From the Pastor
6th Sunday of Easter - B
May 5, 2024

WE CANNOT SAY "I WAS JUST FOLLOWING ORDERS."
This point was hammered home at the post-WWII Nuremberg Trials, where Nazi officers tried to excuse themselves from their responsibility for

committing wartime crimes. As the three martyrs the Church honors on May 12 did ages ago, sometimes we must also stand up for our Faith - whatever the cost. We have probably seen the statues of two of these sainted martyrs many times ... though we did not know it. Where are their prominent statues? Read on, but first ... the reason why - this year - we do NOT use the orations for Masses honoring the three martyrs whose Feast Day is May 12.

The Sundays of Easter, like those in Advent, Christmas and Lent - and other Solemnities - are 'privileged,' which means the only orations we may use at holy Mass are for that privileged Solemnity. In 2024, the Immaculate Conception of the BVM [12/08] will be 'transferred' from the 2nd Sunday of Advent, 12/08, to Monday, 12/09. On Sundays in Ordinary Time, these Feasts of the Lord: The Presentation [02/02] and Transfiguration [08/06] of the Lord, The Exaltation of the Holy Cross [09/14] and other Solemnities: The Assumption of the BVM [08/15] and All Saints Day [11/01] and the unranked All Souls' Day [11/02], take precedence over the Ordinary Time orations. So, this year, we cannot use the orations for the three Martyr Saints whose optional Feast Day is on May 12: Saint Pancras, who is the topic in next week's bulletin, and Saints Nereus and Achilleus, whose Collect is below.

Saints Nereus and Achilleus, Martyrs

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we, who know the great courage of the glorious Martyrs Nereus and Achilleus in confessing you, may experience their loving intercession for us in your presence. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever Amen.

TWO OF MANY PROTO-MARTYRS. Like many *Saints* from the *Church's* early history, we have little factual knowledge about them ... but lots of references to them down through the ages. Some say *Saints Nereus and Achilleus* were elite Roman soldiers, perhaps even the *Emperor Diocletian's* bodyguards, and were

baptized by *Saint Peter*. They are often depicted in art, as seen above, being made *Christians* by the hands of our *first Pope*. Inscriptions about them, dating back to the 300's, were found during excavations in the 1800's. We have documents confirming that *Pope Saint Gregory the Great* celebrated *holy Mass* at their tomb on **May 12, 592**. In the 700's, their relics were 'transferred' to a shrine built in their honor, where they rest to this day. In 1874, a 4th Century Basilica, built in their honor, with depictions of their decapitation, was also found. Their **10'4" statues** joined the other 138 that look down on *Saint Peter Square* from atop the *Bernini Colonnade* that rings the plaza; *Nereus* is #88; *Achilleus*, #90. These are some reliably impressive facts for two unknown, ordinary men - who were executed in **AD 98** - nearly 2,000 years ago!



ARE WE FOLLOWING IN THEIR FOOTSTEPS? The eyes in their statues cannot see those who gather in the plaza which they look down upon; nor do we know if God allows them to 'see' us from their place in heaven. However, we are assured that they are interceding for us, hoping that we follow their example of courageous, faithful adherence to the Faith. The importance of this cannot be underestimated as we form our conscience, conduct our business, educate our children and others, cast our vote, sift through the vast multitude of options and opinions, values and viewpoints, in a world that is very much like the volatile days of ancient Rome. In 2,000 years from now, may people have the same esteem for what we did to live out our Faith as we have for the Church's Protomartyrs. Saints Nereus and Achilleus, pray for us.




