

**WE ARE SAVED BY THE
HAND OF THE LORD.**

The Roman Missal provides three sets of orations for use at holy Mass during Ordinary Time entitled, 'For Any Need.' While we often 'impose' a 'theme' or an 'issue' in these reflections, these orations lend themselves to be 'fitted' into any and every situation. Not only do we join all our prayers at holy Mass and make them part of the offering when the Priest says: "Pray ... that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable ..." - we also join them for whatever we need through these three orations, which may be used at holy Masses offered 'For Any Need.'

Collect - For Any Need - B

Almighty and merciful God,
look with compassion on our affliction,
and so lighten your children's burden and confirm
their faith, that they may always trust without hesi-
tation in your fatherly providence.
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

GOD'S FATHERLY PROVIDENCE. One of the more complex philosophical conundrums is: if the world is governed by Divine Providence, why bother praying for things to change? If all things have been pre-determined, how can we hope to alter God's will? In the extreme Protestant view, all things have been pre-ordained by God, even those who will be saved and those who will be condemned. But the Catholic view, with which most Protestants concur, has a nuanced, essential condition. While God does 'provide' all things - hence the term 'providence' - we have free will, and can choose to accept or reject, partially or completely - all that God 'provides' for us.

That is why 'FAITH' is an essential component in facing life's seemingly endless challenges. With faith, we can see beyond the present moment; with faith, we can deepen our hope and avoid despair; with faith, we can trust that, in the end, and with God, we can and will conquer all things.

Conversely, without faith, we are prone to give up, become bitter, and turn negative. What are you doing to grow in our great Catholic Faith?

Receive, O Lord, the offerings
we confidently bring before you, and turn,
we pray, the bitterness of the sorrow we bear
into a sweet and fragrant sacrifice before you.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

JESUS TURNS OUR SORROWS INTO JOYS. During His chapters-long 'Farewell Address,' Jesus assured us: "... you will weep and mourn, while the world rejoices; you will grieve, but your grief will become joy." [John 16:20]. As much as we hate to admit it, we learn far more from our failures than our successes, in times of sorrow and distress than in times of joy and tranquility. Was Saint Peter's most profound experience of Jesus' loving concern for him when he saw Jesus' hand reaching into the water to pull him out as he sank into the sea? Was he most convinced of Christ's compassion and forgiveness when Jesus provided him three opportunities to re-profess his love after his three denials? Do we too quickly close off the possibility of learning new things about ourselves, about one another, and about God when things go wrong? Or do we trust our Lord can, indeed, write straight, even with the most crooked of lines - and bring new life, even out of death?

We humbly entreat you, Lord, that, nourished
and fortified by this divine banquet, we may have
strength to face future trials
with fortitude and to lend more generous help
to our brothers and sisters in time of trouble.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FACE THE FUTURE WITH FORTITUDE. In this fourth of the *Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit*, **FORTITUDE**, which is also called **COURAGE** gives us the strength to 'follow through.' For while we often KNOW the right thing to do, and DESIRE or WANT to do the right thing, we often cave in under pressure. But as a proverb accredited by some to *Saint Bernard of Clairvaux* [1090-1153] reminds us: we must fulfill our intentions. So, with the grace of the Eucharist, may we have the fortitude needed to put every good plan into action and bring it to completion we are freely fed with Food from Heaven: Christ's Body and Blood.

A Great Priest, A Great Pastor

Every year springtime means confirmations, first holy Communions, weddings and graduations. Spring is also the time when, to meet the needs of the Diocese, priests are reassigned and the retirement of priests are announced.

In our Diocese, these announcements were made on May 1st. This year five priests will be retiring June 30th. To all of these men we all owe a great debt of thanks for their years of exemplary priestly ministry. There is one in particular that I would like to mention since he has made an impact on my priesthood and the lives of so many other priests as well as the countless number of people he has ministered to in 48 years of priesthood.

Monsignor Michael Walsh was my first pastor when I was first ordained in 2003. I was blessed to be assigned to him.

Merriam Webster defines a priest as “one authorized to perform the sacred rites of a religion especially as a mediatory agent between humans and God; specifically: an Anglican, Eastern Orthodox, or Roman Catholic clergyman ranking below a bishop and above a deacon.”

As carefully worded as this definition is, it only begins to hint at the full calling and identity of a priest. A priest is a “man for others.” The priest has an overwhelming responsibility to be the one who acts as the person of Christ.

Monsignor Walsh certainly is a good shepherd who reflects the kindness of Christ to all. The following are the characteristics I witnessed and admire about him.

- He is—a man of prayer. It was always humbling to see Monsignor pray the Rosary and to take an hour in the Adoration Chapel in the wee hours of the night.
- He is—a teacher. He has consistently dedicated himself to teaching the Catholic faith as it has been handed down to us by the Apostles and their successors for the past 2,000 years. Over the years, he has been a mentor to many new priests and deacons. He has taught us that the people are the parish; not the pastor or the clergy. The people will be in the parish long after the priest is gone and we are only there to serve. His homilies were always relevant, succinct and inspirational. He preached homilies that touched a troubled soul or gave a particular insight to someone seeking the truth. As an aside, my brother worked near Monsignor’s parish in Pennington and would often attend the afternoon Mass there on holy days of obligation. He always praised Monsignor’s homilies and the fact that he gave a great message that was also succinct and mindful of those who were on their lunch hour.
- He is a witness to the Gospel in his words and his example. There has never been any question about Monsignor’s commitment to the social teachings of the Church and on the sanctity of human life. He would often deliver food to the soup kitchens in New York City and urban centers in New Jersey. He would organize and participate in bike rides to raise money for various charities. He truly lives what we read in Matt. 20:28: “The Son of Man who came not to be served... but to serve and to give his life for the ransom of many.”
- He is humble. Unassuming by his quiet nature, he never sought public attention or praise for his service. He is one who quietly serves the Lord and the people he serves. Although he has been honored with the title of “Monsignor,” he never uses it and only refers to himself as “Father Mike.”
- He is a competent administrator. He has refurbished churches and built churches where God’s people can gather to worship the Lord and be strengthened in their faith.
- Finally, he loves God, God’s people and the Priesthood. He has become an indelible part of each of our personal histories as he has shared our pain, our losses, and our moments of happiness; and greeted us before and after Masses even if he was not the celebrant of that Mass. But most importantly, he has brought Christ to the people in Word and Sacrament.

The bulletin editors frequently remind me to shorten my writings. There is not enough room here to highlight the many grace-filled moments in the lives of the people Monsignor Walsh has touched throughout the years. All those who know him, have our stories of his goodness, his holiness, his gentleness—his PRIESTHOOD!

While it is true that priests often retire from active administration of parishes, they do not retire from a priestly life of service and ministry. Monsignor may now enjoy a life that is free from the burdens of administration. But will he retire? NEVER! He will now begin a new chapter that is solely focused upon serving the ministerial and sacramental needs of God’s people.

Monsignor, I am grateful; we are all grateful for your witness. Our lives are richer for having known you. We thank you for having said yes to the call from God.

My priesthood has been influenced greatly by you. God has blessed the Church with your priestly ministry. God willing, may we experience many more of these moments of grace in the years to come.


