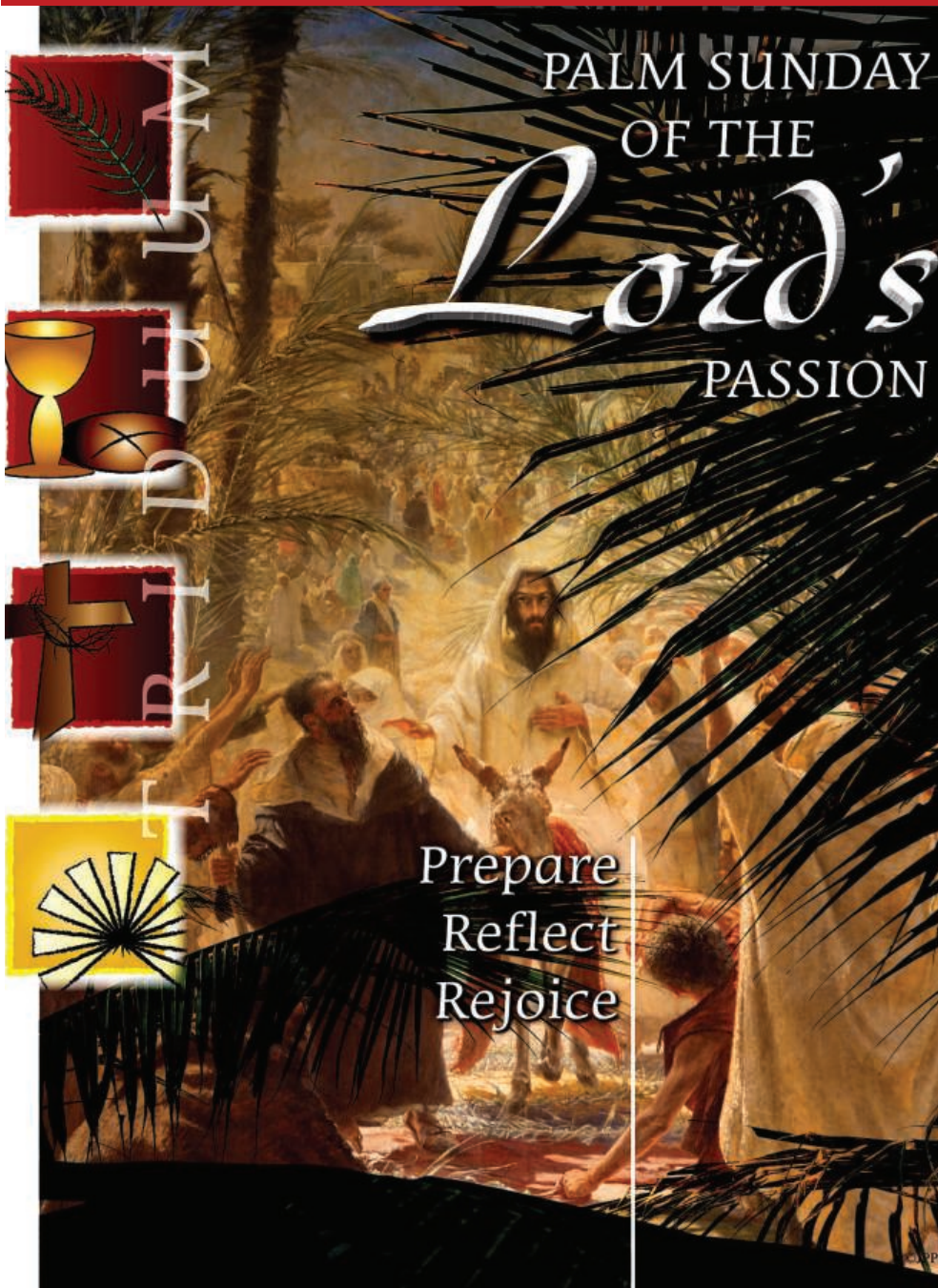

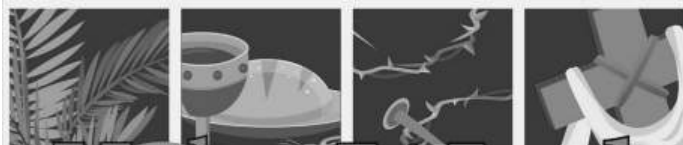

From the Pastor
Palm Sunday
of the Passion
of the Lord - B
March 24, 2024

A CLASSIC HYMN. Just as it would not be Easter without singing 'Jesus Christ Is Ris'n Today' or Christmas without singing 'O Come, All Ye Faithful' and 'Silent Night,'

I cannot imagine starting a Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion Mass without singing the venerable, ancient tune, 'All Glory, Laud and Honor.'

I say 'ancient' since it was composed in 820 - as compared to relatively 'new' hymns like 'O Come, All Ye Faithful' - first published in 1751 - and 'Silent Night' - first performed in 1818!

Originally, it had numerous verses; over time, it was 'scaled' down to 5. One verse became the refrain ... and another verse got ... 'canned.'

r: All glory, laud, and honor
To you, Redeemer King!
To whom the lips of children
Made sweet hosannas ring.

1. You are the King of Israel
And David's royal Son,
Now in the Lord's Name coming,
Our King and Blessed One.
2. The company of angels
Are praising you on high;
And mortals, joined with all things
Created make reply.
3. The people of the Hebrews
With palms before you went:
Our praise and prayers and anthems
Before you we present.
4. To you before your passion
They sang their hymns of praise:
To you, now high exalted,
Our melody we raise.
5. Their praises you accepted,
Accept the prayers we bring,
Great source of love and goodness,
Our Savior and our King.

Here's the verse which got 'canned':

6. Be thou, O Lord, the rider,
and we thy little ass;
that to God's holy city
together we may pass.

FULFILLMENT OF PROPHECY. Artists often depict our Blessed Mother, going to Bethlehem and in exile to Egypt, on a donkey, but the Infancy Narratives never mention a donkey. So, while we do not know if the unborn and newborn Jesus rode on a donkey, we do know He did when He entered Jerusalem as we heard today. For it was prophesied: "Exult greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout for joy, O daughter Jerusalem! Behold: your king is coming to you, a just savior is he, Humble, and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." [Zechariah 9:9] The donkey is one of the only two animals in the Bible to speak; the other is the serpent who tricked Adam and Eve into sinning. A talking donkey told the wicked but accurate Prophet Balaam NOT to go where God did not want him to go. [Read the whole story in Numbers 22:1-41!]

And in the manger, along with the ox, the animal offered in sacrifice, was an ass, as Christmas carols like 'Away in a Manger' sing. Its place in the Crèche is based on the scolding another Prophet gave to all who go about their own business, without making time for God and His business: "An ox knows its owner, and an ass, its master's manger; But Israel does not know, my people has not understood." [Isaiah 1:3] I hope and pray that these harsh words do not apply to us during this Holy Week, when God's business should be our business as much as possible! Now, back to 'All Glory, Laud and Honor.'

An article by Marilyn Biery in 'GIA Quarterly,' a liturgical periodical, gave a history of this great hymn. Originally written in Latin in 820 by Theodulph of Orléans, a Bishop and advisor to Charlemagne, the Holy Roman Emperor. After his death, his successor, Louis the Pious, had Theodulph removed as Bishop and imprisoned for allegedly supporting a rival for the throne. While in prison, he wrote the hymn; legend says that Louis was so moved by the hymn, he released Theodulph from prison and ordered the hymn to be sung every Palm Sunday, as we do!

May this paraphrased verse inspire you to get yourself to church as much as possible this week: "Be thou, O Lord, the rider, and me thy little ass; that to God's holy city together we may pass."

FAST AND ABSTINENCE GUIDELINES

Those 14 and older are to **ABSTAIN** from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Lenten Fridays. Those between 18 and 59 should **FAST** by eating only one main meal and two smaller ones on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those unable to abstain or fast for a valid reason [i.e., *St. Patrick's Day party or wedding*] may abstain on another day or perform a different penance; Canon law only permits PASTORS to dispense from fasting or abstaining. Ignoring penitential days, without good cause, is a serious sin of omission. Our *Bishops* ask us to abstain from meat on Fridays all year long for *Pro-Life causes and world peace.*

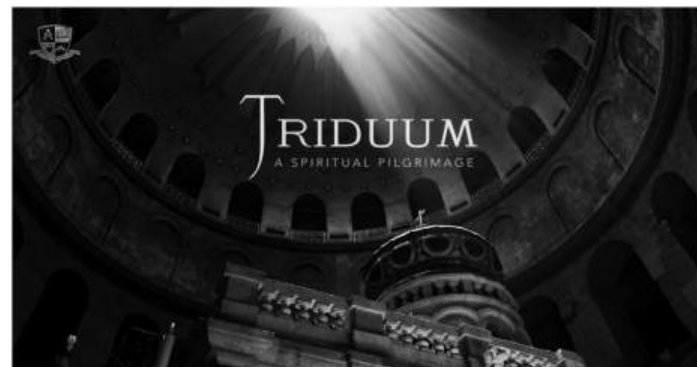
