From the Pastor
Most Holy Trinity - B
May 30, 2021
Memorial Day
Weekend
WE PRAY FOR ALL THE DEAD. As we pay homage to our Triune God who is Father, Son

and Spirit, we also pay our respects for all who made the ultimate sacrifice for our Country. The following orations are the 8th set of prayers prescribed 'For Several Deceased Persons or For All the Dead.' As we pray them, let us ask the Father, who raised His Son, Jesus, from death through the power of the Spirit, to one day raise up all who offered their life to save others as did the Lord Jesus.

Collect - For Several Deceased Persons - 8

To you, O Lord, we commend your servants (N. and N.) that, having died to this world, they may live for you, and we beseech you, that whatever sins they committed through the frailty of the flesh during their earthly lives you may in your most tender mercy pardon and wipe away. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

GOD PERFECTS THE IMPERFECT. Jesus told us that we must "Be perfect, just as [our] heavenly Father is perfect." [Matthew 5:48] and that "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." [John 15:13]. But as we all know, and some of us know painfully and personally: no one is perfect - and some who give up their life for others are reluctant, or even accidental, heroes. And what about those who never get the chance to totally and completely give of themselves for others? Is their salvation in question?

Of course not; not only does God provide the means for everyone's salvation - for God "wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth" [1 Timothy 2:4] - we can also rely, as this orations states, on God's 'most tender mercy' to wipe away every sin we commit through human frailty. This is one reason why the Church joins with those in every nation to pray for the eternal salvation of all the faithful departed.

Prayer over the Offerings - For All the Dead - 8

Be merciful, we pray, O Lord, to your servants (N. and N.), for whom we offer you the sacrifice of conciliation, and, since in this life they remained faithful to you, may they have their reward in your presence. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

"SACRIFICE OF CONCILIATION." The unusual term, "sacrifice of conciliation," is used often in the revised Roman Missal. Replacing the word 'conciliation' with 'reunion' - 'pacification' - 'appeasement' or 'reconciliation' helps grasp its meaning. For by prayer, especially the Sacrifice of the Mass, we apply all the graces Christ won for us by His Passion, Death and Resurrection to those in need of His divine gifts. Since God is eternal or not limited by time or space, we can offer the Mass for the living or the dead. That's why it is highly recommended, though not required as it once was, that we be buried in a Catholic cemetery where the holy Mass is offered.

Prayer after Communion - For All the Dead - 8

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that through the power of this Sacrament your departed servants be made partakers of eternal happiness in the gathering of the just. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE GATHERING OF THE JUST. One striking difference in the revised translation of the Mass is in the **Gloria**, the hymn sung or recited on Feasts, Solemnities and Sundays outside of Advent and Lent. We once said, "Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth." but now say: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will." Notice the subtle but significant difference? In the 'old' version, these words, first sung by the Christmas Angels, seem to limit God's gift of peace to "**HIS** people." In the 'new' version, God's peace is lavishly offered, without limit, to all people of good will, which includes those who may not even believe in God!

In her prayers for the dead, the Church recalls God's plan to save **ALL** people and reward **EVERYONE'S** faithfulness. As the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church proclaimed: "Those also can attain to salvation who through no fault of their own do not know the Gospel of Christ or His Church, yet sincerely seek God and moved by grace strive by their deeds to do His will as it is known to them through the dictates of conscience." [Lumen Gentium - Light of the Nations] A most blessed Memorial Day; may all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.


