

From the Pastor 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time - C October 16, 2022

ORATIONS: EUCHARISTIC
ADORATION. In part 10 of our series on The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church US Bishops' document, we're reflecting on the 4th of the 7 prayers used to end Benediction.

The 7 'themes' are: Memorial; True God/True Man; Paschal Lamb of God; Heavenly Bread of Angels; Spirit and Truth; Life-Giving Bread/Viaticum; and Paschal Mystery Renewed. Eucharistic Adoration Oration: 4 of 7

Lord our God, you have given us the True Bread from Heaven.

In the strength of this food may we live always by your life and rise to glory on the last day.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

PANIS ANGELICUS. For whatever reason, the revered, venerable song, 'Panis Angelicus' -'Bread of Angels' - is found on classic Christmas albums - which will be here before you know it! Its words come from the last stanzas of the hymn - 'Sacris Solemniis' - 'Solemn Feast' - written in the 13th Century by Saint Thomas Aguinas for the Feast of Corpus Christi. It has been performed by tenors Andrea Bocelli, Luciano Pavarotti, Plácido Domingo and many others. Perhaps since its last lines: "Manducat dominum Pauper, pauper Servus et humilis" - "The body of the Lord will nourish the poor, the poor, the servile, and the humble" - recalls the Christ Child's humble manger or animals' feeding trough - it became a Christmas carol. However, as the above oration for concluding Eucharistic Adoration reminds us: He who once rested in a manger bed is now truly present to us - and for us - in the Eucharist - as our food for eternal life!

TRUE BREAD FROM HEAVEN. In order to better appreciate the title, *True Bread from Heaven'* for the *Eucharist*, we must go back to the days of ancient Israel as they journeyed through the desert on their way to the *Promised Land*. In their dire thirst and hunger, the people often grumbled against *Moses* and *Aaron* - and the *Lord*. "If only we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our kettles of meat and ate our fill of bread! But you have

led us into this wilderness to make this whole assembly die of famine!" [Exodus 16:3] In response, the Lord rained down fine flakes or a coriander-like seed which they used to make 'bread.' They called it 'manna' - a word meaning 'what is this?' since it was so mysterious - but God called it "bread from heaven." [16:4] This was their daily sustenance for their 40-year desert trek; once they entered the Promised Land, "the manna ceased." [Joshua 5:12]

"I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE." In His 'Bread of Life' Discourse, Jesus referred to this 'manna' as He explained in the Fourth Gospel: "I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." [John 6:48-51] Catholicism, unlike most of Protestantism, takes these words literally - which, as the rest of our Lord's dialogue with our ancestors makes clear, is how He intended them as well. Jesus even allowed those who refused to accept this fact that the bread He gives is, indeed, His Flesh for the life of the world - to walk away! [Cf. John 6:66] We must also accept this non-negotiable revelation about the Eucharist!

"WE BECOME WHAT WE RECEIVE." Far be it from me to 'correct' a Saint, but whenever I reference the above quote, credited to the great Saint Augustine of Hippo [354-430], I change one word: "We become WHO, not what, we receive!" For under the forms of bread and wine, Jesus truly, really, enters us, to enable us to become more like the One we receive. By extension, we who worship and adore His Eucharistic Presence can also be changed. All analogies 'limp,' but think of it this way: as workers keep photos of loved ones in their office to help them remember the ones for whom they go to work, holy images help us to do the same. However, Christ's REAL Presence is even more powerful! When was your last 'visit' to the **Blessed Sacrament?**

Fiftieth Anniversary Update

I previously announced that our parish will celebrating its 50th Anniversary on November 6th. Our Bishop, Bishop David O'Connell was scheduled to celebrate Mass here on that date and our intention was to invite our founding pastor, Father George Deutsch and all the priests who served here in the past to join us in the celebration.

Unfortunately the accident that occurred on Thursday, August 18th which has necessitated the closing of our narthex set us back. Repairs still have not been made. The matter is in the hands of the diocesan officials who are dealing with insurance companies, contractors and town officials. I am not a part of this process. To say the very least, this has been a frustrating time for all of us. I am grateful for your patience.

We had also planned a series of events to celebrate the anniversary. Many of them have been cancelled. The talk on the Eucharist by the Franciscan Friars and Toms River Intergenerational Choir Concert are still scheduled. We had also planned on bringing back the monthly Social Sundays since the pandemic is, hopefully, behind us. We will reschedule cancelled events and the Social Sundays when the narthex is completed.

As to the paving of the parking lot and the demolition of the unsafe and unused building, there have been several delays. The floor tiles all contained asbestos which took a long time to remove. Demolition of the building is not so easy since it was the first building on the campus and much of the electrical panels for the parking lot lights and other areas are located in that building. Correcting this has proven to be more difficult than originally thought.


As with any older buildings, things eventually have to be replaced. You are all aware of this with the hydraulic cylinder on the one side door which is need of replacement. This is causing the door to slam. The one on another door is also in need of replacement. These parts have been ordered but, we are told, they take several weeks to arrive. They also cost slightly over \$500 each.

Until the narthex is complete, I have asked Bishop O'Connell to reschedule the celebration of the Anniversary Mass. He has graciously agreed. I will keep you informed as to when this will be rescheduled.

I am blessed to be pastor here at Saint Justin the Martyr Parish. As Toms River itself has grown so has our parish since 1972. Our parish has been the spiritual home for so many people past and present. With the grace of God, our parish, and our Catholic Faith, will continue to grow; not just in numbers, but in the true Gospel spirit. Remembering the Past provides gratitude...Living in the Present touches our spirit with joy... and Believing in the future renews our purpose and mission given by the Lord.

Thanks to all those who have gone before...Peace and Joy to our present parishioners... and abiding Faith to each of us for what is yet to come!
