The Importance of Eucharistic Adoration

The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.

Holy Hours

Holy hours are the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an hour in Eucharistic Adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The bishops have created a variety of holy hours that focus our prayer to Jesus Christ on peace, life, vocations, and other topics that are at the heart of the life of the Church and the world.




ROSARY FOR LIFE

From the Pastor
30th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - A
October 25, 2020

"NOW AND AT THE HOUR OF OUR DEATH."

This phrase has been part of the '[Hail Mary](#)' since at least the 1545-1563 Council of Trent; it was probably added in response to fear of the 'Black Plague.'

While the Bible does not record [Saint Joseph's](#) death, we presume he died before [Jesus](#) did, since from the Cross, to make sure His Mother was not homeless, [Jesus](#) entrusted her to the [Beloved Disciple](#). Since Tradition holds that [Saint Joseph](#) died in the arms of his [beloved spouse](#) and foster [Son](#), he is the [patron saint of a happy death](#). Who would NOT want the grace of dying in the arms of the [Blessed Virgin](#) and her [Son](#)!

A common question often asked is: "Is it a sin to pray for someone to die?" Assuming it's a prayer to end someone's fatal, incurable suffering we assure them: the Church has a set of orations that pray for a happy death - for ourselves and others. As we enter November, the [Month of All Souls](#), let us reflect on these tender, gentle prayers.

Collect - For the Grace of a Happy Death

O God, who have created us in your image and willed that your Son should undergo death for our sake, grant that those who call upon you may be watchful in prayer at all times, so that we may leave this world without stain of sin and may merit to rest with joy in your merciful embrace. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. **Amen.**

"READY, SET, GO!" Even kids know races or competitions start with getting [ready](#) as in: "Ready, Set, Go!" And the onus for 'getting ready' for life's ending, our final journey and last breath, is on [us!](#) If we are 'watchful in prayer,' make, a good Confession when necessary, and, ideally, receive Eucharist in the form of 'Viaticum' which literally means 'Food for the Road,' we can be confident we will be [ready](#) when death comes. And as [Jesus](#) warned: "... no one knows the day or the hour... so stay awake ... and be prepared." [Matthew 24:36-44] So, obviously, the ones who are less likely to be caught off-guard are those who regularly practice their Faith, and celebrate the Sacraments, etc.

Prayer over the Offerings - For the Grace of a Happy Death

As you have destroyed our death, O Lord, by the Death of your Only Begotten Son, grant, we pray, through the power of the same mystery, that, obeying your will even until death, we may go forth from this world in peace and trust and by your gift be made sharers in his Resurrection.

Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

HE DESTROYED DEATH 'FOR' US. Without getting too theological let's simply answer a complex question: had Adam and Eve NOT sinned, would they have died? The simple answer is no; before 'the Fall,' humanity was not subject to life's frailties or failings; but all that was lost by the Original Sin of pride and disobedience. [Note: the Bible mentions no apple!] As [Saint Paul](#) says, "[through one person sin entered the world, and through sin, death.](#)" [Romans 5:12] All Genesis says is: Adam and Eve were expelled from the Garden, heaven's gates were closed, and our life took a turn for the worse. Then God sent His Son into the world to destroy death by His humble, total obedience to His Father's will that He die to reopen heaven's gates. Thus, [Jesus](#) destroyed death FOR us, but keep on reading ...

Prayer after Communion - For the Grace of a Happy Death

Having received the pledge of immortality through these mysteries, O Lord, we humbly entreat your fatherly help for the moment when we depart in death, so that, overcoming the snares of the enemy, we may be restored to life in the embrace of your eternal glory. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

HE DESTROYED DEATH 'IN' US. Since the fallout from 'Original Sin' still haunts us, even after we are baptized, we must constantly wage our own personal war against sin and death. But we do not fight alone! For through His Church and her [Sacraments](#), communal and private prayers for ourselves and others - even those who have died - Jesus can also destroy the power of death IN us, even as, like a cancer, it gradually consumes us. Next week, on [All Souls' Day, November 2](#), remember to pray for all the dead who need our prayers to finally pass through the gates of heaven that Christ opened for us!

If you have not already voted, please vote. It is important that we not only vote, but that we pray. Do not vote without praying and do not pray without voting. Please see this bulletin regarding Eucharistic Adoration on November 3rd.




