ONE OF OUR NEWER SAINTS. On May 18, 2020, which would have been Saint John Paul's 100th birthday, Pope Francis added to the General Universal Roman Calendar the Feast Day

of the Polish nun who had inspired the future 'Polish Pontiff,' who had canonized her a Saint on April 30, 2000: **Saint Faustina Kowalska**. Her **personal revelations** led to Divine Mercy devotions and its chaplet: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world." Her **optional** memorial is October 5, the date of her death in 1938. Since the official English translation of her Collect awaits approval by Rome, here's an unofficial prayer for her Feast Day:

'Unofficial' Prayer for Saint Faustina Kowalska, Virgin

O God, who in a wondrous manner revealed the inexhaustible riches of your mercy to Saint Maria Faustina, grant, we beseech you, that by looking with trust upon the pierced side of your Son we may be strengthened to show mercy one to another and, at length, sing forever of your mercy in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

WHO IS SAINT FAUSTINA KOWALSKA? Born on August 25, 1905, she was one of ten children in a poor Polish family; she was baptized 'Helena.' At 16, she quit school to support her family as a housemaid; at 18, she sought admittance to local convents in response to her perceived call to Religious Life. But with little education and no dowry to underwrite her expenses, her parents objected. So, she left home, went to Warsaw, was welcomed by the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, and received the name Sister Mary Faustina. She served as cook, gatekeeper, and maid, and kept a diary of her revelations; she contracted tuberculosis and died at just 33 years of age.

A DIVINE REVELATION. On February 22, 1931, she received a vision of *Jesus* as the *King of Divine Mercy*. He asked that the image He revealed of Himself to her be shared with the world..

.. Two rays emanate from His *Sacred Heart*, one *red*, one *white*, to recall the *Blood and Water* which flowed from His side as He hung upon the Cross. These rays also represent **Baptism** and **Eucharist**. Beneath these two powerful symbols are the words, "Jesus, I trust in you."

At first, few believed her; her superiors forbid her to promote the devotion; theologians doubted her word; the other Sisters could not believe someone so uneducated could be so profound! In June of 1934, an artist completed the now-famous painting of her vision. In 1987, her diary was translated into English with the title, 'Divine Mercy in My Soul.' Once she was declared a Saint, her name - and the **Divine Mercy** devotions - spread quickly throughout the world. To learn more about this devotion, log onto the website: www.thedivinemercy.org

RECEIVING REVELATIONS MAKES SOMEONE A SAINT? Not necessarily. Like Saint Bernadette, who saw **Our Lady of Lourdes**, it was more the way they 'suffered in silence' with tuberculosis. Both also patiently endured rejection and ridicule, and never lost their **TRUST** in the Lord, which made them - and can make us - a Saint!

THE CHURCH ON PERSONAL REVELATIONS. When the Church 'approves' an apparition or vision, she attests it contains nothing **contrary** to the Gospel and **may** be helpful in growing in our Catholic Faith. She also notes that the pious practices and 'requirements' relayed through a vision or apparition [i.e.: penitential practices, liturgical rites, disciplines, etc.] may not always apply to the future or may need to be adapted to conform with the often-changing norms and instructions that govern Church life.

The liturgical reforms of the 1962-1965 **Second Vatican Council** and the **local** shortage of Priests requires modification of **Divine Mercy** rites. It is now **preferred** to have **First Communion** on the 2nd through 7th Sundays of Easter, not to baptize or confirm during Lent, and to promote Lenten Penance Services. This makes scheduling Confession and other **Divine Mercy** rites before or at 3:00 pm on **Divine Mercy Sunday**, as requested by **Saint Faustina**, most challenging, if not impossible. May all the special rites and devotions of our Faith help us to always say, "Jesus, I trust in you."




