From the Pastor

RAIN, RAIN, GO AWAY?

Remember that old childhood chant, "Rain, rain, go away, come again another day?"

When drought rears its ugly head, forest fires rage, or wells and reservoirs run dry, we would be wise to sing a different tune. And we should heed the divine directive: "If I close heaven so that there is no rain ... [and] my people ... humble themselves and pray, and seek my face and turn from their evil ways, I will hear them from heaven and pardon their sins and heal their land." [2 Chronicles 7:13-14].

Admittedly, HOW our prayers alter God's will is a mystery; but we DO know, from many scripture passages, that our intercessory prayers DO work. So, when we need rain, we rightly ask the God who provides for our every need for His gift of rain. Here's the oration provided in the section of the **Roman Missal** entitled 'For Civil Needs': #35: For Rain. [Soon to come: #34: In Time of Earthquake & #36: For Fine Weather; we reflected on #37: For an End to Storms, in 08/08's bulletin.]

Collect - II. For Civil Needs - #35 - For Rain

O God, in whom we live and move and have our being, grant us sufficient rain, so that, being supplied with what sustains us in this present life, we may seek more confidently what sustains us for eternity.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

WE CAN PRAY FOR RAIN? Yes, based on the quote from *2 Chronicles* and *Jesus'* promise: "I tell you, all that you ask for in prayer, believe that you will receive it and it shall be yours." [Mark 11:24]. However, we must also believe and be in right standing with the Lord, which reminds us of an anecdote told years ago. Back in the Old West, before a town built its water tower and irrigation system, it was hit by a severe drought. They hired a Christian rainmaker, whose stipend was outrageously steep, and who agreed to come on the condition that his fees be paid only by the unbelievers he would separate from the believers once it started raining. They agreed, so he came and conducted his service, during which it began to teem, whereupon he designated as

believers' all who had brought along rain gear or an umbrella - and made all the others pay his bill.

GOD SHOWERS DOWN HIS BLESSINGS. As we noted in our article on #37: For an End to Storms, God uses things in the natural world to help us better understand the supernatural world. Here is Saint Cyril of Jerusalem's [313-386] analogy of this: "Water comes down from heaven as rain ... it is always the same in itself [and] produces many different effects, one in the palm tree, another in the vine, and so on throughout the whole of creation. It does not come down, now as one thing, now as another, but while remaining essentially the same, it adapts itself to the needs of every creature that receives it. In the same way the Holy Spirit ... apportions grace to each man as he wills." So, just as the same rain comes down and enables many different natural things to happen, 'holy' things must happen in us who receive God's supernatural gifts.

THE CHURCH'S USE OF WATER. Ritually, we use water in the Sacraments of **Baptism**; and we add water to the wine before it is consecrated. As a sacramental, 'holy water' is used to bless living and inanimate objects. Many were sad when we had to omit the Rite of **Sprinkling** and leave holy water stoops dry; but many rejoiced when we were permitted to be sprinkled and dip our fingers into holy water to bless ourselves. But again, like the earth and everything else that is enhanced and enlivened by rainwater, how are **WE** changed by our use of 'holy water?'

NEVER TAKE GOD'S GIFTS FOR GRANTED. As we grow in our sense of responsibility for and appreciation of rain and all of God's natural gifts, we must also deepen our desire for and acquisition of God's countless supernatural gifts. May we never experience a dismal drought - physically or spiritually - as described by the psalmist: "For you my body yearns; for you my soul thirsts, In a land parched, lifeless, and without water." [Psalm 63:2b]. With Christian concern, we lift up in prayer all who, in any part of the world, are experiencing the devastation of a drought and need God's gift of rain. May we always join in the biblical canticle which sings: "Every shower and dew, bless the Lord; praise and exalt him above all forever!" [Daniel 3:64] and never take God's gift of rain for granted.

REGISTRATION FOR THE 2021-22 PROGRAM YEAR

All re-registrations have been mailed, if you did not receive one please contact us immediately. Parishioners who are registered in the parish as a family who have a child entering Grade 1 should have received a registration letter and form via the mail. If you have not registered as a family in the parish please do so immediately, you may then register for religious education for the 2021-22 program year. If your child was baptized in another church or another faith please provide us with a copy of the Baptism Certificate when registering for religious education. If your child was baptized at Saint Justin's Church the certificate will not be required.

Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist
Please note that the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist is a two year preparation. The student is enrolled usually in Grade 1 but a student may be 'year one' in any grade. The sacraments are then received in year two.

Sacrament of Confirmation

The Sacrament of Confirmation is also a two year preparation process. The student is enrolled in Confirmation Prep I for the first year and Confirmation Prep II for the reception of the sacrament.

In 1881, Pope Leo XIII established the Diocese of Trenton to serve the Catholics of the southern part of New Jersey and named Father Michael J. O'Farrell of New York as its first bishop. At the time, the Diocese had 68 churches, 23 parochial schools and 51 priests spread out across Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties, as well as all of the territory that is now part of the Dioceses of Camden and Metuchen.
