

From the Pastor
5th Sunday of
Easter - B
April 28, 2024

What a joy it truly is to welcome our little children to the 'Big Table.' It took me many years to emerge from the 'Cousin's Table' in the basement and join the adults at the 'Grownups' Table' in the

dining room. It was many 'rites of passage' many, if not most of us went through. So, too, with the Church: most of us started with Baptism as infants, and gradually progressed through the other Sacraments to live out our Faith as adult Catholics. How are the ages for the 'Sacramental Steps' by which we become full-fledged Catholics determined? Here's a brief history of the Sacraments of Initiation.

BEFORE THE 13TH CENTURY. From the Church's beginning until the 1400's, it was normative that Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist were all celebrated at the same time. Around 160, an African Church Father, Tertullian, wrote about the Baptism of infants; by the 5th Century, the Baptism of the children born to Christians was the norm. The child was also Confirmed AND received First Eucharist. A drop of Precious Blood was administered by the Priest, who dipped his thumb into the chalice and then placed it into the child's mouth. As these baptized children grew, they would consume the crumbs and fragments leftover from the Hosts that the adults had received. Tabernacles, which began to be used between the 4th and 8th Centuries, were not found in every Catholic Church until the 11th Century ... so leftovers Hosts had to be consumed.

THE 13TH CENTURY & THE 'AGE OF REASON.' The Western Church restricted Holy Communion to those who had reached the 'age of discretion' or 'reason' and had gone to Confession, which is the current policy for Roman Catholics. Eastern Rite Catholics still celebrate the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, during infancy. While our culture considers 7 to be the 'age of reason,' it has varied worldwide over the years up to 14. However, the Universal Church has never determined the actual 'age of reason' and leaves that up to local Conferences of Bishops; the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops - the USCCB - set the age at 7.

RECENT CHURCH HISTORY. In 1866, Pope Pius IX condemned the practice of overly delaying the reception of First Communion; however, he did not set a universal age. In 1910, the Sacred Congregation for the Discipline of the Sacraments determined that the age of discretion should be considered to be around 7, but he did not mandate it as such. Pope Saint Pius X approved and published the decree.

The current Code of Canon Law, promulgated in 1983, does not define the 'age or reason' nor the age at which children can be admitted to the Eucharist. It simply states: "For the administration of the Most Holy Eucharist to children, it is required that they have sufficient knowledge and careful preparation so as to understand the mystery of Christ according to their capacity, and can receive the Body of the Lord with faith and devotion" and be "able to distinguish the Body of Christ from ordinary food and receive Communion reverently." [CC#913 §1, 2] And it places the responsibility to prepare the children on the Parents, and to see that they are properly prepared, on the Pastor.

CONFIRMATION. As the Western [Latin or Roman] Church grew, and that part of the world became more urbanized, Bishops retained the privilege to confirm. So, while Deacons and Priests Baptized and administered Eucharist, which Deacons cannot confect, Bishops 'confirmed' what had been done by a Deacon or Priest. This put the age for Confirmation any time after First Eucharist, which has led to a hot debate between Liturgists and Catechists.

To maintain the ancient order of the Sacraments of Initiation, as Eastern Rite Churches do, Liturgists prefer Confirmation **BEFORE** First Eucharist, which also highlights the Blessed Sacrament as the most important Sacrament. Catechists counter that without the 'prize' of Confirmation after 8 to 12 years of Religious Formation [some Bishops only confirm those near the end of High School!] we would lose them. That might be very true, but it is certainly not the best reason to delay a Sacrament. Who knows what the future will hold, but ... now you know ... a brief history of the Sacraments of Initiation. Our first Communion and Confirmations for younger people are now completed. Adult confirmations will take place on Pentecost. Congratulations to all.

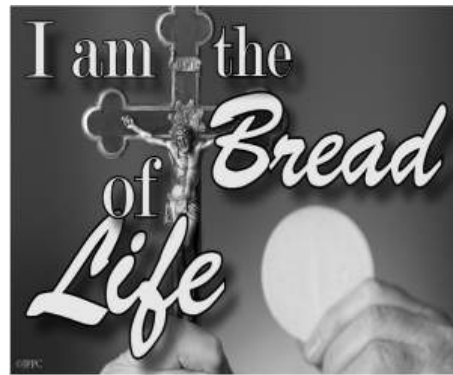
