

From the Pastor
22nd Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
September 1, 2024
Labor Day Weekend

THE BREAD OF LIFE DISCOURSE. Last week we completed our 5-weeklong consecutive proclamation of the 6th Chapter of Saint John's Gospel: the Bread

of Life Discourse. Since the 'Cycle B' set of Readings highlights Saint Mark, the shortest Gospel, we heard Saint John's Eucharistic exposé. Today ends our 5-part series, inspired by the National Eucharistic Revival, which ended with the July 21 Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana. However, our learning about, deepening awareness of, and more active participation in the Eucharist can never end ... so we continue ...

SACRED VESSELS. We strive to keep our liturgical environment consistent with our Lord's explicit requirements for the site of the First Mass at the Last Supper. He told his disciples: "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him ... he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." [Mark 13:14-15] A large, furnished upper room was quite extravagant in those days, so we must provide fitting sites for the holy Mass. Those who question the money spent on churches, sacred vessels, vestments and the like should recall Jesus' words, "The poor you will always have with you, and whenever you wish you can do good to them." [14:7] So, both charity to the poor - and providing dignified items for sacred worship - are demanded of us!

WHAT HAPPENED TO GLASS VESSELS? In the early centuries of the Church, glass chalices and other glass vessels were not uncommon. Nor have they been explicitly or definitively banned; but by 'reading between the lines,' we can see how they do not 'fit the bill' for use as Eucharistic vessels. The norms are quite clear: "Sacred vessels should be made from precious metal. If they are made from metal that rusts or from a metal less precious than gold, they should generally be gilded on the inside." [General Instruction on the Roman Missal {GIRM} #328.] As some point out, the words 'should' do not rule out that glass vessels 'could' be used, however ...

The GIRM [#332] adds: "... *sacred vessels may also be made from other solid materials which in the*

common estimation in each region are considered precious or noble," such as ebony or other harder woods that do not absorb liquids, "are clearly distinguishable from vessels intended for everyday use" and "do not easily break or deteriorate." [#329] Again, while that does not forbid glass, it was prohibited in a 1980 decree which said "... common vessels, or others lacking in quality, or devoid of all artistic merit or which are mere containers ... [or] vessels made from glass, earthenware, clay, or other materials that break easily." are not permitted. [Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, Instruction, *Inaestimabile donum*, #16]

SACRED VESTURE. All Ordained Ministers have prescribed vestments that must be worn. The main celebrant [Bishop/Priest] must wear an alb and stole [which is worn over both shoulders] topped with a chasuble; concelebrating Bishops and Priests ideally wear the same, although just an alb and stole may be worn for practical purposes. Deacons wear an alb and stole over only one shoulder; on festive occasions they may also don a dalmatic. Thanks to generous benefactors, our Parish owns many matching sets of vestments for most occasions. (We do not have a rose colored dalmatic for deacons which is only worn twice a year)

Lay Ministers do not have prescribed vesture; common sense - and common decency - dictate they not be casually dressed, though in need, anyone not scandalously dressed may serve. In the USA, Acolytes, Altar Servers, Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Musicians, and other Lay Ministers may wear an alb, cassock with no Roman collar and surplice, or other appropriate robe or dignified clothing. Most Parishes, like ours, have a dress code for our Liturgical Ministers, but again, in times of need, such regulations are abridged or cancelled. Our code prohibits the wearing of any pins or insignia that promotes a political or other causes [American flags ARE OK] lest the Sanctuary become a battleground for issues that do not belong where all God's children are welcome.

ACTIVE & CONSCIOUS PARTICIPATORS. We best fulfill this solemn mandate by serving in a Ministry and joining in Faith Formation sessions, What will you do to be a more active and conscious participant in the Sacred Rites?


