From the Pastor

BLESSING PRAYERS FOR HOLY OILS. In Part 2 of our 5-part series on the revised Rite the Blessing the Sacred Oils, we reflect on the

first of the three oil that are blessed: **Oil of the Sick.** You may find any of these or other past bulletin articles on our parish website. Here is the prayer offered by a Bishop to bless the **Oil**; if necessary, any Priest can bless the olive oil he needs to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Blessing Prayer for the Oil of the Sick

O God, Father of all consolation,
who willed to heal the infirmities
of the weak through your Son,
listen favorably to the prayer of faith:
send forth from the heavens, we pray,
your Holy Spirit, the Paraclete,
upon this oil in all its richness,
which you have graciously brought forth
from the verdant tree to restore the body,
so that by your holy blessing +
everyone anointed with this oil as a safeguard for
body, soul, and spirit may be freed from
all pain, all infirmity, and all sickness.

May your holy oil, O Lord,
be blessed by you for our sake
in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TWO OPTIONS FOR WHEN OI IS BLESSED. In the Church's ritual books, 'order' usually shows 'preference' unless otherwise noted; the first option for blessing the **Oil** is not near the end, but during, the Eucharistic Prayer. The second option is with the other two Oils near the end of holy Mass, after the Prayer after Communion. Why during the Eucharistic Prayer? One reason is: the Eucharistic Prayer, commonly called the Consecration, is our greatest prayer, which sends us a 'tsunami of grace' by making our Lord truly present. So, during this flood of grace, a new wave of divine comfort and mercy is released. It is our hope that all who will be anointed with this Oil experience this deluge of heavenly help.

WE DO AS JESUS DID. The Gospels records numerous times when **Jesus** stopped what He was doing to care for the sick. While teaching or preaching, He was 'interrupted' by a man with a withered hand [Matthew 12:9-13, Mark 3:1-6, and Luke

6:6-11] the paralytic lowered through the roof; [Mark 2:1-12] the possessed man in the synagogue [Luke 4:33-37] to name just 3 of His 40 miraculous healings. So, the **Bishop** stops what he is doing to bless the **Oil** that will be used by Priests who are also asked to stop what they are doing to anoint the sick.

A RICH OIL FROM A VERDANT TREE. In the Church's Sacraments, the use of **OLIVE OIL** is preferred; only in the case of true necessity can another type of oil be used. For olive oil also has a rich history in the Bible. As the flood waters subsided, Noah released a dove, but it was unable to perch anywhere, so it returned to the ark. When he released it again, it returned with an olive branch in its beak; this became a symbol of peace. In faith, we trust that those enduring the trauma of ill-health will be at peace as the Lord cures them - or assists them in bearing the cross that may be bringing them to eternal life.

One of the most prized trees in the Holy Land is the **olive tree**, whose fruit has been used since pre-biblical times in a variety of ways. Besides being a food staple and source of **oil** for cooking, it was used to light lamps and produce soap; **olive branch laurel wreaths**, a symbol of victory, were awarded to athletes; olive oil was used to anoint priests, prophets, kings, and sacred items; **olives** were on the list of preferred and cherished offerings during religious services. No wonder the Church uses olive oil in her **Sacraments!**

SACRAMENTAL ANOINTING OF THE SICK. As the faithful face serious or chronic illness, treatments or procedures, advanced age or physical, spiritual, emotional, or psychological challenges, they are encouraged to request this **Sacrament of Healing**. While the healing is not always physical, it can be so spiritually. Ideally, after the usual Introductory Rites, Penitential Act or Confession [if necessary and possible] and Scripture reading, the **Priest** lays hands on the sick, anoints them with blessed oil, and prays, "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."







Before coming to *Confession* on **FRIDAY, APRIL 8**, between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the *Sacrament*, start with your state in life [*i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.*] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: *i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc.* After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the nine official *Acts of Contrition* PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #3 - from the Rite of Penance

Father of mercy, like the prodigal son
I return to you and say:
"I have sinned against you
and am no longer worthy to be called your son.

Christ Jesus, Savior of the world, I pray with the repentant thief to whom you promised Paradise:
"Lord, remember me in your kingdom."

Holy Spirit, fountain of love,
I call on you with trust: *"Purify my heart,*
and help me to walk as a child of light."

**EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE
BASED ON SAINT PAUL'S 'LOVE POEM'**

One of Saint Paul's best-known compositions is often proclaimed at weddings; however, it applies to all of us, at all times. How well do we live by the familiar words?

"Love is patient, love is kind.

It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated,
it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests,
it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury,
it does not rejoice over wrongdoing
but rejoices with the truth.

It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails."

1 Corinthians 13:4-8a

Love is patient. Have I been patient with others? With God? With myself? With the small, slow steps usually required for almost anything in our imperfect world?

Love is kind. Are my words and deeds meant to build up or break down? Heal or hurt? Soothe or sting?

Love is not jealous. Do I put others down to lift up myself? Undermine or sabotage them? Allow my heart and mind to be poisoned by resentment or envy, bitterness or rage, negativity or self-pity?

Love is not pompous. Do I 'put on airs' or exaggerate my own importance? Brag or boast? Overinflate or exalt my own needs or desires?

Love is not inflated. Do I do things for others for my own benefit, to be thanked and praised - or do I truly help others simply because they need my help?

Love is not rude. Have I been compassionate, gentle, and respectful in all I say or do? Are the words, please and thank you a regular part of my vocabulary?

Love does not seek its own interests. Is my main goal to help myself or others? To make myself happy or others? To please God or to please others or myself?

Love is not quick-tempered. Do I easily 'fly off the handle' or do I try to temper and properly express my justified anger? Do I 'count to ten' or take a step back so my justified anger does not control what I say or do?

Love does not brood over injury. Do I 'nurse my wounds' to help cure them or make them worse? Do I more quickly count 'the wrongs'- or count 'the rights'?

Love does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. Do I find joy in other's failures or mistakes, sorrows or woes, misfortunes or challenges? Do I love to spread the bad news or brag about my misdeeds?

Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Do I allow my doubts that God's love can - and will - conquer everything - even death itself - keep me from being a channel of God's love - to others - and even to myself?

Love never fails. Am I "convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord?"
