

MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) as well as sessions with the parish deacon or priest. Therefore, couples should make arrangements at the Parish Office one year before the planned wedding date and before finalizing any social plans.

From the Pastor 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - B September 8, 2024

RELIGIOUS LIFE. Nine months ago, on December 8, we celebrated our Blessed Mother's Immaculate

Conception, which makes today the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Since her Son takes precedence, her birthday is not celebrated this year; nor is next Sunday's Feast of Our Lady of **Sorrows**. However, we will devote these articles to all who totally dedicate themselves to God's call like Our Lady. Diocesan Priests like me make a promise of obedience and celibacy, but Religious Priests, Sisters and Brothers accept a higher calling. They take **VOWS** of poverty, chastity and obedience; some Orders add a vow of stability, making the monastery or cloister their sole home for life. Here are the orations for Masses offered for those who now serve God and His Church as Religious Priests, Sisters or Brothers.

Collect - For Religious - A

O God, who inspire and bring to fulfillment every good intention, direct your servants into the way of eternal salvation, and, as they have left all things to devote themselves entirely to you, grant that, following Christ and renouncing the things of this world, they may faithfully serve you and their neighbor in a spirit of poverty and in humility of heart. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

LIKE OUR BLESSED MOTHER. The Dominican Sisters who taught me used to add 'Mary' or the initial "M.' to their "Nun Name" to show their devotion to the one who gave her whole life to God's call. There was Sister Mary Leonard, Sister M. Irene and Sister M. Ancille. Many ended that custom when Vatican II reforms allowed them to use their **Baptismal** name; even **Priests** and **Brothers** did, or still do, add 'Mary' to their Religious *Name*. In any case, <u>ALL</u> are called to so embrace God's will that in whatever we do, we are as devoted to **Jesus** as His **Mother** was to Him. **Diocesan** Priests should struggle with the same 'worldly' concerns as do those we serve: finances; non-'communal' housing; maintaining a vehicle; paying for clerical attire and medical expenses, saving for retirement; etc. These things are provided by the *Order* for *Religious*, but not for

<u>Diocesan</u> Clergy. This Collect asks God to 'direct' <u>Religious</u> Ministers in their quest to keep and live out the Evangelical Virtues or Counsels.

Prayer over the Offerings - For Religious - A

Sanctify, we pray, O Lord, through these holy things we offer you, the servants you have gathered in your name, so that, faithfully fulfilling their vows to you, they may serve your majesty in sincerity of heart.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

WHY WE KEEP VOWS & PROMISES. Sacred
Scripture often notes that, although we are
often unfaithful, God is always faithful. As the
shortest of the 150 Psalms says [commit it to
memory!]: "Praise the LORD, all you nations!
Extol him, all you peoples! His mercy for us is
strong; the faithfulness of the LORD is forever.
Hallelujah!" [Psalm 117:1-2] Renewing a couple's
consent on their 25th or 50th Anniversary
inspires me, as does witnessing newlyweds make
them the first time. So, too, witnessing Deacons,
Priests, Bishops, Sisters or Brothers pledge themselves to - or mark a significant anniversary of
ministerial service.

Prayer after Communion - For Religious - A

Grant, O Lord, that your servants, gathered in your love and partaking of the one Bread, may be of one heart in prompting each other in the pursuit of charity and good works, so that through a holy way of life they may always and everywhere be true witnesses to Christ.

Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

HOLY TEAMWORK. Many a Bishop has had to remind his Diocesan Clergy that "no one is a Lone Ranger" and to seek guidance from, assist and even challenge each other as we strive to live out our Vocations as Priests. One drawback of 'One-Priest Parishes' is losing touch with our brothers in ministry. Our Religious brothers and sisters vowed to be there for each other, and to function as a team at all times. As all families know, there are drawbacks to communal living, too. And no one can be all God has called them to be without prayerful support ... so pray for all who have vowed or promised to serve the Lord in Holy Matrimony, Holy Orders, and the Religious Life.
