

**From the Pastor  
21<sup>st</sup> Sunday in  
Ordinary Time - B  
August 22, 2021**

**FIRST SAINT OF THE NEW WORLD.** The first person to minister in the 'New World' [as we called it in 'pre-PC' days] and become a canonized Saint was born in Lima, Peru, on April 20,

1586, where she was baptized with the name Isabel [Elizabeth] Flores de Olivia. The daughter of a Puerto Rican father and Peruvian mother, she was so stunningly beautiful that she was nicknamed Rose which, in 1597, she took as her Confirmation name. Almost nothing else is known of her younger years, and what is known about her teenage and early adult years seems, at first, totally dissimilar from the challenges and practices of our world.

Sadly, Saint Rose of Lima is in danger of being a victim of radical 'Wokeism'. While the Spanish and other colonists who came to the 'New World' committed many sins and crimes, they also accomplished great deeds. By sowing the seeds of Christianity, which took root and grew, they ended the horrific practice of human sacrifices and instilled the ideals that - over time - improved many lives - especially for the poor and underprivileged who were often horribly abused and misused. [Ironically, since promoters of radical 'Wokeism' are not perfect either, we will have to - based on their illogical logic - eventually dismiss them, too!] But let's get back to the first Saint born in the Western Hemisphere.

**Collect - Saint Rose of Lima, Virgin**

O God, you set Saint Rose of Lima on fire with your love, so that, secluded from the world in the austerity of a life of penance, she might give herself to you alone; grant, we pray, that through her intercession, we may tread the paths of life on earth and drink at the stream of your delights in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

**THY WILL, NOT MY WILL, BE DONE.** From an early age, perhaps even 10, *Saint* Rose felt drawn to the *Religious Life*, but her parents wanted her to marry. To enhance her natural beauty, they adorned her hair with flowers and got her the most stylish clothing they could afford. In time,

her father 'relented' and let he become a Third Order Dominican, which enabled her to take simple vows of prayer, chastity, and poverty, but she had to stay at home, in a one-room 'cell' he provided for her, not in a convent.

In keeping with the customs of the time, she inflicted severe penances on herself. She rubbed hot peppers on her face to make her look less appealing; she cropped her hair short and wore a studded silver circlet as her crown of thorns; she fasted often, ate no meat [a severe dietary penance in those days], slept little, performed daily adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and received Holy Communion as often as possible. When her father lost his fortune in a bad mining investment, she helped support the family by selling embroidery and floral pieces from her one-room 'cell.' Only after her death on August 25, 1617, at the age of 31, did most learn how she had used her 'cell' as a place for the poor and needy to come to find help and support, setting the foundation for social services in Peru.

As I said above, her spiritual practices may seem quite bizarre, perhaps almost insane by today's standards. But does not the dynamic that played out between Saint Rose and her parents still occur today - as it has in every generation? In my teenage years, I recall the 'shock' caused by long hair on guys, tie-dyed clothing, hippies, and all sorts of behaviors unfit for a bulletin article. Are today's totally 'tatted' bodies, hair dyes of every color of the rainbow, dietary trends, and other crazes any different? So, rely on Saint Rose to get you through generational issues and trends.

Saint Rose was beatified in 1667 and canonized in 1671; while her Feast Day here and in most places is August 23, some countries like her native Peru, celebrate her on August 30. Saint Rose is the patroness of all the Americas, gardeners, embroiderers, florists, those who suffer ridicule for their piety, and those who suffer with family woes. She was very ill for the last three years of her life, and they say the whole city turned out for her funeral, with many prominent men taking turns to carry her coffin. Saint Rose of Lima, pray for us.

All re-registrations have been mailed, if you did not receive one please contact us immediately. Parishioners who are registered in the parish as a family who have a child entering Grade 1 should have received a registration letter and form via the mail. If you have not registered as a family in the parish please do so immediately, you may then register for religious education for the 2021-22 program year. If your child was baptized in another church or another faith please provide us with a copy of the Baptism Certificate when registering for religious education. If your child was baptized at Saint Justin's Church the certificate will not be required.

**Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist**

Please note that the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist is a two year preparation. The student is enrolled usually in Grade 1 but a student may be 'year one' in any grade. The sacraments are then received in year two.

**Sacrament of Confirmation**

The Sacrament of Confirmation is also a two year preparation process. The student is enrolled in Confirmation Prep I for the first year and Confirmation Prep II for the reception of the sacrament.

In 1881, Pope Leo XIII established the Diocese of Trenton to serve the Catholics of the southern part of New Jersey and named Father Michael J. O'Farrell of New York as its first bishop. At the time, the Diocese had 68 churches, 23 parochial schools and 51 priests spread out across Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties, as well as all of the territory that is now part of the Dioceses of Camden and Metuchen. 


Throughout her life, St. Monica constantly prayed for the conversion of Augustine, her beloved son.
