

From the Pastor

PASCHAL CANDLE. In the third of our four-part series on the Paschal Candle we will reflect on the images of this primary liturgical Easter symbol as found in the Exsultet or Easter Proclamation: the

long poem chanted at the start of the Easter Vigil Mass. The Exsultet is a thankful 'OFFERING' prayer: we offer God a pillar of flame to celebrate the many ways He literally turned 'Original Sin' into salvation, night into day, mourning into joy, death into life. These sentiments are captured by one of its more glorious phrases, sung with candles in our hands lit from the Paschal Candle, as we stand in "the awesome glory of this holy light." Here's what the proclaimer of this beautiful liturgical poem [usually a Deacon or Priest] sings or says about the Paschal Candle:

From the Easter Proclamation or 'Exsultet'
 "Accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants' hands ...
 ... we know the praises of this pillar,
 which glowing fire ignites for God's honor,
 a fire into many flames divided,
 yet never dimmed by sharing of its light,
 for it is fed by melting wax,
 drawn out by mother bees
 to build a torch so precious ...
 ... Therefore, O Lord, we pray you that
 this candle, hallowed to the honor of
 your name, may persevere undimmed,
 to overcome the darkness of this night."

'WE' & "MOTHER BEES." Years ago, all church candles had to be at least 51% beeswax; it is still desirable that all items used in divine worship be authentic, not artificial. For economic reasons, easier maintenance, and safety, most of our candles are oil-filled tubes that do not burn down, eliminating a potential fire hazard. However, a new Paschal Candle is to be purchased each year: one that DOES burn down, to recall how - for us to reflect the Light of Christ into our darkened world - we must do what Jesus did: we must 'die to self' and allow ourselves to be consumed by our service to God and His Church. And, as the Exsultet states, we must work with God's gift of creation to worship and adore the Creator. Just as we pray in the *Offertory*: "... we have received this *bread/wine* we offer, fruit of

the *earth/vine* and work of *human hands*, it will become for us *the bread of life/our spiritual drink*" - so, too, the Paschal Candle! Its raw material is created by bees, which is crafted by human hands, and offered back as a gift to the Creator who enlightens us with His presence through it!

SHARED BUT NOT DIMMED. Who does not worry about running short of, or even out of, what we need? Or who does not fear that we may regret giving away something because we may one day need it for ourselves? Such is often the case with our limited, earthly resources - but it is not so with our spiritual, heavenly resources:-virtues like faith, hope and love. As the Paschal Candle's 'shared but not dimmed' light reminds us: when we entrust our gifts to God, they are never exhausted. On the contrary: all spiritual graces, like the Paschal Candle's flame, only grow brighter and better as they are shared!

So, each one of us must ask ourselves: is there any grace or gift, talent or treasure, asset or ability, that we are keeping to ourselves, and not sharing, which, in turn, keeps the Light of Christ from burning more brightly and intensely in our world? As the phrase "fed by melting wax" reminds us: our faith, hope and love cannot grow if we keep these or any virtues to ourselves. To where and/or to whom might God be calling you to bring the Light of Christ?

"MAY [IT] PERSEVERE UNDIMMED, TO OVERCOME THE DARKNESS OF NIGHT." One Gospel begins with these hope-filled words: "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." [John 1:5] Throughout our 2,000-year history, the Church has endured despite apostasy and apathy, persecution and pandemics, scandals and schisms, to name just a few of the challenges she has faced. She has seen nations and governments rise and fall; despots and rogue rulers have tried to suppress or destroy her. Yet the Light of Christ still shines through us and all who are aflame with the presence of the Risen Lord. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!


