

From the Pastor
5th Sunday of Lent - B
March 17, 2024

GENERAL ABSOLUTION. One of the questions we are often asked is, “Why is General Absolution NOT permitted?” In what we call **General Absolution**, all sins are forgiven by the Priest without needing to hear - by number and kind - every mortal sin committed by a Penitent. However, **General Absolution IS** permitted ...IF the main criteria for its use are fulfilled. What are the main criteria for a **valid General Absolution**?

Before answering that question, let’s answer another often-asked question: “Why must we confess all our major sins to a Priest?” When Jesus empowered His Apostles and their successors, and through them, His Priests, to share His merciful forgiveness, He said, “Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.” [John 20:23] I am sure Jesus did NOT want this done by the whims or moods of the Priest-Confessor; so, it must be based on the sins confessed! And how would he know these sins unless they are confessed through him?

In the four Gospel accounts of the Sacrament of Penance: the **Woman at the Well** [John 4:1-42] - **Zacchaeus** [Luke 19:1-10] - the **Adulteress Almost Stoned to Death** [John 8:3-11] - and Peter’s triple profession of love after his three denials [John 21:15-17] - all of them had a one-on-one encounter with Jesus. And so must we - through our Confessor - which is why serious, grave, mortal sins **MUST** be Confessed to a Priest at least once a year. Now back to **General Absolution** and its requirements for validity.

DANGER OF IMMINENT DEATH. Any Priest who has faculties to hear Confessions or Absolve sins may give **General Absolution** to a person who is actively dying, assuming they would have gone to Confession if they were able to do so. He may also add the **Apostolic Pardon**, which is an indulgence that pardons or erases any temporal punishment due to sin. Think of it this way: **Confession forgives us for breaking the window; an Indulgence exempts us from having to pay for its replacement.** One of the reasons Deacons **cannot** celebrate the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is that they cannot hear Confessions

should that need arise before the **Anointing**.

THE DIOCESAN BISHOP MUST APPROVE IT.

For **General Absolution** to be valid, it must be approved [except when death is imminent] by the Bishop. He alone decides if Penitents would have to wait an unreasonable amount of time before they could go to Confession. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops set a reasonable common time to have to wait to confess: **one month**. Other parts of the world, where the Priest-shortage is more severe, have a different timeframe.

So, a ‘packed house’ for a Penance Service, or a large pilgrimage or a festival, where only a few Priests are present to hear the Confessions of many people ... does **NOT** constitute a significant delay for celebrating the Sacrament of Penance. Being asked to wait for a month to confess our sins so we can receive Holy Communion is not that long. [And as my mother would say, “You should have thought about that before you did whatever is keeping you from receiving Holy Communion!”] However, Canon [Church] Law does make this exception for receiving while conscience of committing mortal sin: “... unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess ... the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible.” [CIC#916]

THE BOTTOM LINE. What many seem to not know - or choose to ignore - is that - when we receive **General Absolution**, we must **STILL CONFESS every mortal sin, by number and kind**, as soon as possible - but within a year. During that time, we may not validly receive **General Absolution** again. So, should the dying person not die, or he or she survive the catastrophe, disaster or situation that prompted the giving of **General Absolution**, and he or she is able to confess, he or she must do so ASAP! There’s no shortcuts or game-playing with God!

Before coming to Confession on **FRIDAY, MARCH 22** between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the *Sacrament*, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the revised Acts of Contrition PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #8 - from the Rite of Penance

Lord Jesus Christ, Lamb of God,
who take away the sin of the world,
through the grace of the Holy Spirit
be pleased to reconcile me with your Father;
cleanse me in your Blood from every fault
and make me fully alive to the praise of your glory

**EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE USING
SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI'S PEACE PRAYER**

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.

Have I allowed the Spirit of Jesus into my life, or have I been busy about many things, seeking peace elsewhere? Have I sought to find my peace and escape my responsibilities through such things as alcohol, drugs, self-centered pleasures, etc.? Have I allowed God to love and forgive me?

Where there is hatred, let me sow love.

Am I willing to take that extra step needed to bring bitterness and resentment to an end? Do I have the courage to love my family, my friends, my neighbors,

even myself - the way Jesus loves - sacrificially? Would someone see in my relationships the words: "See how these Christians love one another?"

Where there is injury, pardon.

Have I built bridges between people? Or do I fan the flames of discord, enjoying the little sarcasms and petty feuds that bedevil the world? Is there someone in my life who cannot feel healed and made whole until I say, "I forgive you?"

Where there is doubt, faith.

Have I been the sort of person in whom someone can believe? Do I make possible the kind of experiences of personal faith that set the stage for faith in God? Am I willing to put my own faith on the line, even at the risk of being mocked or put down? Am I willing to share my faith, through prayer and involvement?

Where there is despair, hope.

Do I project the image of a hopeful person? Am I optimistic? Or am I a grouch, able to see only the deficiencies of human nature and not the grace of God at work within us? Am I willing and able to listen to the person who needs me to hear? Do I care and take time to listen with the ear, but also with the heart?

Where there is darkness, light.

Do I seek to live and act in the light or would I rather hide under cover of darkness? Am I an apostle of God's Light? Or have I created shadows and gloom in the lives of people, treating them as objects rather than as persons, hurting their feelings, and damaging their good name by gossip or slander?

Where there is sadness, joy.

Am I a joyful person, or a prophet of gloom? Am I able to laugh, even at myself, and see the humor that exists at the heart of our pilgrim experience? Are people enriched and gladdened or diminished and saddened whenever they meet me?

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love.

Have I discovered what it means to be, like Jesus, a person for others? Do I believe that the more I give in love, the more I have to give?

For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

In what way am I a prisoner of self today, held captive by fear or guilt or doubt or sin? What is there in me that must die, if I am to live and breathe free, and know that I am loved by God? Will I be reborn this Lent through the confession of my sins?
