From the Pastor

BLESSING PRAYERS FOR HOLY OILS. In Part 3 of our 5-part series on the revised Rite for Blessing the Sacred Oils, we reflect on the second of the three oils that are blessed: OS: Holy Oil which is also called OC: Oil of Catechumens. You may find any of these or other past bulletin articles on our parish website. Unlike the Oil of the Sick, which Priests can bless in an emergency, even using an oil other than olive oil, only Bishops can bless the Oil of Catechumens, using the prayer below, as the anointing with OS or OC is NOT essential for a valid Baptism to take place.

Blessing Prayer for the Oil of Catechumens

O God, strength and protection of your people,
who have made the oil you created
a sign of strength,
graciously bless + this oil,
and grant courage to the catechumens
who will be anointed with it, so that,
receiving divine wisdom and power,
they may understand more deeply
the Gospel of your Christ,
they may undertake with a generous heart
the labors of the Christian life,
and, made worthy of adoption
as your sons and daughters,
they may rejoice to be born anew
and to live in your Church.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A HOLY 'OILY' 'BOOSTER SHOT.' In biblical times, solemn anointings were not reserved for just royalty or religious leaders; even 'ordinary' people were fortified with an anointing. In a way, anointings are like something that has become so familiar with us today: a 'booster shot' or dose of something that can help ward off whatever can harm you. Before competing in sports, ancient athletes were anointed with oil; before going into battle, soldiers were also anointed with oil. So, before beginning their life as a baptized Christian, those preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation, who were called Catechumens, were anointed, often more than once, with the Oil of Catechumens.

In our own time, after a year - or many years - of preparation, followed by more intense training

during Lent, the celebration of the Rites of Acceptance and Welcome and Election by the Bishop, and the three Scrutinies, adults preparing for Christian Initiation celebrate their Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist at the Easter Vigil Mass. During this preparation time, they may be anointed once or more often with the Oil of Catechumens. We usually anoint our Catechumens during Morning Prayer on Holy Saturday morning as they begin the day on which they will become God's adopted son or daughter through the Sacraments of Initiation.

Before infants or young children are Baptized, they may be anointed with the Oil of Catechumens on their chest. This recalls the breastplate worn to shield a person from all that could harm them; it also strengthens their heart to accept - and to live by - the demands of the Christian life. I am always amazed - and amused - when, as I draw near to anoint a baby's chest, they instinctively open their mouth, assuming I am about to feed them! Would that we adults be as readily excited to be fed by the spiritual Food God offers us in the Eucharist and the other Sacraments! [FYI: for the sake of propriety, adults are anointed with the Oil of Catechumens on their hands and/or forehead.]

This Blessing Prayer also contains a beautiful synopsis of 'Catholic Sacramentality.' Based on the Incarnation, by which God became a human person in Jesus and raised all created things to be potential sources of grace - and on biblical accounts of how God used created things to accomplish His will [the waters of the Red Sea, the manna or bread from heaven, the fire and smoke on Mount Sinai, etc.], the Catholic Church uses created things to transmit God's grace. As this Blessing Prayer says: God creates things for our use and uses some of them to relay blessings or help to us. It blows my mind that some still question why we Catholics use water, oil, bread, wine, ashes, palms, incense, etc. They need just read the Bible to see how God Himself uses - and directed us to use - what is visible to better know and understand what is invisible.

Please keep our Parish's Catechumen, Robin, in your prayers.



Before coming to *Confession* on **FRIDAY, APRIL 8**, between **5:30 - 7:00 PM**, between **4:00 - 5:30 PM**, examine your conscience; each week a different '*Examen*' will be provided. To celebrate the *Sacrament*, start with your state in life [*i.e.*, *I'm married, single, parent, etc.*] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: *i.e.*, impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the nine official *Acts of Contrition* PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #8 - from the Rite of Penance

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON THE BEATITUDES: MATTHEW 5:3-12

Lord Jesus, Son of God,
have mercy on me, a sinner,

*Blessed are the poor in spirit,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.*

Do I truly recognize my complete dependence on God?
Have I been proud, arrogant or self-righteous, selfish, greedy, possessive or self-seeking? Do I crave status, recognition, power, material possessions or wealth?

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Do I endure difficulties and afflictions with faith and patience?
Do I have compassion for the poor, the hungry, the addicted, the sick, the lonely, the sinful?

Am I truly sorry for my own sins and faults?

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

Am I gentle with others, or am I harsh in my behavior? Do I seek to dominate others at home, school, work, church and elsewhere? Did I lose my temper, nurse hatred in my heart or the desire for revenge?

Am I impatient, resentful, bitter, unforgiving, insulting or abusive? Do I try to love my enemies?

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Do I thirst for holiness? Do I truly yearn for God's will to be done, in my life and in all things? Do I try to cultivate a righteous and holy life through prayer, fasting, almsgiving, worship, the reading of Holy Scripture, frequent Confession

and Communion? Am I lukewarm in my faith, lazy, negligent or apathetical?

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Do I turn away from those who need my help? Turn my back on the poor, hungry, rejected, lonely and needy?
Do I strive to understand and forgive others? Am I indifferent or judgmental?

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

Do I love purity and honesty? Am I dishonest in my speech or actions? Are the motives or intentions of my actions evil or selfish? Have I given way to lust, impure thoughts, words or deeds - prejudice, hypocrisy, pretense or self-indulgent, sinful passions?

*Blessed are the peacemakers,
for they will be called children of God.*

Am I at peace with God? Do I have God's peace in my heart? Have I been angry, aggressive or impatient? Do I foster peace at home, work, church and community?
Have I been irritable or bold? Have I caused division and discord? Is my criticism harmful and disruptive, or does it build up others in charity?

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Have I complained when persecuted for God's sake?
Prayed for my enemies? Failed to defend others for fear of humiliation or persecution? Have I had the courage to stand up for the truth despite criticism, ridicule or persecution? Am I afraid to witness my faith in Jesus and His Church?

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me, for your reward will be great in heaven.

Is the joy of Christ in my heart, even in trying moments?
Do I give thanks to God at all times, in every circumstance, or do I complain often? Have I been pessimistic, negative, despondent, or despairing? Have I truly delighted in the promise of God's treasures in heaven?
