

From the Pastor

REVISED ORDER OF PENANCE.

In Part 5 of our miniseries on the 'Order of Penance' we reflect on the revised Prayers of the Penitent - aka - Acts of Contrition. But do not fret or worry, for the rubric before these prayers specifically states that

"The Priest then invites the Penitent to express his/her contrition, which the Penitent may do in these or similar words." [We underscored the word similar.] So, whatever version you learned and memorized will still work; and be sure that God does NOT withhold forgiveness or mercy from those who forget or make mistakes as they pray their Act of Contrition!

Here is the revised translation of the prayer we have provided at Penance Services and in our Confessional:

The revised Act of Contrition

O my God, I am sorry
and repent with all my heart
for all the wrong I have done
and for the good I have failed to do,
because by sinning I have offended you,
who are all good
and worthy to be loved above all things.
I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace,
to do penance, to sin no more,
and to avoid the occasions of sin.
Through the merits of the Passion
of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy.

Notice the slight but significant difference in the revised translation and the former one below:

The previous/former Act of Contrition

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.
In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good,
I have sinned against you
whom I should love above all things.
I firmly intend, with your help,
to do penance, to sin no more,
and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.
Our Savior, Jesus Christ,
suffered and died for us.
In his name, my God, have mercy.

"... I am sorry and repent." The two words, 'and repent' has been restored to the first line, for simply being sorry is not enough! We must also repent or redirect ourselves, learn new ways to deal with temptation, break away from the past.

"... because by sinning I have offended you ..." not simply "I have sinned." Our actions, or lack thereof, have consequences, the worst of which is: sin offends the God of Love. We have not simply disobeyed a rule, broke a law, or failed to live up to an ideal: we have broken Someone's heart. We have disappointed Someone who knows we can do better! So, no matter what our sin is ... it always offends God!

"... with the help of your grace" replaces and expands on the briefer phrase, "with your help" - for everything God offers is a grace or unearned gift, granted to us for the purposes intended by the Gift-giver: God. We who ask to BE forgiven MUST, in turn, FORGIVE OTHERS! Nor should we ever presume on God's mercy; that, too, is a sin!

"... Through the merits ... have mercy" versus "Our Savior ... have mercy." As with many of the revised translations of our orations, we speak more directly, reverently, humbly TO God rather than ABOUT God. The revised translations are also less of a directive, or as was the case in some orations, a command, telling God what to do or not do! So, after respectfully recalling how, through His Passion and Death by which Jesus won our redemption, we mercifully request that God share these graces with us sinners.

THE SHORTEST ACT OF CONTRITION. The only Act of Contrition that was not altered in the recent revision may be the best one to memorize:

My personal favorite Act of Contrition

Lord Jesus, Son of God,
have mercy on me, a sinner.

Based on a tax collector's humble request: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner." [Luke 18:13b] this mantra, or variations of it, called 'The Jesus Prayer,' is prayed by Roman Catholics, Orthodox and Protestant Christians. May our celebration of this year's Holy Week bring us all closer to the Sacred Heart of our Savior Jesus Christ. Confessions are THIS Friday, March 31, from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm!

Before coming to Confession THIS FRIDAY, MARCH 31 between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, use the following to examine your conscience. To celebrate the Sacrament, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the Prayer of Absolution; please pray the Act of Contrition PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #8 - from the Rite of Penance

Lord Jesus Christ, Lamb of God,
who take away the sin of the world,
through the grace of the Holy Spirit
be pleased to reconcile me with your Father;
cleanse me in your Blood from every fault
and make me fully alive to the praise of your glory.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE USING SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI'S PEACE PRAYER

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.

Have I allowed the Spirit of Jesus into my life, or have I been busy about many things, seeking peace elsewhere? Have I sought to find my peace and escape my responsibilities through such things as alcohol, drugs, self-centered pleasures, etc.? Have I allowed God to love and forgive me?

Where there is hatred, let me sow love.

Am I willing to take that extra step needed to bring bitterness and resentment to an end? Do I have the courage to love my family, my friends, my neighbors, even myself - the way Jesus loves - sacrificially? Would someone see in my relationships the words: "See how these Christians love one another?"

Where there is injury, pardon.

Have I built bridges between people? Or do I fan the flames of discord, enjoying the little sarcasms and petty feuds that bedevil the world? Is there someone in my life who cannot feel healed and made whole until I say, "I forgive you?"

Where there is doubt, faith.

Have I been the sort of person in whom someone can believe? Do I make possible the kind of experiences of personal faith that set the stage for faith in God? Am I willing to put my own faith on the line, even at the risk of being mocked or put down? Am I willing to share my faith, through prayer and involvement?

Where there is despair, hope.

Do I project the image of a hopeful person? Am I optimistic? Or am I a grouch, able to see only the deficiencies of human nature and not the grace of God at work within us? Am I willing and able to listen to the person who needs me to hear? Do I care and take time to listen with the ear, but also with the heart?

Where there is darkness, light.

Do I seek to live and act in the light or would I rather hide under cover of darkness? Am I an apostle of God's Light? Or have I created shadows and gloom in the lives of people, treating them as objects rather than as persons, hurting their feelings, and damaging their good name by gossip or slander?

Where there is sadness, joy.

Am I a joyful person, or a prophet of gloom? Am I able to laugh, even at myself, and see the humor that exists at the heart of our pilgrim experience? Are people enriched and gladdened or diminished and saddened whenever they meet me?

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love.

Have I discovered what it means to be, like Jesus, a person for others? Do I believe that the more I give in love, the more I have to give?

For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

In what way am I a prisoner of self today, held captive by fear or guilt or doubt or sin? What is there in me that must die, if I am to live and breathe free, and know that I am loved by God? Will I be reborn this Lent through the confession of my sins?
