

REVISED BLESSING OF SACRED OILS. In Part 4 of our 5-part series on the revised Rite for Blessing the Sacred

Oils, we reflect on the shorter option for the Consecration of the SC: Sacred Chrism. This will give us more space to explain the two parts of the Consecration of the Sacred Chrism, which is not merely 'blessed' but 'consecrated': the highest form of a blessing!

Unlike the Blessings of the Oil of the Sick and Oil of Catechumens, the Bishop first reads an introduction after a balsam or fragrant perfume is added to the Oil. He may do this privately, before the Rite, which I have never seen, or during the Rite, which seems to be the norm. The added balsam often gives the Sacred Chrism a pleasant aroma and distinctive hue. Here's the explanatory preface, which is the same for both options to consecrate Sacred Chrism.

Introduction to the Consecration of Sacred Chrism

Let us pray, dear brothers and sisters,
to God the almighty Father,
that he bless and sanctify this oil,
so that all who are outwardly anointed with it
may be inwardly transformed
and come to share in eternal salvation.

COME HOLY SPIRIT! After the intro, the *Bishop* silently performs a most basic but biblically profound action: he **BREATHES** into the open vessel of *Oil* to be consecrated. This recalls among other things how we were first **CREATED**: "the *LORD* God formed the man out of the dust of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being." [Genesis 2:7]. It also recalls how we, and through us, the whole world, were **RECREATED** on that first *Easter*. "[Jesus] said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit...' [John 20:21-22]. For those *anointed* with *Sacred Chrism* are reborn in *Baptism*, fortified in *Confirmation*, empowered in *Holy Orders*, and the *churches* and *altars* consecrated with it become unique places where *God* meets and feeds His People while we are still on earth! Then the *Bishop* alone starts the prayer:

Consecration of the Sacred Chrism

O God, author of the Sacraments and bestower of life, we give thanks for your ineffable goodness, for in the ancient covenant you foreshadowed the mystery of sanctifying oil and in the fullness of time you willed that it might shine forth uniquely in your beloved Son. And when your Son, our Lord, had saved the human race through the Paschal Mystery, he filled your Church with the Holy Spirit, and wonderfully endowed her with heavenly gifts, so that through her the work of salvation in the world might be brought to completion. From that time onward, through the sacred mystery of Chrism you have so bestowed the riches of your grace upon all humanity, that your sons and daughters born again in the cleansing waters of Baptism, are strengthened by the anointing of the Spirit and, conformed to your Christ, they share in his prophetic, priestly, and kingly office.

At this point, the *Bishop* pauses so all *Ordained Priests* can extend their right hand toward the Oil to join, albeit silently, in its consecration, just as we join in the consecration of the *Eucharist*; then he continues:

Consecration of the Sacred Chrism - continued

Therefore we beseech you, O Lord,
that by the power of your grace this mingling
of fragrance and oil may become for us
a sacrament of your + blessing.
Pour out in abundance the gifts of the
Holy Spirit on our brothers and sisters
anointed with this oil;
adorn with the splendor of holiness
the places and things signed by sacred oils;
but above all, by the mystery of this oil,
bring to completion the growth of your Church,
until she reaches that measure of fullness
in which you, resplendent with eternal light,
will be all in all with Christ in the Holy Spirit,
for ever and ever. Amen.

Before coming to Confession on FRIDAY, APRIL 8, between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the Sacrament, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the Prayer of Absolution; please pray one of the nine official Acts of Contrition PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #7 - from the Rite of Penance

Lord God, in your goodness have mercy on me: do not look on my sins, but take away all my guilt. Create in me a clean heart and renew within me an upright spirit.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON CATHOLIC DOCTRINES

Each question below expresses a specific Catholic doctrine; as you examine your conscience, remember three things.

1] The following questions get at what a good Catholic should try his or her best to do; a good Catholic cannot be perfect, otherwise only God could be a good Catholic; fidelity to doctrine is a life-long challenge, for which God has provided the Sacrament of Confession. 2] To one extent or another, everyone finds Catholic doctrine challenging; the problem is not the doctrine but our fallen human nature. 3] It is never too late to start becoming faithful to a doctrine.

1. Do I seek the objective truth about all things?
2. Do I recognize and appreciate objective truth, goodness, and beauty outside the Catholic Church as revelations or reflections of the one true God?
3. Do I live to be in union with the one, true God who is three Divine Persons of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and to share in Their perfect love?
4. Do I accept that the one, true God has most fully revealed Himself in Jesus Christ, who is God the Son?
5. Do I accept that Jesus Christ has most fully revealed Himself in His Death and Resurrection?
6. Do I accept that Jesus Christ is best known or

revealed in the Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition of the Catholic Church, which Christ Himself founded?

7. Do I accept that only the Magisterium has the God-given authority to interpret Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition and thus to define the Catholic Faith in doctrines that are always and everywhere true?
8. Do I accept the doctrine and discipline taught by the Magisterium while knowing that I do not have to agree with their social analysis and prudential judgments?
9. Do I respect the office of the Magisterium even when it is held by sinful men?
10. Do I accept Catholic doctrine about salvation: Heaven, Hell, Purgatory, and Judgment?
11. Do I accept that the Catholic Faith alone has the fullness of the means of salvation - the most complete creed, worship, morality, and prayer?
12. Do I try to act according to Catholic moral doctrine, which is based on the New Testament's two Great Commandments to love God and love neighbor, and the Old Testament's Ten Commandments? Do I love God more than anything else? Do I love others by treating them as I would want to be treated? Do I obey all of God's Commandments?
13. Do I worship according to Catholic liturgical teachings, especially by participating in Mass every week on the Lord's Day and on Holy Days of Obligation (or their vigils) and by going to Confession regularly?
14. Do I pray daily and try to discover the many forms of prayer in the Catholic Faith?
15. Am I developing a unique personal relationship with God that never contradicts Catholic doctrine?
16. Do I support the Church, especially a Parish, to the degree my time, talent, and treasure allow?
17. Am I Catholic 24/7? Is my Catholic identity what most defines me - more than race/ethnicity, economic class, gender, sexual orientation, culture, family, personality, physical appearance, job, or anything else?
18. Do I try to convert/invite non-Catholics to the Catholic Church, while respecting the religious freedom of others, by proposing and not imposing what can only be known by Faith?


