Reading I: 2 Chronicles 36: 14-16, 19-23

The story of a collapsed Judah follows divine judgment. The chief evil of ignoring the prophets brings about a 70 year long exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The unexpected decree of Cyrus king of Persia brings about a happy outcome.

Reading II: Ephesians 2: 4-10

God's great love for the world is most evident when He sends His only Son into the world as His greatest gift.

The Gospel: John 3: 14-21

The Father's love for the world is manifest in His Son Jesus. Jesus in turn tells His pupil Nicodemus that when "the Son of Man is lifted up" (on the cross) it will be a similar but much more powerful healing than that of the serpent lifted up in the desert.

From the Pastor
4th Sunday of Lent - B
Laetare 'Rejoice' Sunday
March 14, 2021

YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH.
Here's part two of our 4-part series on Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter: 'Patris corde' [With a Father's Heart], which you are encouraged to read. It is found on the website: www.vatican.va; select Apostolic Letters - and choose 'Patris corde.' We

begin by praying the oration chosen by Pope Francis, which he himself prays each day. Then we will reflect on two more of the seven sections of this most moving document.

Year of Saint Joseph - Official Prayer

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself
a father and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen.

A TENDER, LOVING FATHER. One of the most common reactions by most people [in my experience, myself included!] to the proverbial 'monkey wrenches' that so often mar or even destroy our hopes and dreams is to ask: "How can God do this to me?" and "Why does God allow such things to happen?" Somehow, we mere mortals believe that we know what is best for us, how to go about achieving it, when and where it should all fall into place. Even we who profess our faith in a God who, in His fatherly, providential care for all His children, does "not [wish] that any should perish but that all should come to repentance." [2 Peter 3:9] - even we wonder if our Heavenly Father truly knows best!

Yet Saint Peter and the other Apostles often tried to dissuade Jesus from going to Jerusalem. They scoffed when He told them: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." [Matthew 16:24-25]. We know that in saying this, Jesus was relaying His Heavenly Father's will - but could He also have been moved by what He had seen in His foster-father, Saint Joseph?

'Did not Saint Joseph "hope against hope" [Romans 4:18] that what was revealed to him in dreams by an angel was true? Did not Saint Joseph allow the Lord to decide what he did, where he went, and so on? Did he not accept the secondary roles of foster-father to the Son of God, and of the chaste spouse of the Virgin Mary? Who better to turn to when our plans - and what seems to be God's plan - are worlds apart - than Saint Joseph?

AN OBEDIENT FATHER. In Matthew's Gospel, an angel comes to Saint Joseph in a dream three times. First, an angel encourages him to take Mary, who has already conceived a child by the Holy Spirit, into his home as his wife. Then an angel warns him to whisk 'the Child and His Mother' to Egypt, to escape Herod's evil plans to kill Jesus. After Herod's death, in a third angelic dream, Joseph is given the signal to return to Israel, where he shared his carpentry skills with his 'son.' And, by fulfilling Jewish Law, he passed on the traditions of their faith [circumcision, pilgrimages to the Temple, etc.] - as well as respect for just civil laws, like the required trip to Bethlehem for the census - on to Jesus.

OBEDIENCE. This word is certainly not very popular these days; perhaps it never was in vogue. But we know 'the apple did not fall very far from the tree' - for in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus prayed a prayer Saint Joseph so often embodied: "Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will." [Mark 14:36] Again, when our will conflicts with God's will, we should ask Saint Joseph to help us obediently accept God's will as he so obediently accepted it.

Although it is unlikely that we will receive angelic messages in dreams, God usually reveals His will for us through the events of everyday life. We are also guided, as was Saint Joseph, by God's word in sacred Scripture. And as he had the rites and traditions of his Jewish Faith, we have the rituals and teachings of our Catholic Faith. May we so model obedience to God's will that - like Jesus, who became "obedient to death, even death on a cross" [Philippians 2:8] - those over whom we have a parental influence may also obey God's will. Saint Joseph, pray for us!

CONFESSION

FRIDAY-MARCH 19 4:00 – 6:00 pm

(This is the last scheduled confession until after Easter, NO Confessions will be heard during Holy Week, from Palm

Sunday [03/28] until AFTER Easter.

ARRIVAL. All penitents are asked to enter via the main doors of the Church; they will be given a number and directed to the Church where Eucharistic Adoration will take place. They are invited to spend time before the Blessed Sacrament both before and after having their confession heard. Priests will hear confession in the classrooms of the Parish Hall. Penitents will be called by number to the Parish Hall by ministers who have offered to help. This avoids long standing and keeps safe distancing. It is also requested that you pray the Act of Contrition [a card will be provided] privately, before or after you go to Confession. And, at all times, all MUST wear a mask and avoid all physical contact.

THE RITE ITSELF. In each classroom, two chairs, at a safe distance, will be set up for the Sacrament; please avoid all physical contact. Privacy is guaranteed by having only one Priest and penitent per room. The church will be open for those who wish to pray before the Blessed Sacrament, say their penance, make a visit, or you may simply leave after receiving Absolution. Begin with "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned..." or simply say, "Father, you lead..." You may remain anonymous, but should tell your state in life [married, single, ordained, a parent, etc.], and approximate date of your last confession. List all grave, serious mortal sins by number and kind: abortion, adultery, etc.; a general admission [I'm impatient, rude, insensitive, etc.] covers all lesser sins.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST RECONCILIATION

We are in the process of planning the Sacrament of First Reconciliation for our students preparing to celebrate the sacrament this year. This email included the formula for a child's private confession, along with the traditional prayers required, chapters and activities. Additional instructions and information about the celebration of the sacrament will be forth-coming. We ask our parents/guardians to work with their child, at home, to help them memorize the formula for a child's confession, their Act of Contrition and to please review the prayers learned in grade one. Our families will be notified when the sacrament will take place and how we will proceed to keep everyone safe during these difficult times. SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST

Students receiving the Sacrament of First Eucharist this year have been contacted to please stop by the parish office to pick up their preparation packets. Our hours for pickup are Monday-Thursday, 9:00AM-Noon and 1:00-4:00PM. Students from 2020 who chose to delay the Sacrament of First Eucharist do not need to pick up this packet, your child was fully prepared last year for reception of the sacrament. Before coming to Confession on *FRIDAY, MARCH 19, between 4 PM & 6PM*, examine your conscience [see below]. While waiting to confess, keep a safe distance from others. Begin with your state in life [*i.e., married, single, parent, etc.*] and estimated time since your last Confession; list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: *i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc.* Listen to the Priest's advice and Prayer of Absolution; pray the Act of Contrition ***AFTER*** you leave.

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.
In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good,
I have sinned against you
whom I should love above all things.

I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.

Our Savior Jesus Christ, suffered and died for us.
In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.

The Lord said: "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart."

Do I put my relationship with God first, above all things: my career and leisure time, my home and possessions - even above other people?

Do I allow the Lord to be my loving Father by entrusting all my joys and sorrows to God?

Do I leave God out of my life by not making time for regular private prayer or for worshipping with other Christians?

Do I rely on God's grace to avoid temptation and on the Church to restore me to grace?

Do I make important choices or decisions without first listening - as God speaks to me through prayer and Scripture, Church teaching and sacred liturgy?

Do I heed God's call to be a temple of His Spirit, an instrument of His grace, and channel of His loving forgiveness?

Do I truly become what I receive: the Body and Blood of Christ?

Do I act on my faith by allowing God and Church teaching to influence what I say and do, how I vote, form my values and my conscience?

Do I offer back to the Lord and His Church what God has entrusted to me: my time, talents, and the treasures I earn through the blessings and abilities God freely gives to me?

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Do I hurt or neglect my family, or withhold love from those closest to me?

Am I too guarded or afraid to reach out,

too withdrawn in my own pursuits to hear and respond to the needs of others?

Do I argue too easily, deliberately hurt others, fail to ask for forgiveness, express my apologies, or take responsibility for my mistakes?

Do I withhold forgiveness or hold grudges, or demand from others what I refuse to them?

Do I hurt or neglect my friends or neighbors, my fellow parishioners or co-workers, my fellow citizens in this country?

Do I respect people of every race or language, nation or way of life?

Do I strive to be a peacemaker, or do I add more fuel to the fire?

Do I speak up for the rights of others, or do I remain mute and inactive in the face of injustice, falsehood, prejudice or apathy.

Do I defend and uphold the dignity of every person, born or unborn, young or old, polite or demanding, friend or enemy, healthy or sick, self-sufficient or needy?

Do I lead others to - or away from - God and His Church - by my words or example?

Am I known for my honesty and integrity, faithfulness to my word and Christian values?

Jesus says: "Be perfect as your Father is perfect."

Do I take care of my body and my soul by exercising and eating properly, controlling my desires and feelings?

Do I engage in regular times of prayer, read the Bible and meditate on it?

Do I patiently accept sorrows and disappointments, and 'offer them up' so as to "fill up what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ?"

Do I maintain sensible boundaries and limitations so as not to damage my health or the wellbeing of others?

Do I keep my promises and vows, especially those made before God and His Church in Baptism and Confirmation, Matrimony and Holy Orders?

Do I practice the spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, of devotions and sacred customs?

Do I dishonor my own body - or the body of anyone else - in any way?

Do I protect myself from what could bring me harm in the marketplace and recreational places, in the media and on the internet?

Do I strive to live by Christian ideals, relying on the presence of God within me, or am I enslaved to any ungodly forces?
