

**From the Pastor
28th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
October 10, 2021**

"ALL'S WELL THAT ENDS WELL. We're not sure if Shakespeare would agree with the use of his play's title for an article on Pope Saint Callistus I, but we believe it fits. For almost all the documentation we have about our 16th Pope, who reigned from 12/20/217 to 10/14/222, comes from a Bishop who was once his ecclesial archenemy,

Saint Hippolytus, who wrote the only verifiable data we have about him. In those days, each Christian community elected its own Bishop, even in Rome; and in 217, it was assumed that Hippolytus would be the next Pope, but he lost to Callistus, against whom he harbored much resentment. Hippolytus even set himself up as our first antipope; eventually, he was reconciled with the Church and is venerated as a Saint since he was martyred, along with another Pope. In any case, as you will read below, many of the charges Hippolytus levelled against Callistus are some of the same reasons we honor Callistus as a Saint, not just a Martyr. So, after offering the prayer from the holy Mass on his Feast Day, October 14, we'll explain more.

Collect - Saint Callistus I, Pope & Martyr

O God, who raised up Pope Saint Callistus the First to serve the Church and attend devoutly to Christ's faithful departed, strengthen us, we pray, by his witness to the faith, so that, rescued from the slavery of corruption, we may merit an incorruptible inheritance. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

AN UNLIKELY FUTURE POPE. We have no record of his birth, but according to Hippolytus, Callistus was a cherished servant of a rich Roman who put him in charge of his finances. Through a bank failure and/or his own ineptness, he lost everything, and was demoted to manual labor as a slave. When the irate investors demanded he be returned to work to help recover their losses, a brawl broke out, so he was sent to the mines. Some say this severe sentence was simply due to anti-Christian persecution. Eventually, he was among the many freed by the initiatives of Saint Victor I, our 14th Pope; and some years later, the next Pope, Zephyrinus, ordained him a Deacon.

"PATRON SAINT OF CEMETERY WORKERS. Despite his past financial failures, Callistus was put in charge of what was probably the first property owned by the Church: a Roman cemetery which still bears his name. [During my Pilgrimage to Rome in 2000, the first Mass I concelebrated was at this cemetery, over its catacombs.] Thus, he is the Patron Saint of Cemetery Workers. The Pope also made him a trusted advisor on the many theological controversies of the day, which set the stage for him to succeed Pope Zephyrinus - and the nearly 18-year schism that began when Hippolytus lost the papal election to Pope Saint Callistus.

THE MEDICINE OF MERCY. Feuding parties often downplay their opponent's strengths and exaggerate their faults; when contentious issues are being debated, it's even worse. As in our own times, the hot-topic back in the 200's was who may or may not receive Holy Communion. Some, like Hippolytus, believed some sins, like apostasy, rejection of the Faith, and most sexual sins, were unforgiveable. He insisted that those who committed serious sin be excommunicated or ordered to a life of strict, severe penance.

Since ALL repentant sinners, who confess their sins, perform a reasonable penance and strive to avoid sin, can be forgiven and restored to the Church's sacramental life, Pope Callistus made this the Church's official policy, which it still is today. Hippolytus severed ties with the Church, forging our first major schism; our first antipope blamed Callistus' lax approach to sinners for the sordid sins that worsened throughout the Roman Empire, like adultery, abortion, and sexual depravity. [Sounds like the demonization of political opponents so prevalent in our own times!] 18 years later, having also opposed the reigns of Popes Urban I [222–230] and Pontian [230–235], Hippolytus was reconciled with the Church. As he and Pope Pontian, with whom he shares a Feast Day, August 13, awaited execution in the mines of Sardinia, they jointly nominated 'their' successor, restoring unity to the Church. So, don't let the dysfunctions in the Church these days get you down: we've survived much worse before! Saint Callistus, pray for us!




