From the Pastor
14th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
July 7, 2024

THE BROTHERS & SISTERS OF JESUS.

Catholics are often asked by Protestants - and even other Catholics - things like: "How could Mary be 'ever-Virgin' if the Bible says Jesus had brothers and sisters?" as we heard in today's Gospel. Or "Why do we call Priests 'Father' when Jesus said, "call no one on earth your father..."? [Matthew 23:9] We begin our 4-part summer series by explaining the various reasons why we can be sure that our Blessed Mother had no other children - why it is OK for you to call me 'father' [but not some other names!] - and why we do not have to mutilate ourselves when any body parts cause us to sin!

When Jesus said, "If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away ... if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away ..." [Matthew 5:29-30], He used hyperboles - sayings that are not meant to be taken literally, just as when we say, "I was so hungry I could eat a horse!" Jesus simply used a figurative image to stress how we must make every sane sacrifice necessary to save our immortal soul. Not even a radical fundamentalist takes these words literally, for I have never seen - or heard of - anyone who plucked out their wandering eye, tore out their lying tongue, chopped off their 'sticky fingers,' or castrate themselves to avoid, or because of, their sins.

Sometimes Jesus also used 'turns of phrases' and common Semitic expressions that were not intended to be taken literally. Although some say [in jest] that when He said, as the Protestant King James Bible says, "Suffer the little children to come onto me" ... Jesus was onto something! The Catholic Revised New American Bible translation gently says, "Let the children come to me." [Mark 10:13; Matthew 19:14; Luke 18:16] So, we must be careful NOT to impose OUR definition of words or phrases on ancient biblical texts.

When He heard that Herod was seeking to kill Him, Jesus replied, "Go and tell that fox ..." [Luke 13:32] ... which does NOT mean Jesus thought Herod had four legs, two pointy ears and a bushy tail! Nor did He give us permission to actually

HATE our family when He said, "If any one comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." [Luke 14:26] It was a Semitic way, and, admittedly, very colorful way, of saying that no one can be more important in our life than God; all others must be in second place. I HOPE I am making my first point, which is: we cannot take every word that Jesus said literally! That being said ...

In 3 weeks, we will begin to hear, by coincidence or Divine Providence, a 5-weeklong sequential proclamation of John's Gospel, Chapter 6: the Bread of Life Discourse. [In Cycle 'B,' we read from Mark's Gospel, the shortest Gospel, so we use this monthlong Eucharistic exposé to fill in the gap.] In it, Jesus insisted that He be taken literally when He said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." [John 6:53] When those who could not accept this doctrine of our Lord's Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament balked, He did not water it down; He let them go: "As a result of this, many [of] his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." [6:66]

Ironically, and much to my consternation, it mystifies me how non-Catholics - and even some Catholics - believe that our Blessed Mother had other children, based on the references in the Bible to the 'brothers' and 'sisters' of Jesus. Yet they ignore - or try to 'explain away' - John's Gospel's Bread of Life Discourse and say the Eucharist is just a remembrance or sign, not the Real Presence! A valid question I will try to tackle in the articles to follow is ... who determines when Jesus was speaking literally or figuratively, and on what basis do they make these decisions.

And so, my sisters and brothers in Christ [and I used that 'familial' terminology on purpose!], stick with me in this summer series. May our never-ending faith formation help us all to better understand and appreciate all that the Good Lord has revealed to us. May it also help us to better appreciate the role the Church's Magisterium, her 'Teaching Authority,' has in faithfully handing on to us the Deposit of Faith.

Registration for the 2024-25 Program Year

Students currently enrolled in our program should have received their re-registration form via the United States Postal Service. 
