

From the Pastor  
17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in

#### THE BROTHERS & SISTERS OF JESUS.

We come to the end of our 4-part summer series on how our Blessed Mother is 'ever-Virgin' if the Bible says Jesus had brothers and sisters. For the first 3

articles, which gave the biblical basis for this doctrine of the Church, and the proper explanation of some of the hyperboles, Semitic figures of speech, and turns of phrases used by Jesus, visit our website.

**SCRIPTURE & TRADITION.** Before ascending back to heaven, Jesus promised to be with us always - not with a Bible, as important as it is, but through the Sacraments and the Holy Spirit who would "guide us to all truth." [John 16:13] There are **10** New Testament references to the 'brothers' and 'sisters' of Jesus [Matthew 12:46 & 13:55; Mark 3:31-34 & 6:3; Luke 8:19-20; John 2:12, 7:3-5, 7:10; Acts 1:14; 1 Corinthians 9:5] - and the Church's biblical basis for our Blessed Mother's perpetual virginity on her response to the Archangel Gabriel's message that she would conceive and bear a son: "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" [Luke 1:34]

The Blessed Virgin knew how conception usually takes place, and that in previous angelic proclamations of conception: to Sarah in Genesis 18, to Samson's mother, Manoah in Judges 13, to John the Baptist's father, Zechariah in Luke 1, natural conception occurred between a husband and wife. The only logical reason she wondered how she could conceive was that she must have made a vow of perpetual virginity, which was NOT broken since God is the Father of her Son. The belief that Mary continued to keep her vow, which Saint Joseph respected and also kept, was consistently held by the early Church Fathers:

The non-biblical *Protoevangelium of James* [AD 125] says that Saint Joseph was selected from a group of widowers to serve as the husband and protector of Mary, who was a virgin consecrated to God. Saint Justin Martyr [†-165] upheld Jesus' Virgin Birth and never mentions the possibility of other children. It was commonly held that Saint Joseph may have had other children who may have been known as Jesus' siblings - but by the

4<sup>th</sup> Century, Saint Athanasius referred to our Blessed Mother as 'Ever-Virgin.' What did he and others: Saint Ignatius of Antioch [†-140], Saint Polycarp [†-155], Saint Irenaeus [†-202], Saint Ambrose [†-397], Saint John Chrysostom [†-407], and Saint Augustine of Hippo [†-430] base their belief in Mary's perpetual virginity on?

The Church reflected on how Jesus fulfills all Old Testament prophecies, like this one: 'This gate must remain closed; it must not be opened, and no one should come through it. Because the LORD, the God of Israel, came through it, it must remain closed.' [Ezekiel 44:2] So, the Church began to see in Mary the gate through which no one but God may enter! Saint Jerome [†-420] affirmed the application of this Scripture to Mary's perpetual virginity as did Pope Saint Leo I [†-461]. Even leaders of the Protestant Reformation, like John Calvin [†-1564], Martin Luther [†-1564] and others defended the Church's teaching on this matter and which these days many, if not most or even all Protestants have rejected.

The Catholic Church still upholds this venerable doctrine that goes back to antiquity. Here is how she currently expresses it: "The Son whom she brought forth is he whom God placed as the first-born among many brethren, that is, the faithful in whose generation and formation she co-operates with a mother's love." [Catechism of the Catholic Church #501]

**CHURCH TRADITION.** The term 'tradition' with a lowercase 't' is the inherited customs or rituals passed on from one generation to the next, like candles on a birthday cake and singing the 'Happy Birthday' song. No birthday is 'complete' without it! In 'church lingo,' 'Tradition' with an uppercase 'T', is the ever deepening, biblically based, 'Deposit of Faith' which the Church professes: a process which can take centuries to formulate! There are four main Marian dogmas. All are firmly rooted in Sacred Scripture, but she was not given the title 'Mother of God' [in Greek: 'Theotokos'] until the Council of Ephesus in 431. In 649, the Council of the Lateran officially called her 'Ever-Virgin.' Her Immaculate Conception was defined in 1854 and her Assumption became dogma in 1950. Now you know!

## Registration for the 2024-25 Program Year

Forms for religious education registration are available only at the parish office. We ask that you please provide your child's Baptismal certificate if your child was not baptized in our parish. If your child is transferring into our program, we ask that a transfer be requested from the parish where your child previously attended.




