

**From the Pastor
18th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
August 1, 2021**

"COME TO ME, ALL WHO ARE BURDENED ... I WILL GIVE YOU REST." This pledge of Jesus [Matthew 11:28] must have been a great comfort to the Saint we honor this week.

For expressions and adages like 'No Pain, No Gain' - 'There's No Easter Without a Good Friday' and 'No Cross, No Resurrection' - certainly epitomize the life of Saint Peter Julian Eymard. Born on February 4, 1811 into a poor family in France in the tumultuous and often violent anti-Catholic craze after the 1789-1799 French Revolution, he endured many challenges and setbacks - but never gave up - by relying on what is perhaps one of God's most overlooked, yet powerfully potent, Gifts. After praying the Collect for the holy Mass offered on his optional memorial and Feast Day, August 2, we will detail his woes and the Way with which he was able to rise above every disappointment.

Collect - Saint Peter Julian Eymard

O God, who adorned Saint Peter Julian Eymard with a wonderful love for the sacred mysteries of the Body and Blood of your Son, graciously grant that we, too, may be worthy to receive the delights he drew from this divine banquet. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

THE WOES: FROM FAMILY. As expected, in the anti-religion zeal after the French Revolution, those who sought to enter the Priesthood or Religious Life - or just go to church - were mocked and scorned. Peter Julian's father, who had lost his first wife and six children, as well as three children from his second wife, before Peter Julian was even born, vehemently opposed any involvement in the Faith. He also had a business he needed his son to inherit and run - but he finally relented. However, young Peter Julian became so ill, the seminary sent him home to die. After a short time, he regained his health, and after his father died, he returned to the seminary.

THE WOES: FROM HERESIES. While some of the heretical abuses and clerical pretense that led to the French Revolution affected him, his worst enemy was the heresy called '*Jansenism*'.

"It was named for Bishop Jansen, who promoted many negative viewpoints: it overemphasized sin; downplayed God's grace and forgiveness; and saw sinful humanity as so depraved that no one should ever receive the Most Holy Eucharist.

THE 'WAY' HE PROMOTED. Prompted by the Holy Spirit to embrace a more positive viewpoint, Saint Peter Julian preached God's love and mercy, highlighted humanity's restored nature, and promoted a greater understanding of, and love for, the Most Holy Eucharist. While it would take another century before regular reception of Holy Communion would become normative, he urged people to 'make visits' before Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist, was a forerunner in encouraging lay people to get actively involved in the liturgy and other church matters, and established regular adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in what was once called 'Forty Hours' and is now called 'Eucharistic Adoration.'

A NEW 'WAY' - AND MORE WOES. Although he was ordained in 1834 as a Diocesan Priest, Saint Peter Julian chose to take additional vows of living in community and poverty and entered Religious Life as a Marist in 1839. The Marist Order has special devotion to our Blessed Mother, but not to the Eucharist, so in 1856, he founded his own Order, called the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament. However, he struggled for many years to get papal approval for his new religious community. He required that the members of his Order spend substantial time each day in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Thus, with frequent Eucharistic Adoration as the source and summit of God's grace and strength, they cared for the poor, taught and preached the love of God.

Saint Peter Julian died on August 1, 1868 at the age of 57; he was beatified in 1925 and was canonized on December 9, 1962, one day after the Second Vatican Council's first session, which set the stage for the regular reception of Holy Communion, ended. We would be wise to make the regular adoration and reception of the Blessed Sacrament the source and summit of all we do. Saint Peter Julian, pray for us.

REGISTRATION FOR THE 2021-22 PROGRAM YEAR

All re-registrations have been mailed, if you did not receive one please contact us immediately. Parishioners who are registered in the parish as a family who have a child entering Grade 1 should have received a registration letter and form via the mail. If you have not registered as a family in the parish please do so immediately, you may then register for religious education for the 2021-22 program year. If your child was baptized in another church or another faith please provide us with a copy of the Baptism Certificate when registering for religious education. If your child was baptized at Saint Justin's Church the certificate will not be required.

Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist

Please note that the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist is a two year preparation. The student is enrolled usually in Grade 1 but a student may be 'year one' in any grade. The sacraments are then received in year two.

Sacrament of Confirmation

The Sacrament of Confirmation is also a two year preparation process. The student is enrolled in Confirmation Prep I for the first year and Confirmation Prep II for the reception of the sacrament.






