From the Pastor
5th Sunday of Lent - B
March 21, 2021

YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH. In part three of our four-part series on the Holy Father's Apostolic Letter, 'Patris corde' [With a Father's Heart], which you are encourage to read, we reflect on two more of the seven sections of this Letter. [Go to www.vatican.va - select Apostolic Letters - and choose 'Patris corde.'] But first, pray the oration chosen by Pope Francis, which he himself prays each day.

Year of Saint Joseph - Official Prayer

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself
a father and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen.

AN ACCEPTING FATHER. As the Gospel states, Saint Joseph's first reaction to the news of his betrothed's shocking pregnancy was the all-too-common human response to shut down and walk away. The Gospel captures it in these words: "Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly." [Matthew 1:19]. But in the words from that angel in his dream - words found all throughout the Bible - "Do not be afraid," [Matthew 1:20] - Saint Joseph found the faith to accept God's will. These same words also enabled him to accept his role as: Protector of the Virgin and her Child; Provider of the Holy Family; and, with Mary, the First Teacher of Jesus.

What parent or grandparent, aunt or uncle, relative, loved one, or friend has not been challenged by the consternation caused by someone's unplanned pregnancy, sexual identity issue, addiction or bad choice? As our initial encounter with Saint Joseph reminds us: our first, and often over-emotionally charged reaction, may not be the best solution; nor may it be in accord with God's will. With Saint Joseph to help us, we can also always accept God's will!

'A CREATIVELY COURAGEOUS FATHER.' It goes without saying that life does not usually go according to our plans; in fact, it seems that life almost NEVER, if EVER, unfolds as we hope or pray! Life has innumerable curve balls, or we get hit by a wild ball! Once again, we find in Saint Joseph a model in dealing with - and rising above - this life's countless unexpected twists and turns.

Seemingly, without complaint or bitterness, Saint Joseph went off to Bethlehem, with his near-term pregnant wife, aware that things would be zooty, as everyone headed to their ancestral home for a government-mandated census. And once he got there, Saint Joseph courageously sought and fixed up a cave or stable as the site where his wife would give birth - far from what he must have expected God to provide for the Nativity of the Savior! Perhaps the best analogy for us would be: having to travel to or from 'the Shore' - on a sunny, steamy summer Sunday afternoon - for something you wish you didn't have to do; you KNOW it will be a miserable ride! May we be as willing to roll with the punches!

Through all this, and in all his challenges, Saint Joseph had a secret weapon that, no doubt, gave him the courage needed to face every dilemma and difficulty. As I said at the end of my homily on the 4th Sunday of Advent last year, we would be wise to always take along on our life's journey the two people with whom Saint Joseph always stayed close. The Gospel tells us Saint Joseph was told to "take the Child and His Mother" [Matthew 2:13; 2:20] which he courageously did at least two times. Who could be afraid of anything with Jesus and His Mother at their side?

No wonder Saint Joseph is invoked as Protector of the Unfortunate, the Unborn, the Needy, Exiles, the Afflicted, Workers, Virgins, the Poor, the Dying - and, as we celebrate in the 'Year of Saint Joseph' - the 150th anniversary of his being named the Patron of the Universal Church! Who are the people in special need for whom God is calling you to be their 'Saint Joseph?' How can you bring them to Saint Joseph - and to 'the Child and His Mother' - so that they are no longer afraid? Saint Joseph, pray for us!


A BIBLE STUDY ON THE ANNUNCIATION


