From the Pastor
32nd Sunday in
Ordinary Time - A
November 12, 2023

Saint Clement I, Pope & Martyr.

On November 23 we honor Saint Columban, Abbot; Blessed Miguel Agustin Pro, Priest & Martyr; and the above-mentioned 3rd Successor of Saint Peter or 4th Pope. Why do we honor a man about whom we know next to nothing? While accurate records about him are scant, the little we DO know about him

refutes erroneous assumptions and false accusations - and affirms official Church history and doctrine. After praying the Collect for his Feast Day, we'll explain.

Saint Clement I, Pope & Martyr

Almighty ever-living God, who are wonderful in the virtue of all your Saints, grant us joy in the yearly commemoration of Saint Clement, who, as a Martyr and High Priest of your Son, bore out by his witness what he celebrated in mystery and confirmed by example what he preached with his lips.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

Born about 35 AD in Rome, and possibly ordained by Saint Peter, he was handpicked by Pope Linus to be a future Pope. His name should sound familiar as the 4 first saintly Popes are mentioned in Eucharistic Prayer I; after Peter [and the other Apostles]: comes "Linus, Cletus, Clement." Many scholars speculate that Saint Peter's 'camp,' chose Clement and Saint Paul's 'camp' chose Cletus. Scripture notes the friction between the two great Apostles; Paul proudly boasted: "... when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face because he clearly was wrong..." [Galatians 2:11] over Peter's plan to keep Jewish dietary laws. Eventually, Peter accepted Paul's position. So, while Popes and Bishops did, do, and will have issues and spats, the Petrine Office keeps the Church united, for the Bishop of Rome has the final word: 'Roma locuta causa finita east' - 'Rome has spoken, the case is closed.'

Wisely, perhaps with political prowess, Clement continued *Paul's* challenge of the *Church* in *Corinth*, *Clements's Letters* to that community - the oldest extant records we have, *outside* of the

New Testament - attest to Rome's centrality in doctrinal matters. So, contrary to the belief of some Protestant Reformers, the Pope's authority over the Church is **NOT** a **later** development in Church history. Much about the papacy has changed, but not its core. In my lifetime, I saw Popes regally carried aloft on a throne, the *sedia gestatoria*; the last three Popes have used canes, walkers or wheelchairs; they used to be **crowned** with a triple tiara; now they are simply **installed** as our Supreme Pastor as a *pallium* or woolen stole is placed over their shoulders. Pope John Paul I [† 1978] ended the use of the royal or papal 'We' except in formal documents. Its biblical basis comes from the Apostles statement about no longer needing Jewish dietary laws; they wrote in the plural: "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us..." [Acts 15:28]

Around 90 AD, Pope Clement, as the Supreme **Pontiff**, which means 'bridge-builder,' wrote to, and may have even travelled to, Corinth to help heal a rift between - who would guess - the laity and the clergy! Urging each side to be courteous, respectful and, above all, **Christian**, it seems he solved the split Saint Paul had tried to reconcile. Until the 27 New Testament books were canonized at the Council of Hippo in 393, Pope Clement's Letters were proclaimed at holy Mass! The charity with which Clement addressed the *Corinthians'* differences, and insistence they respect one another, is desperately needed in our polarized, politicized Church and country.

Vile persecutions plagued the Church until the Peace of Constantine in 313. Most amazingly, Clement remained positive and compassionate even when harshly mistreated and maligned by others. He was banished to a marble quarry to do hard labor. He converted so many prison mates, civil authorities condemned him to death. Tied to an anchor, he was cast into the sea; artistically, he is often depicted with an anchor. In the Church's sense of humor, he is the Patron Saint of Mariners and Marble Workers. One of Rome's first parishes is probably built over his home. He is also honored by the Orthodox Church, and by Episcopalian, Anglican and Lutheran Communities. Saint Clement, pray for us and for the unity of the Church.


