

Reflections by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Reading I: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19—Peter's use of several honored titles of God in the Old Testament shows that he is a true Israelite speaking to his own in this sermon, and he urges them to repent and be converted to Christ.

Reading II: I John 2: 1-5a Jesus is our true Advocate should we fall into sin. Paul tells us that "to know God" means keeping His commandments.


SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

From the Pastor
3rd Sunday of Easter - B
April 18, 2021

"ONE SOWS AND ANOTHER REAPS." These words, spoken by Jesus [John 4:37], are a paraphrase of a sentiment expressed in at least 4 Old Testament passages [Cf. Deuteronomy 20:6 & 28:30; Job 31:8 and Micah 6:15] - and they aptly describe the

life of the man we honor this week on his Feast Day: April 23: Saint Adalbert, Bishop and Martyr. Born around 956 into a family of Bohemian [central European] nobility, his parents gave him the baptismal name Wojtech. When he became seriously ill during his childhood, his parents pledged to offer him to God as a Priest should he survive, and their prayers were granted.

His parents sent him to what we would now call a seminary where he studied under Archbishop Adalbert of Magdeburg, a Benedictine missionary who would later be canonized in his own right. He was either given, or took for himself, his mentor's name at his Confirmation; little did he know that he would follow in Archbishop Adalbert's footsteps in more ways than one! More about that after praying the Collect for the Mass offered in his honor.

Collect - Saint Adalbert, Bishop and Martyr

O God, who bestowed the crown of martyrdom on the Bishop Saint Adalbert, as he burned with zeal for souls, grant, we pray, by his prayers, that the obedience of the flock may never fail the shepherds, nor the care of the shepherds be ever lacking to the flock.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

HE TOOK ONE FOR THE TEAM.' After his mentor's death in 981, Adalbert returned to his native Bohemia and was ordained a Priest in 983. A mere five years later, at just 27, he was named the Bishop of Prague. However, his efforts to reform the wayward clergy of his Diocese led to his exile in 991. He returned, at the people's request, only to be exiled again for daring to oppose those who dragged a woman, accused of adultery, from a church where she had sought 'sanctuary' and murdered her.

'FROM THE FRYING PAN INTO THE FIRE.' After bitter clashes with a Bohemian Duke, Saint Adalbert left his post as Bishop and went to Rome to become a monk - but Pope John XV ordered him back to Prague. In 995, after Saint Adalbert's enemies murdered his family, Pope Gregory V released him from his episcopal duties. After founding an abbey in Prague, he was asked by a Polish Duke to try to convert the Prussians in Northern Europe. Suspected of being a Polish spy, he was stabbed to death [he is often depicted with a spear or knife concealed by his crozier or staff] and died of his wounds in 997, on what is now his Feast Day: April 23.

His enemies kept his dead body, demanding its weight in gold; his mortal remains were ransomed by a Polish prince; eventually, his relics were interred in Prague's Cathedral. He was canonized by Pope Sylvester II in 999, and he is one of the Patron Saints of Bohemia, Czech Republic, Poland, and Prussia. He taught, among others, King Stephen I, who is now known as Saint Stephen of Hungary.

A HOLY HELPER FOR GOSPEL PROMOTERS. Unlike those in some places, like Central America, Africa and the Middle East, who are often severely persecuted, exiled or executed for promoting - or even just practicing - their Catholic Faith, we have it easy! However, some, like me, fear that we will be getting more of a taste of their challenges as our culture and society becomes less faith-based and even antireligion. Through Saint Adalbert's example and intercession, may we strive to do all we can to practice and promote our great Catholic Faith.

The adage "Charity begins at home" is not biblical; it is based on Saint Paul's dictate that widows should be supported by their own families first, before they seek help from the Church [cf 1 Timothy 5:4]. And unlike Saint Adalbert, who was called to try to convert or re-convert strangers, Jesus calls most of us to do what He told a de-possessed man: "Return home and recount what God has done for you" [Luke 8:39a]. Will you honor Saint Adalbert by sharing your faith with family and friends? Saint Adalbert, Bishop and Martyr, pray for us.
