

From the Pastor
May 1, 2022
3rd Sunday of Easter - C

THE PASCHAL CANDLE. One of the central, if not most important, liturgical symbols of Eastertime is the large Paschal or Easter Candle. No rubric directs us to bless it; but it is lit for the first time from the new fire that is blessed at the start of **The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night Mass**, which is the liturgical highpoint of The Sacred Paschal Triduum or Great Three Days - if not the highpoint of the whole year! However, before it is lit, it is honored with a number of biblically-based, highly symbolic images and actions befitting its significance.

PREPARING THE PASCHAL CANDLE. After the new fire is blessed, the Priest 'cuts' a cross or simply traces the cross predesigned on most modern Paschal Candles. He then does the same with the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet: Alpha [Α] and Omega [Ω] based on our Lord's words, 'I [am] the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end.' [Revelation 21:6]. Then he 'cuts' or traces the numbers of the current Year of Our Lord: [2 0 2 0]. As he does this, he says:

Christ yesterday and today (trace vertical line)
the Beginning and the End (horizontal line)
the Alpha (above the vertical line)
and the Omega (below the vertical line)
All time belongs to him (first numeral)
and all the ages (second numeral)
To him be glory and power (third numeral)
through every age for ever. Amen. (last numeral)

Then he may insert 5 grains of incense into the candle in the form of a cross, each representing one of the Five Wounds of Christ: His 2 hands or wrists, His 2 feet, and His pierced side. Our Paschal Candle [which cost almost \$525.00] comes with 5 metal pins topped with a wax 'nail' which is inserted over the grain of incense. As this takes place, these words are said:

By his holy [+] and glorious wounds,
may [+] Christ the Lord [+] guard us [+]
and protect us. [+] Amen.

LIGHTING THE CANDLE. The Priests lights the Paschal Candle from the new blessed fire and says:

May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

The Paschal Candle is then carried into the church and stops in three places: at the door, in the middle of church, and next to the Ambo or in the middle of the Sanctuary. This is reminiscent of the three places where the Cross is adored during Good Friday's Celebration of the Passion of the Lord . Each time they stop, the Deacon or Priest chants, and the people reply:

The Light of Christ. Thanks be to God.

After the Paschal Candle is reverenced with incense burned on charcoals lit from the new fire, the venerable Easter Proclamation or **Exsultet** is chanted. When a Deacon proclaims it, he acts for and receives a blessing from the Priest like the one he receives before proclaiming the Gospel, so that he "May sing this candle's perfect praises." [In future weeks, we'll reflect on the Paschal Candle's meaning as found in Scripture and the Exsultet.]

PLACEMENT OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE. When the Exsultet is finished, the Paschal Candle goes into its large stand, where it shines its light down on the series of readings that give us a synopsis of the highlights of salvation history: Creation, Abraham's Test, the Red Sea Crossing, the Prophets, etc., and the Lord's Resurrection.

Later, it is plunged into the Baptismal Font during the consecration of the water. After the fifty days of Eastertime, during which it is to be lit for every service, it is extinguished on Pentecost, after which it leaves the Ambo area and is placed near the Baptismal Font or in a reverent place. Until next Easter, it is usually only lit during Baptisms [the newly baptized's baptismal candle is lit from it] and at Funerals [our remains rest beneath it during our Funeral Mass].

HISTORY OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE. As one of the most ancient, enduring Christian customs, the Paschal Candle deserves more of our attention and understanding. May this holy 'Pillar of Fire' guide us through the darkness of night! May the Light of Christ burn brightly in our every word and deed! Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!






