St HEDWIG of SILESIA

From the Pastor
28th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
October 13, 2024

A CHRISTIAN TO THE CORE. It's truly a blessing to know someone whose very presence and demeanor brings comfort and peace. We must all strive to be that person who, although we cannot fix everything, makes it better by our touch and our words. Such was one of the two women the Church honors with an Optional Memorial on October 16: Saint

Hedwig. [There is another Saint Hedwig, aka Jadwiga, who was Queen of Poland in the 1300's.] This one was born in Bavaria in 1174, was Saint Elizabeth of Hungary's aunt and the wife of a Duke who reigned in what is now Poland. Here is the Collect for the holy Mass offered in her honor.

Collect - Saint Hedwig, Religious

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that the revered intercession of Saint Hedwig may bring us heavenly aid, just as her wonderful life is an example of humility for all. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

RICHES TO RAGS. Raised in a pious and noble family, she was well-educated; her siblings were successful religious and political leaders. Some say her marriage was politically motivated; she had seven children, four of whom lived to be adults; then she and her husband took vows of chastity so they could care for the kingdom and devote themselves to service in the Church. She washed lepers' feet on Holy Thursday, attended daily Mass, bringing food and clothing for the poor. In 1238, when her husband Henry died, she became a Cistercian, took a vow of poverty, died in the convent on October 15, 1243, and was Canonized in 1266.

Saint Hedwig supported orphans, hospitals, and monasteries - works of mercy we should all emulate. When a bishop ordered her to wear shoes [she was 'Decalced' or shoeless] she wore them around her neck! She is the Patron Saint of Brides, perhaps as a reminder that brides [and all of us!] should be much more concerned, as she was, with inner beauty, not outward show! Saint Hedwig, pray for us!

The other Saint whose Optional Memorial is on October 16 is Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. A French Nun born in 1647, she died on October 17, 1690, and was scorned and mocked for the gift she had received: several mystical visions, in which Jesus revealed to her His Sacred Heart, between 1673 and 1675. To grasp the significance of her visions, we must journey back to her time. First, pray the Collect from the holy Mass offered on her Feast Day.



St MARGARET MARY ALACOQUE

Collect - Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, Virgin

Pour out on us, we pray, O Lord, the spirit with which you so remarkably endowed Saint Margaret Mary, so that we may come to know that love of Christ which surpasses all understanding and be utterly filled with your fullness. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

JANSENISM. One harsh heresy that rocked the Church, named for its Dutch Bishop-promoter, Cornelius Jansen, had a dismal view of humanity and offered scant hope to sinners. It taught that most are totally corrupt and hopelessly lost. And in an overreaction to the Protestant Reformation, which denied or watered-down such things as the Real Presence in the Eucharist, Holy Orders and the like, the Catholic response went too far the other way. Sacred Rites were shrouded in fearful awe; images of Christ-crucified became more gruesome; and the radical difference between the divine and human was emphasized.

JESUS' BIG HEART. Devotion to the Sacred Heart, revealed to a humble nun, sought to draw us closer to Jesus. What a comfort to know and believe that Jesus, "who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin" [Hebrews 4:15] has a Sacred Heart filled with compassion and mercy for us! Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, pray for us! [Our church has a stained glass window in her honor.]


