

**From the Pastor
25th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
September 19, 2021**

FLIGHT TO EGYPT. In His great Love for us, our God became flesh in Jesus Christ, who chose to experience all that human life offers - and

must endure. Though sinless, He entrusted Himself to sinful humanity - and paid the price - not only at the end of His life on earth - but even as an infant. As we know from sacred Scripture, the Holy Family suffered the all-too-common plight of the refugee and exile.

When the deranged King Herod ordered the massacre of all newborn boys in the vicinity of Bethlehem, Saint Joseph was warned in an angelic dream to take the Child and His Mother and flee for safety to Egypt. While the Bible is silent as to the details of that harrowing ordeal, to know what they endured, we need only watch modern-day news reports of the countless poor souls who are forced to leave homeland and most, if not all, possessions to seek safety and shelter from natural disasters, or despots, gangs, drug cartels and warmongers. As we pray these tender orations, may our hearts - and our help - go out to all refugees and exiles.

**Collect - II. For Civil Needs
#32 - For Refugees and Exiles**

O Lord, to whom no one is a stranger and from whose help no one is ever distant, look with compassion on refugees and exiles, on segregated persons and on lost children; restore them, we pray, to a homeland, and give us a kind heart for the needy and for strangers. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

"NO LONGER STRANGERS & SOJOURNERS." In his Letters to the first Churches, Saint Paul had to constantly remind us that we are all God's children - who must treat each other as family - especially those who are in need or distress. In one Letter he wrote: *"So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God."* [Ephesians 2:19] The Church interprets this to mean that while we may have respectful concern and devotion to our country of origin and/or our current 'home,' we are all merely 'passing through' on our way to our true

and eternal home in heaven. And while every country has the right to establish and secure its borders, we must be open to help those who are forced from - or need to flee from - their earthly homes. And this 'help' may take on many forms, from welcoming newcomers to our country, to assisting them in fixing what is wrong with their native land. While there are no easy answers, doing nothing is not an option; we must pray and do what we can for those in need; as must all countries.

Prayer over the Offerings - For Refugees and Exiles

O Lord, who willed that your Son should lay down his life to gather into one your scattered children, grant that this sacrifice of your peace may bring about a communion of minds and hearts and an increase in fraternal charity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

GOD BLESS ALL WHO RISK OR GIVE THEIR LIVES FOR OTHERS.

There are many who, like the Lord Jesus, willingly offer their lives to help those in need. So, we must also pray for - and support - all missionaries, members of the Peace Corps and other service organizations, the military and border guards, who face hardship, injury and even death to secure peace and justice, basic human rights and creature comforts to those who are denied their God-given dignity.

Prayer after Communion - For Refugees and Exiles

O Lord, who have renewed us with the one Bread and the one Chalice, grant that in sincerity of heart we may show true compassion toward strangers and the abandoned and that all of us may deserve to be gathered together at last in the land of the living. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

"I WAS A STRANGER AND YOU WELCOMED ME." The Lord Jesus so identifies with all who face what He once faced as an exile, a refugee and a stranger that He takes what we do - or do not do for those - personally. Again, while we may not be able to welcome them in our own home or neighborhood, state or country, if we do nothing for them, we risk eternal damnation (Matthew 25). What will we do for the stranger so that we deserve an eternal reward? This is a difficult challenge since we have moral concerns but also valid national security concerns. May God give us wisdom to do the right thing.






