Sunday Gospel [MT 22:1-14 OR 22:1-10](#)

"We hear Our Lord's timeless parable of the wedding feast today, coming as it does on the heels of the one about irresponsible vineyard tenants last weekend. Intangible riches, represented by fine food and drink, can be squandered irresponsibly with all variety of lame excuses

We note that Jesus tells the story in what you might call "three acts." First, there are the two different calls to the proper guests on the king's list. Then follows the call to the "outcasts", whom we might describe today as "marginal people." Finally, there is the king's dreadful sorting out of the people at the banquet. In that last act, the fate of the person caught without a "wedding garment", the clothes representing an authentic Christian lifestyle full of good deeds.

All in all, the lesson intended comes at us afresh. Shortly we will declare in our Creed that we believe "in one baptism." The banquet here represents a heaven of indescribable delights, beginning with seeing God "as He is." It makes any refusal on our part to come properly "dressed" to be the height of ill manners and foolishness. Why even flirt with the consequence of being "bound and cast out" in a hell of our own making?

The way we come to a special affair like this reflects our opinion of it and reveals the true spirit in which we come. If we go to visit at a friend's home, we don't go in the clothes we wear to paint the house or weed the garden. It is plainly a matter of respect that we should present ourselves in our friend's house as best we can. The more important garments for entering the king's hall are those of the heart and soul—the garment of humility, the garment of faith, and the garment of reverence. They display for all the world what we think of God's invitation. They honor all that God's Son taught us about "how to dress."

Our present earthbound lives are God's gift to us. Where we wind up in the future is largely up to us. We have to keep that invitation to heaven we got at the mount in a very safe place. I believe it's only prudent that we take the time, while we can, to build the best wardrobe for our future whereabouts. Meanwhile we have time to repent, reform, and renew ourselves." On April 27, 2014, in an unprecedented, historic first, two successors of **Saint Peter**: Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI and Pope Francis presided over the canonization of two of their predecessors: **Popes Saints John XXIII and John Paul II**. Before reviewing the life of Saint John XXIII, please pray his Collect:

Collect - Saint John XXIII, Pope

Almighty ever-living God, who in Pope Saint John the Twenty-Third have given a living example of Christ, the Good Shepherd, to shine throughout the whole world, grant us, we pray, that, through his intercession, we may joyfully pour out an abundance of Christian charity. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever.
Amen.

HOW A POPE WAS MADE. Born on November 25, 1881, **Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli** was the 4th of his poor, pious parents 13 children. He worked on the family farm until he entered a minor seminary when he was 11; after Ordination in 1904, he served as a Bishop's Secretary, a Seminary professor, and did further studies in Rome. In 1915, he became a military chaplain and stretcher-bearer; after witnessing the horrors of WWI, he returned to the seminary and did research for his multi-volume work on **Saint Charles Borromeo**, on whose feast day [11/04] he was coronated Pope.

ON THE JOB TRAINING. Having caught the eye of Pope Pius XI [*reigned 1922-1939*], he was made a Bishop in 1925, not of a Diocese, but as a papal diplomat. As Apostolic '*Visitor*' to Bulgaria [*1925-1934*] he worked with Orthodox Church leaders to heal the East/West Schism of 1054. He then served as Apostolic '*Delegate*' [*1935-1944*] to Greece and Turkey, where he dealt with the Orthodox Church and Islam. During WWII, he used his diplomatic ties to save an estimated 24,000 Jews via 'transit visas.' As the Vatican's *Ambassador* to France [*1944-1953*] he guided the post WWII restoration of Catholicism in France and dealt with clerics who had sided with the

'Nazis. In 1953, he was finally given his own diocese as the Cardinal Archbishop of Venice.

NO REST FOR THE WEARY. An approachable, pastoral prelate [unusual traits in those days!], he intended to finish his work on **Saint Charles Borromeo**, but unexpectedly emerged from the conclave on October 28, 1958 as Pope John XXIII, a name he took in honor of his father, **Saint John the Apostle/Evangelist, Saint John the Baptist**, and other pontiffs by the name of John whose reign was very short. He was the oldest Pope to be elected in over 200 years. His innovative style as the Bishop of Rome: visiting area parishes as do other Bishops; visiting prisoners so he could see those who, as he said, "**could not come to visit me**," and admitting that his cousin was in jail - endeared him even to those of little, if any, faith.

HIS AMAZING IMPACT. While some praise, and others blame him for all the Church's changes in the 1960's, some 'alterations' were made before he became Pope. Holy Week services as we know them were modified in 1946; in 1951, the renewal of baptismal promises by all on Easter - in the local language, not Latin - was added! While he was open to allowing some parts of Mass in the vernacular, so all could understand it, he wanted the Gloria, Creed, Eucharistic Prayer, etc., to remain in Latin - so all could join in wherever they went to Mass and to keep a sense of the mystical. But since he convened the Second Vatican Council [1962-1965] which gave us today's liturgical rites, his **Feast Day** is not his date of death: June 3 [1963], but today, **October 11**, the date of the first session of 'Vatican II.'

In his quest for peace, he had a behind-the-scenes role with the 1962 USA/USSR Cuban Missile Crisis. His upbeat outlook is evident in his saying: "**The Church has always opposed error ... [but now she] prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than that of severity ... not that the Gospel has changed; [but] we have begun to understand it better.**" Saint John XXIII, pray for us.






