



### THE FIRST NORTH AMERICAN MARTYRS.

Among the many sad victims of revisionists who re-write history to meet modern concerns are the missionaries who planted the seeds of our Faith in North America. While the Europeans DID inadvertently bring diseases for which the natives had no immunity, and some had sinister

plans for the 'New World' [a term now deemed politically incorrect!], most hoped to bring prosperity, innovation and the Christian Faith to the less-developed pagan Native Americans, some of whom still practiced cannibalism and human sacrifices! And in an imperfect, fallen world, we must always expect some bad with the good.

In 1625, French Jesuits joined their countrymen in what they called 'New France' and made their headquarters in Quebec. On the *Feast of Saints John de Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs*, we honor 6 Priests and 2 Lay Brothers: *Fathers Isaac Jogues* [[†10-18-1646; NY State](#)]; *Gabriel Lalemant* [[†03-17-1649; Canada](#)], *Anthony Daniel* [[†07-04-1648; Canada](#)]; *Charles Garnier* [[†12-07-1649; Canada](#)]; *Noel Chabanel* [[†12-08-1649; Canada](#)] and *Lay Brothers René Goupil* [[†09-29-1642; NY State](#)] and *John de Lalande* [[†10-19-1646; NY State](#)] who gave their lives to sow the seeds of our Faith. To begin, pray the Collect for the Masses offered on their **October 19** Feast Day:

#### Collect - Saints John de Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs

O God, who chose to manifest the blessed hope of your eternal Kingdom by the toil of Saints John de Brébeuf, Isaac Jogues and their companions and by the shedding of their blood, graciously grant that through their intercession the faith of Christians may be strengthened day by day. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. **Amen.**

**THE 'BLACK ROBES.'** Most French Jesuits, known by their black cassocks, were welcomed by the Huron Tribe. But Protestant English and Dutch settlers incited their archenemy, the Iroquois, to destroy the Hurons and all Catholic missionaries. The 8 cultured, well-educated Jesuits were quite

unaccustomed to the natives' habitat and diet yet strove to adopt their lifestyle. While the horrific tortures they endured are not fit for print, one gory detail must be retold. In 1642, **Father Jogues** was captured by the Iroquois, who, among other hideous things, literally chewed off his forefingers - the ones which, back then, were the only fingers Priests could use to touch the **Blessed Sacrament**.

In 1643, he escaped and, with a Protestant Minister's aid, fled to Manhattan Island [the first Catholic Priest to set foot there] and sailed to France. Before returning to Quebec, he sought permission from Pope Urban VIII to celebrate Mass with his mutilated hands. The Pope granted a dispensation, writing: "It would be shameful that a martyr of Christ not be allowed to drink the Blood of Christ." [In his icons, his 'consecratory fingers' are missing.] On October 18, 1646, after unspeakable tortures, he was tomahawked and beheaded, and his body was burned.

**HIS FIRST MIRACLE?** A 2<sup>nd</sup> Century theologian, Tertullian, is credited with the statement: "**The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church.**" which seems to be true for **Father Jogues**. In 1647, allies of the French captured his murderer and condemned him to death. But as he awaited execution, he converted and took the Christian name '**Isaac Jogues**' This is just one of the many examples of how through the suffering and death of the **North American Martyrs** Catholicism was firmly planted in the 'New World.'

**OUR NEWEST MARTYRS.** According to some estimates, more Christians have been martyred in the last 100 years than in the previous 1,900 years - combined! From China to Cuba, the Church is under duress. In some Moslem countries, one can lose their job, their home, their rights - or their life - simply for being a Christian. Whole Christian villages have been wiped out in Somalia, Pakistan and other places; many churches are looted or destroyed. Please pray for them, and never insult them by letting our challenges, which pale by comparison, keep us from professing and practicing our Faith!

Although this is irrelevant, as a freshman at Fordham University, I lived in the dormitory called Martyrs Court named after these great Jesuit saints and subsequently learned more of the history of these North American Martyrs and developed a devotion to them.


