From the Pastor
May 8, 2022
4th Sunday of Easter - C
Mother's Day

PASCHAL CANDLE. Last week we explained how the Paschal or Easter Candle is enhanced and studded with Christian symbols, lit from a new blessed fire, carried into a tomb-like darkened

church, reverenced with incense, displayed in places of honor, and used at every Baptism and Funeral. Today we reflect on its biblical roots or on what the Easter Proclamation or Exsultet [which will form the basis for next week's article] calls "a pillar of fire [which] banished the darkness of sin." That's one of the main biblical references to this primary liturgical Easter symbol.

PILLAR OF FIRE. At the Easter Vigil Mass, there can be up to SEVEN 'First' Readings; however, the only one which MUST be proclaimed is the Crossing of the Red Sea on the night of the first Passover. On their journey from Egypt to the Promised Land, we are told that "The LORD preceded them, in the daytime by means of a column of cloud to show them the way, and at night by means of a column of fire to give them light ... Neither the column of cloud by day nor the column of fire by night ever left its place in front of the people." [Exodus 13:21-22]

This same Divine Light illuminates our way from 'womb to tomb.' It glows with our promised new life in Christ as it shines over us on the day of our Baptism, and from it our Baptismal Candle is lit. It radiates hope and the promise of eternal life as it flickers over our casket or cremains at our Funeral. And it may be carried in the Opening Procession to start Night Prayer when this last part of the Liturgy of the Hours is prayed communally.

THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD. There are many references to the phrase, 'Light of the World,' in sacred Scripture and in the Church's orations or prayers, rites and rituals. For instance, Jesus said of Himself, "I am the light of the world." [John 8:12] and "While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." [John 9:5] Others, like the aged prophet Simeon, called Jesus "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." [Luke 2:32] Saint Paul, quoting an ancient Baptismal Rite, wrote: "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and

Christ will give you light." [Ephesians 5:14] So, in many ways, the *Paschal/Candle* represents *Christ* as our Light.

However, there are many scriptural references to US, the Christian People, as Light. Jesus bluntly told us: "You are the light of the world." [Matthew 5:14a] and "... your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." [5:16] And of Saint Paul's many references to us needing to be lights in our darkened world, this one truly outshines all the others: "... be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine like lights in the world." [Philippians 2:15] And having that Paschal Candle shining in our faces for the 50 days of Eastertime is a most timely and blatant reminder of what we should be striving to be, not only in Eastertime - but at all times!

LIGHT IN THE PSALMS. So often in the 'Songs of Israel' as the Psalms are called, we sing about God - and ourselves - as being a Light. "For you, LORD, give light to my lamp; my God brightens my darkness." [Psalm 18:29] - "The LORD is my light and my salvation..." [27:1] - "Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him and he will act. And make your righteousness shine like the dawn, your justice like noonday." [37:5-6] - "Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light for my path." [119:105] - "If I say, 'Surely darkness shall hide me, and night shall be my light - Darkness is not dark for you, and night shines as the day. Darkness and light are but one.' [139:11-12]. These are some 'Psalm-phrases' that come to my mind as we reverence the Paschal Candle with incense.

GOD IS LIGHT - AND SO MUST WE BE. Perhaps one of the most profound biblical references to the purpose of the Paschal Candle is this: "God is light, and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say, 'We have fellowship with him,' while we continue to walk in darkness, we lie and do not act in truth. But if we walk in the light as he is in the light, then we have fellowship with one another." [1 John 1:5b-7a] For God truly 'lights our way' - not only by telling us how to live, but by showing us - in Jesus - how to live. As we look up at the Paschal Candle's flickering flame, may we be inspired to reflect that light into every aspect of our own darkness and the darkness that sadly shrouds so much of our world.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers. May God bless all our mothers—living and deceased.


