abusive?
Do I try to love my enemies?

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Do I thirst for holiness? Do I truly yearn for God's will to be done, in my life and in all things? Do I try to cultivate a righteous and holy life through prayer, fasting, almsgiving, worship, the reading of Holy Scripture, frequent Confession and Communion? Am I lukewarm in my faith, lazy, negligent or apathetical?

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Do I turn away from those who need my help? Turn my back on the poor, hungry, rejected, lonely and needy?

Do I strive to understand and forgive others? Am I indifferent or judgmental?

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

Do I love purity and honesty? Am I dishonest in my speech or actions? Are the motives or intentions of my actions evil or selfish? Have I given way to lust, impure thoughts, words or deeds - prejudice, hypocrisy, pretense or self-indulgent, sinful passions?

*Blessed are the peacemakers,
for they will be called children of God.*

Am I at peace with God? Do I have God's peace in my heart? Have I been angry, aggressive or impatient? Do I foster peace at home, work, church and community?

Have I been irritable or bold? Have I caused division and discord? Is my criticism harmful and disruptive, or does it build up others in charity?

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Have I complained when persecuted for God's sake? Prayed for my enemies? Failed to defend others for fear of humiliation or persecution? Have I had the courage to stand up for the truth despite criticism, ridicule or persecution? Am I afraid to witness my faith in Jesus and His Church?

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me, for your reward will be great in heaven.

Is the joy of Christ in my heart, even in trying moments? Do I give thanks to God at all times, in every circumstance, or do I complain often? Have I been pessimistic, negative, despondent, or despairing? Have I truly delighted in the promise of God's treasures in heaven?
