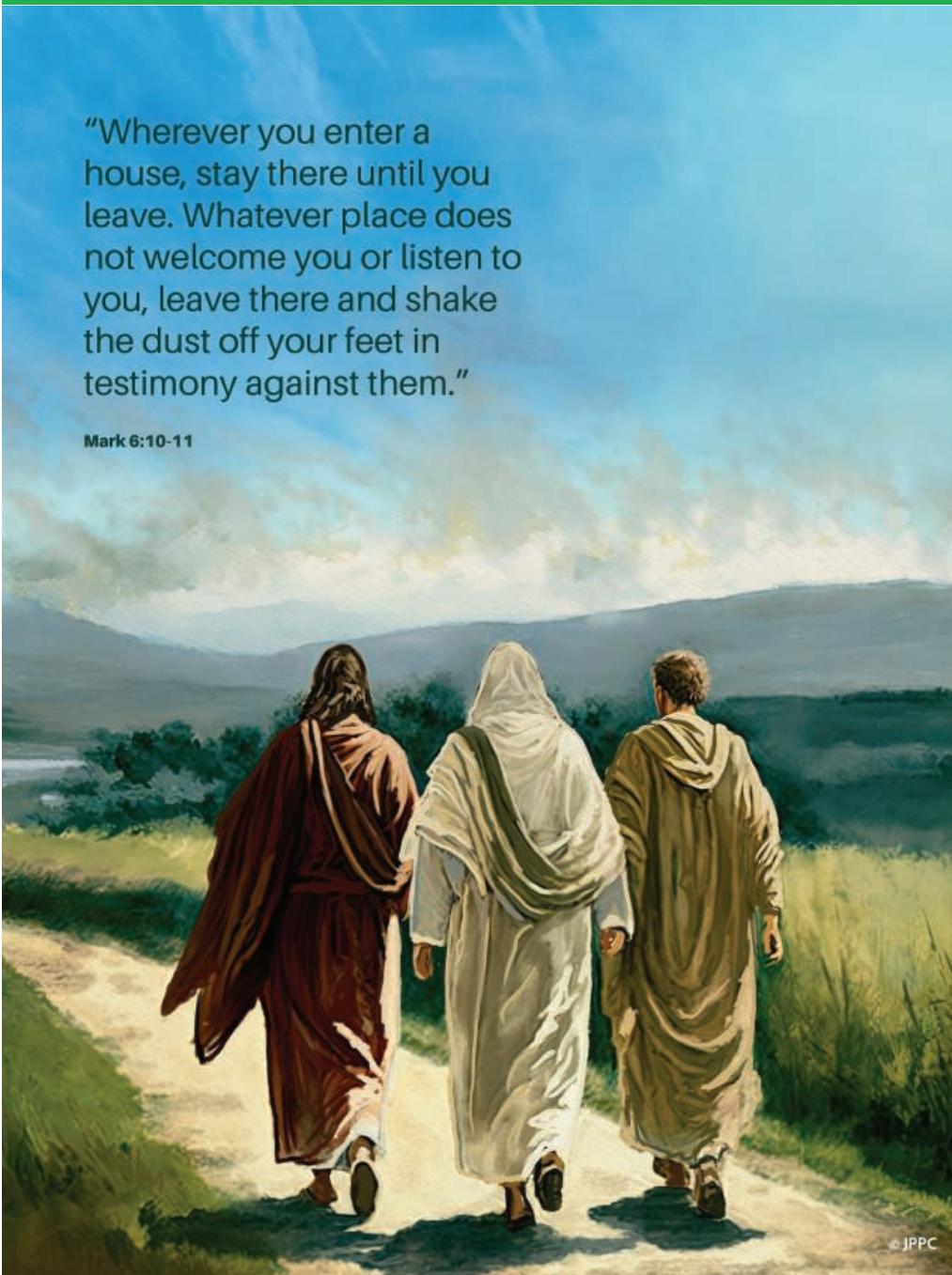

From the Pastor

THE BROTHERS & SISTERS OF JESUS.

Catholics are often asked by Protestants - and even other Catholics - things like: "How could Mary be 'ever-Virgin' if the Bible says Jesus had brothers

and sisters?" as we heard in last week's Gospel. In part 2 of our 4-part summer series, we will explain the various reasons why we can be sure that our Blessed Mother had no other children. Last week we explained why you can call me 'Father' - although Jesus said, "'call no one on earth your father..." [Matthew 23:9]. We also mentioned some other hyperboles, Semitic figures of speech, and turns of phrases used by Jesus; visit website for past bulletin articles.

OTHER USES OF THE TERM 'BROTHERS' IN THE BIBLE.

The word '**brother**' has various meanings in Sacred Scripture. In the Bible's first book, Abram, later known as Abraham, had a territorial dispute with his brother Haran's son, Lot. As he bid farewell to his nephew, he said, according to some translations, "Let there be no strife between you and me, or between your herders and my herders, for we are **brothers**." [Genesis 13:8] However

...

The Catholic Revised New American Bible uses the term '**kindred**' - rather than '**brothers**' - for some translations when the relationship is obvious. In this case, it was an **uncle** and his **nephew**, so they translated it into terminology we use. But Hebrew and Aramaic, the languages Jesus spoke, [He also would have known some Greek] have no terms for uncle or aunt, nephew, niece or cousin; they use the term '**brother**' for **all** these relationships - and even for members of the same clan or tribe! So, we must be careful: some biblical translations use terms that help **US** better understand their initial intent - but they are not **literal** translations of the **original** words ... which, for Uncle Abraham and Lot., was '**brothers**' even though they were **NOT** brothers.

So, too, in the New Testament. On *Easter* morning, Jesus told *Mary Magdalene*: "Do not be afraid. Go tell my **brothers** to go to Galilee, and there they will see me." [Matthew 28:10] and "go to

my **brothers** and tell them, 'I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" [John 20:17] Our **Blessed Mother** was surely not the mother or stepmother, nor Saint Joseph the father or stepfather, of all **Eleven Apostles** - yet Jesus referred to them as "his brothers!"

Then there's Saint Paul's quote about one of the Risen Lord's post-Resurrection appearances: "After that," [after His appearances to Peter and the other Apostles in the Upper Room and on a beach] He appeared to more than five hundred brothers at once, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep." [1 Corinthians 15:6] No one believes our **Blessed Mother** had over 500 children! - yet Saint Paul called them all '**brothers**' in the sense that all Christians are '**family**.' For as Jesus said, "Whoever does the will of my heavenly Father is my brother, and sister, and mother." [Matthew 12:50]

Some say what we hear at Christmastime proves that Jesus had **biological** brothers; here's one often **misinterpreted** quote: "she gave birth to her firstborn son." [Luke 2:7] A '**firstborn**' son was a special designation, akin to an '**heir apparent**.' In Jewish and other cultures, the '**firstborn**' son inherited everything; the term was used whether or not there were other children. Citing this biblical passage as '**proof**' that Jesus had blood brothers or sisters oversteps its purpose; so, too, with this quote: "[Joseph] had no relations with [Mary] until she bore a son..." [Matthew 1:25]

The main purpose of this statement was to affirm the **Virgin Birth** of Jesus, whose father was **NOT** Saint Joseph but God. Those who '**read into it**' must explain a similarly misleading quote about King David's wife Michal. After she scorned him, he expelled her from his harem, and the Bible states: "... Michal was childless to the day she died." [2 Samuel 6:23] No one '**reads into**' these words to say Michal gave birth to a child on the day she died - or someday thereafter! It is a way to very emphatically explain an event. Anyway, the **Greek** work for '**until**' does not rule out that our **Blessed Mother** and Saint Joseph had normal marital relations, but neither does it affirm that they did ... we have other properly translated biblical sources that, as we will see next week, affirm her perpetual virginity.

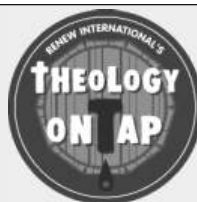

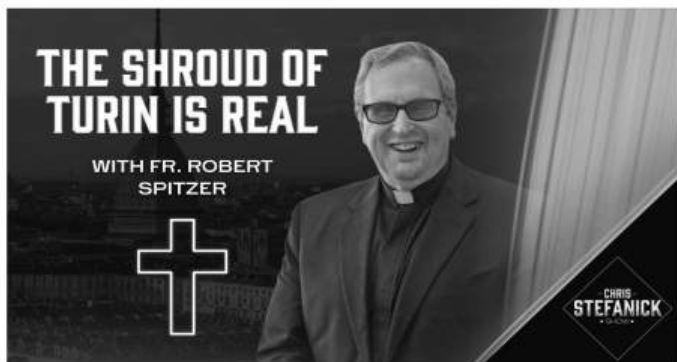

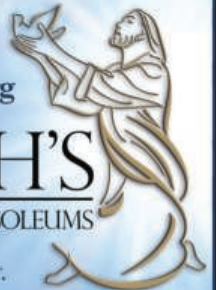
