From the Pastor
4th Sunday
of Easter - B
April 21, 2024

This week is the optional memorial of Saint George, Martyr; who was, according to legend, beheaded on what is now his Feast Day: April 23, in 303 AD. We have no historical facts about his life or deeds but do have verifiable records of his existence. We know he was venerated as a martyr since the time of Pope Gelasius, who reigned from 492 to 496; while Pope Gelasius dismissed many of the legends about Saint George, he acclaimed him a true martyr who died for the Faith. And a Greek epigraph, from at least 368, attests there was, even back then, a church erected in his honor. After praying the Collect for his Feast Day, we'll explain the most famous legend about him, seen above: Saint George Slaying the Dragon.

Saint George, Martyr

Extolling your might, O Lord, we humbly implore you, that, as Saint George imitated the Passion of the Lord, so he may lend us ready help in our weakness. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

LEGENDS, MYTHS & SYMBOLISMS. Knowing what to take literally - or figuratively - in the Bible is challenging. The Church's Magisterium, the teaching authority of the Bishops in union with the Pope, who are guided by theologians and others, does our homework for us. We can rest assured, as Jesus promised, that when the Magisterium declares something 'fact' or 'fiction,' it is infallible. The problem is: once some hear that a biblical story is a myth or story, they dismiss all Scripture as a fairytale! This causes some to reject that Jesus was an historical person, truly rose from the dead, or is truly present in the Eucharist. These non-negotiable articles of our Faith, enshrined in Creeds and formal statements, may not be taken figuratively.

And while the IMAGERY used in Scripture to depict things like evil: i.e.: the talking snake in *Genesis*, who duped *Adam* and *Eve* into sinning, is to be taken figuratively, the underlying message is a **FACT**. Evil **DOES** exist and **MUST BE CONFRONTED**; we **ARE** tempted and are **AT**

WAR with powerful forces we **CAN ONLY CONQUER WITH GOD'S GRACE** or **HELP** - which leads us to the 'legend' of Saint George Slaying the Dragon, which, dare we say, we have all lived out in our own life.

As the tale goes, a dragon or crocodile, who lived in a local lake, kept people from drawing water from it. They 'appeased' the creature by offering a sheep each day, which worked ... until they ran out of sheep. Then they chose, by lot, a child to be the sacrificial offering; but when the king's daughter was the unlucky 'winner,' a Christian soldier named George came to the rescue. After marking himself with the Sign of the Cross for protection, he slew the dragon, saving the princess. The town abandoned paganism and converted to Christianity. How is this 'biblical?'

On the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the First Reading depicts Satan as a dragon: "Then the dragon stood before the woman about to give birth, to devour her child when she gave birth." [Revelation 12:4] While we do not hear this next verse on the Assumption, it depicts the 'tale' of Saint George and our own reality: "Then the dragon became angry with the woman and went off to wage war against the rest of her offspring, those who keep God's commandments and bear witness to Jesus." [12:17]

Satan still tries to destroy those who come, not to that lake, but to the waters of Baptism, and who seek to be rewashed clean of sin, not by the sword, but in the Sacrament of Penance. It is through the graces won by God's Son, who DID suffer and die for us, that we CAN conquer evil and sin and even death. And to inspire and assist us by his example and heavenly intercession, we have help from someone who is honored by Christians, both Catholic and Protestant, and even Muslims: Saint George, Martyr.

In our fight against sin and evil - and any force that seeks to harm us - rely on Saint George. He is the Patron Saint of Soldiers, Boy Scouts, Knights, Fencers and Archers, and is invoked for protection against herpes, skin diseases and rashes, syphilis, venomous snakes, the plague and leprosy. Holy Mother Church approves of our seeking his help! Saint George, pray for us.

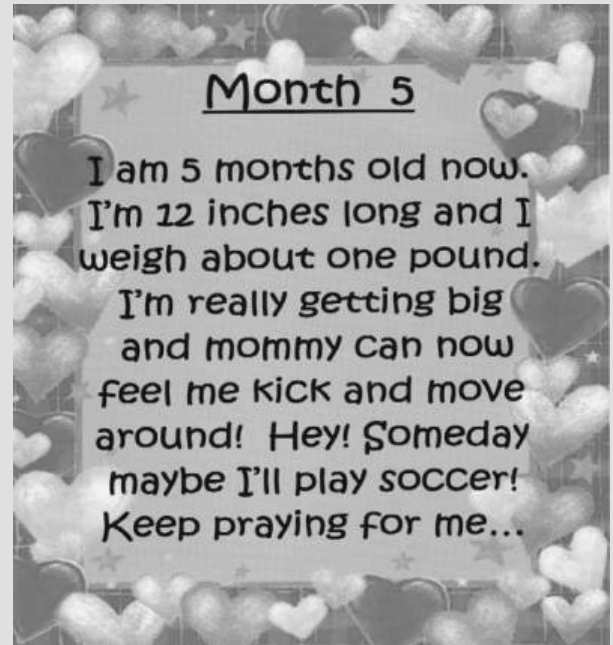


CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL OUR YOUNG PEOPLE!

FRANCE, SPAIN, & PORTUGAL

We invite you to join us on a pilgrimage to honor Our Lady!



Our journey includes a visit to Fatima Portugal, the site of one of the most famous apparitions of the Blessed Mother. In 1917, on the 13th of each month between May and October, three young peasant children - Saints Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco-received an apparition of the Blessed Mother. Today, Fatima is visited by pilgrims from around the world who search for and find the messages of peace left by Mary for the world.



We will also travel to Lourdes, France, one of the most popular destinations for pilgrims in the world. We will pray in the grotto where the Blessed Mother appeared to Bernadette Soubirous, revealed herself as "the Immaculate Conception," and gave us the healing waters of Lourdes.



We'll visit Santiago de Compostela in north-west Spain, which is the final destination of a large network of ancient pilgrim routes stretching across Europe and coming together at the Cathedral of St. James the Apostle, where we will venerate his tomb.

Along the way we'll encounter stories of saints who walked before us. We hope you will consider joining us!
