

From the Pastor
12th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
June 23, 2024

PRAY FOR THE CHURCH AS SHE NAVIGATES THE STORMY SEAS. In today's Gospel, the Barque [sailing ship] of Saint Peter seems to be sinking, due to stormy seas ... just like some believe today's Church is about to sink.

However, as one of my favorite adages affirms: "The Church has always buried all of her undertakers!" While this is primarily due to the grace of God who, through Jesus, promised that our first Pope and those onboard with him: "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." [Matthew 16:18]

However, this does not mean we can just kick back and enjoy the ride! The Master "whom even wind and sea obey" [Mark 4:41] impels us to stay calm, stay onboard, and stay the course. He expects us to fulfill whatever roles we have on His Ship, the Church. And He needs us to pray for a safe, successful journey, which I ask you to do by using the set 'C' [below] of orations, 'For Holy Church: For the Church' which completes our reflections of the 5 sets of orations for Masses offered for the Church as your 'prayer starter.'

Collect - For Holy Church - For the Church - C

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that your Church may always remain that holy people, formed as one by the unity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, which manifests to the world the Sacrament of your holiness and unity and leads it to the perfection of your charity. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

WE MUST WORK TOGETHER. On the night of the *Last Supper*, Jesus prayed so fervently that we, His *Body*, the *Church*, would be as united to our *God* and to each other as each *Person* of the *Blessed Trinity* is united to *Each Other*. "May [they] all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us ... I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one." [John 17:21-23] Overcoming the scandal of *Christian*

DIS-unity is beyond our individual capabilities, but we can - and must - make sure we are as united in prayer and action, in hopes and dreams - and in the core, basic **Truths** of our **Faith** - as we can be. And we must never stop learning about our Church's doctrines and programs, worship and purpose, and our goals.

Prayer over the Offerings - For the Church - C
Celebrating the memorial of your Son's boundless love, we humbly beseech you, O Lord, that through the ministry of your Church the fruits of his saving work may advance the salvation of all the world. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

WE ARE THE FRUITS OF THE CHURCH. It is so easy to criticize and condemn all that is 'wrong' with the Church, for we are imperfect people living in an imperfect world, bound to get it wrong, or at least, not totally right. Just as Jesus did not fire or replace His Apostles no matter how often they got it wrong, He will not replace us. Rather, He graciously forgives and calls us to forgive one another - which is impossible to do without first receiving His love. With every Eucharist we receive, may Christ's, merciful, loving self-giving empower us to be just as merciful, loving and forgiving.

Prayer after Communion - For the Church - C
O God, who by this wonderful Sacrament give courage and comfort to the Church, grant that through these holy gifts your people may hold fast to Christ, so that, by the tasks they carry out in this present age, they may in freedom build up your eternal Kingdom. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

COURAGE AND COMFORT. It is tough to swim against the tide and oppose worldly viewpoints that contradict Christ's teachings. So, we **MUST** band together to encourage and support one another as we strive to promote **Gospel** ideals. While Christians have always seemed to be the underdogs, we have the greatest of all gifts - the **Gift of Jesus Himself in the Eucharist**, which can fill us with courage and comfort. So, pray always and keep on sailing!

Registration for the 2024-25 Program Year

Students currently enrolled in our program should have received their re-registration form via the United States Postal Service. We ask that you return your registration form immediately, **especially if your child will be attending Grades 1,3, and 4-6 as these grades require a choice of day**. Forms may be returned via the mail or dropped off at the parish office, please see times below. Please note that there is a black box outside the front doors to the parish office if you need to drop off information during off hours.

Students enrolling in our program for the first time may register in person at the parish office Monday-Thursdays, 9:00AM-Noon and 1:15-4:00PM.

You may drop off your family registration form to the parish office. Forms for religious education registration are available only at the parish office. We ask that you please provide your child's Baptismal certificate if your child was not baptized in our parish. If your child is transferring into our program, we ask that a transfer be requested from the parish where your child previously attended.




