From the Pastor
 May 29, 2022
 Ascension of the Lord - C
 Memorial Day Weekend

WE REMEMBER - LEST WE FORGET. [See last week's bulletin article on the permanent transfer of the Ascension of the Lord to what was the 7th Sunday of Easter.]

On this Memorial Day weekend, we remember in prayer all who attained the apex of love: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." [John 15:13] Below are one of the five 'generic' sets of orations offered at Masses for the Dead. If you know someone who gave their life in service to their God or country, offer these prayers in his or her name. If not, remember all the forgotten dead for whom no one prays.

Collect - For One Deceased Person - 2
 Free your servant N., we pray, O Lord, from every bond of sin, that he/she, who in this world was found worthy to be conformed to Christ, may be raised to the glory of the resurrection and draw the breath of new life among your Saints. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

CONFORMED TO CHRIST. Those who died in battle, often defending the defenseless, certainly conformed their DEATH to that Christ's DEATH by which Jesus saved all sinners. In some cases, they also accepted death so that others might live. However, in many ways, they had also conformed many aspects of their LIVES to Christ's LIFE. Let me point out a few of those ways.

Like Jesus, they gave up the comforts of home and family; like Jesus, they faced ridicule and rejection - sometimes even from the fellow countrymen; like Jesus, their mission and purpose were often misunderstood and unappreciated. The very least we can do for the deceased servicemen and servicewomen who, in so many ways, conformed themselves to Christ, is to pray for their eternal rest and their eternal reward.

Prayer over the Offerings - For One Deceased Person - 2
 Grant our supplication, we pray, O Lord, that this sacrifice may benefit your departed servant N., since through its offering you have loosed the offenses of all the world. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

LOOSED THE OFFENSES. How fitting that those who gave their life to free others from the shackles of slavery, from the bond of subjection, from the abusive power of tyrants, despots, dictators and the like, should be remembered in an oration that promises that they will receive from the Lord the same gift they gave to others. Having laid down their live for others, the Risen Lord bequests to them the graces He won when He laid down His life for us. While the adage: "God cannot be outdone in generosity" is not found in the Bible [it is a quote from one of Pope Francis' talks in which he paraphrased Saint Paul in 2 Corinthians 8-9] - whatever we do for God or for others in His Name we will receive "a hundred times more" [Mark 10:30] back in return.

Prayer after Communion - For One Deceased Person
 -2
 May the sacrifice of your Church, we pray, O Lord, benefit the soul of your servant N., so that he/she, who received the Sacrament of Christ's mercy, may enter his company, together with your Saints. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

AN EXPIATORY SACRIFICE. Even the most valiant, selfless martyr is a sinner, as we all are. We find great hope, however, for imperfect soldiers in the biblical account of the Maccabean Revolt. Two centuries before Christ, the Greeks used horrific, gruesome means to try to totally exterminate the Jewish People as did the Nazis some two millennia later. In one battle, some of 'Israel's Finest' were slain; as they were prepared for burial, amulets of foreign gods were found on them - a serious sin. The surviving troops took up a collection to have expiatory sacrifices offered FOR their fallen comrades, so they could be forgiven their 'false god' sin. [2 Maccabees 12:39-46]

This is but one biblical foundation for our practice of praying for the dead, having holy Mass offered for them, and memorializing items in their name. On this weekend when the graves of the fallen are marked with our flag, may they also be showered with our prayers and sacrifices so they can receive the eternal happiness glory they desired and so courageously sought for others. May they rest in peace, alleluia, alleluia.


