

From the Pastor
16th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
July 21, 2024

THE BROTHERS & SISTERS OF JESUS. This is part 3 of my 4-part summer series on how our Blessed Mother is 'ever-Virgin' if the Bible says Jesus had 'brothers' and 'sisters.' For the first 2 articles, which gave the biblical basis

for this doctrine of the Church, and the proper explanation of some of the hyperboles, Semitic figures of speech, and turns of phrases used by Jesus, visit our parish website.

WE MUST READ BETWEEN THE LINES. In the Gospel on the 14th Sunday-B [July 7], we heard how - in our translation - some 'relatives' of Jesus publicly confronted Him and tried to take Him away, thinking He was crazy. Some translations say 'brothers' rather than 'relatives' - though no translation says His Mother was among them! In any case, let's set the stage: in biblical Judaism, a 'firstborn' son was like an 'heir apparent,' the term was applied even to an only child. This privileged 'firstborn son' would never, EVER be publicly challenged or questioned by a younger sibling! There was, and for some cultures, still is a family pecking order, strictly governed by custom - and rank had its privileges!

If, any of those 'relatives' who confronted Jesus, were His siblings, they would have to have been His younger siblings - for Scripture attests: Jesus was the 'firstborn son' - but younger ones never publicly confronted the eldest! So, who were the four 'brothers' of Jesus named in the Gospel [Mark 6:3] a few weeks ago: James and Joses and Judas and Simon - and His unnamed 'sisters?' While the Bible says they were children of Mary, it does **NOT** say they were children of Jesus' Mother.

At the crucifixion site, there were some women: "Among them were Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of the younger James and of Joses, and Salome." [Mark 15:40] ... "Among them were Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of the sons of Zebedee [the Apostles James and John]" [Matthew 27:56] ... "*all his acquaintances stood at a distance, including the women who had followed him from Galilee and saw these events*" [Luke 23:49] ... "*Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his*

mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala."

[John 19:25] With so many women named Mary, no wonder there is so much confusion! In any case, the biblical evidence strongly suggests that the 'brothers' and 'sisters' were merely cousins or more distant relatives.

So, now let's go a little deeper. As He hung upon the Cross, Jesus entrusted His Mother to the Beloved Disciple. We presume from this that Saint Joseph was dead; if he were still alive, she would have gone home to him. We also presume that - in a society where family bonds were sacrosanct - if the 'others' near the Cross were blood relatives, she would have been taken in by them. Or, if as some suggest - Saint Joseph had children from a previous marriage [an idea found nowhere in the Bible!] - they, too, would have been honor-bound to care for Mary. There are non-biblical writings from around AD 150 that suggest Joseph was a widower with children, and that Mary had taken a perpetual vow of virginity - which is still done by some in our own time! - and that Joseph accepted the role of being her protector, but we are digressing ...

In **The Finding in the Temple** [Luke 2:41-51] there is no mention of, or even a hint of, there being other children. If they had existed, would they not also have been searching diligently for their lost brother? In any case, the Gospels only mention **three** members of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary and Joseph. When there is any mention of Jesus, He is always designated as "the son of Joseph" or "the son of Mary" [Mark 6:3] - not as 'a' son of Joseph or Mary - not even when the passages mention the 'brethren' or 'brothers' of Jesus! "Is he not the carpenter's son?" [Matthew 13:55] - "Isn't this the son of Joseph?" [Luke 4:22] - "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph?" [John 6:42]

We can be assured Jesus had no blood 'brothers' or 'sisters' because the Church has done our homework for us. She reflected on the revealed texts with the promised Gift of the Holy Spirit, who, as Jesus said, would "guide us to all truth." [John 16:13] Next week: how, over the ages, the Church has deepened her understanding of and surety of this doctrine of our Faith.

Registration for the 2024-25 Program Year


