From the Pastor
2nd Sunday
of Easter - B
Divine Mercy Sunday
April 7, 2024

This week is the optional memorial of Saint Martin I, Pope & Martyr, who reigned from 649-655; he is widely considered the last Successor of Peter

to be martyred, but he was not murdered outright. An Italian artist, Tancredi Scarpelli's [1866-1937] illustration [above] depicts the Holy Father's arrest by guards of the local Byzantine governor, Theodore Calliopas, on June 17, 653, who was carrying out the orders of the Byzantine Emperor from 641 to 668, Constans II. It was the start of his exile and dreadful death. More on the theological issues that pitted Pope Martin against Constans II, who was assassinated by one of his own guards while bathing - allegedly with a soap dish - later.

Taken as a prisoner to Constantinople, the Byzantine Empire's capital, Pope Martin was mistreated, mocked, and exiled to a remote part of Crimea, where, after more than a year of being exposed to the elements, malnourished, and abandoned even by Church authorities, he died on September 16, 665. Since his refusal to accept or condone heretical teachings precipitated his condemnation and death, he is honored as a 'a martyr' - the last Pope to be so designated. After praying the Collect for his Feast Day, April 13, we'll explain the heresy he firmly opposed.

Saint Martin I, Pope & Martyr

Grant, almighty God, that we may withstand the trials of this world with invincible firmness of purpose, just as you did not allow your Martyr Pope Saint Martin the First to be daunted by threats or broken by suffering.
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

CIVIL CONTROL OF THE CHURCH. Like many other things, when the *Emperor Constantine* 'legalized' the *Church* in 315, it was a blessing, as it ended centuries of persecution and enabled the Church to flourish - and a curse, for *Emperors* and other civic leaders tried to take control of the *Church*, even choosing *Bishops*. It got worse when the *Roman Empire* fell in the 5th Century and *Byzantine Emperors* exerted even stronger

religious and political influence over ecclesial matters. When Pope Martin was elected to the Chair of Peter, he did not wait to be 'approved' by the Byzantine Emperor Constans II; while his consecration as Pope angered the Emperor, their main spat was over a century's old theological issue: some had heretically said that Christ had only ONE will, a DIVINE will, but no HUMAN will - which denies the Incarnation, which teaches that Jesus was BOTH truly God and truly man.

MONOTHELITISM. The name given to this heresy is Monothelism, which is [roughly] Greek for 'mono' = 'one' + 'thelitist' = 'divine person.' It is problematic for it denies the Sacred Scriptures which declare that Jesus is both Son of God and son of Mary, divine and human, God and man. And by professing that Jesus is God with a human body - but only ONE will - a DIVINE will and not a HUMAN will - He becomes a robot, a divinely possessed person. This, in turn, renders His example useless for us mortal beings to even try to imitate - which, in turn, makes any and every Church-inspired discipline or ethical, moral or pastoral mandate also useless.

There are echoes of this heresy in those who say, "I'm a 'spiritual' person but not a churchgoer." A true Christian must strive to follow the example Christ gave us in His everyday 'human' life: partaking in public worship, fulfilling religious rituals, etc. So, obviously, these 'heresies' - which some dismiss as 'head-games' or 'mental exercises' are crucial matters - which Pope Saint Martin I defended and promoted despite the many hardships he endured.

So, Pope Martin called the Lateran Council of 649, which his predecessor, Pope Theodore, had planned to convene, but was unable to do so due to the political powers who opposed him. The 105 Bishops at this five-session Council issued 20 decrees condemning Monothelism. It also condemned Constans II and his two predecessors who had promoted this heresy. So, Constans II punished Bishops and executed lay-people who agreed with the Pope. These steadfast Christians challenge us to 'stand our ground' when secular forces seek to interfere with our Catholic Faith. Pope Saint Martin I, pray for us. Happy Easter.

P.S. As stated in an earlier article, we will be going on pilgrimage to Lourdes and Fatima in November. More details will follow.

Our journey includes a visit to Fatima Portugal, the site of one of the most famous apparitions of the Blessed Mother. In 1917, on the 13th of each month between May and October, three young peasant children - Saints Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco-received an apparition of the Blessed Mother. Today, Fatima is visited by pilgrims from around the world who search for and find the messages of peace left by Mary for the world.
