From the Pastor
33rd Sunday in
Ordinary Time - B
November 17, 2024

ANOTHER 'RICHES TO RAGS.' Although we will not celebrate it since it fell on a Sunday, today is the optional memorial of Saint Elizabeth of Hungary.

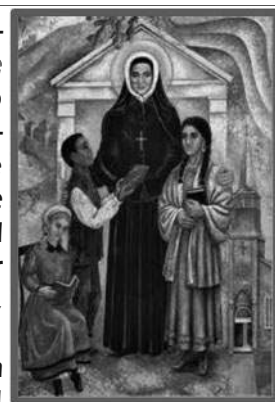
Born on July 7, 1207, into royalty, her mother, the Queen, was murdered when Elizabeth was 6 years old. Gifted with a solid Catholic education, at 14 she was wed in a prearranged marriage to the future Louis IV of Thuringia, uniting what is now parts of Hungary and Germany. Widowed with three children at 20, she devoted her life to caring for the poor until her death at just 24 on November 17, 1231. After praying the Collect from the holy Mass offered in her memory, we'll explain what prompted her to be so generous.

Collect - Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious

O God, by whose gift Saint Elizabeth of Hungary recognized and revered Christ in the poor, grant, through her intercession, that we may serve with unflinching charity the needy and those afflicted. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

FAITH-IN-ACTION IS CONTAGIOUS. In 1223, Friars came to provide for the royal family's spiritual needs, and Elizabeth was enthralled by their Order's founder: Francis of Assisi, who would die 5 years [10/03/1226] before she did. In art, she is depicted: with baskets of bread [she fed the poor from her own table, even before she ate!]; bouquets of roses [when mocked for bringing bread to the poor, she opened her apron and found roses: a sign of divine favor]; or [as seen above] washing lepers or placing them in her own bed [when her husband looked to see who was in the bed, he saw an image of Christ]. Those who dismiss these legends as fairytales must ask themselves what they will say when Jesus asks: "What did you do to the least of my brothers and sisters?" [cf.: Matthew 25:40]

Canonized in 1235, Elizabeth of Hungary is the Patron Saint of, among other things: bakers; beggars; brides; Catholic Charities; death of children; difficult in-laws, homeless people; hospitals; Sisters of Mercy; widows; and those falsely accused or mocked for their piety. Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, pray for us and the poor.



Tomorrow we honor another 'New World' Saint: Rose Philippine Duchesne, who was born into a wealthy family in France in 1769. The second of 8 children, she was privately tutored and was also enthralled by her religious guides, the Jesuits, who spoke of the ripe mission fields awaiting them in the Americas. Her initial efforts to enter the Convent were thwarted by her family, but, without their knowledge or consent, she joined the Visitation nuns when she was 19 and enjoyed Religious Life until, 4 years later, the French Revolution [1787-1799] outlawed Religious Orders and confiscated Religious Houses. Under Napoleon, things improved, but after his defeat at Waterloo in 1815, she discerned God's call to go to the new territory gained by the USA in the Louisiana Purchase. More of her life after praying the Collect from the holy Mass offered in her memory on her Feast Day: November 18.

Collect - Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, Virgin

Almighty God, who filled the heart of Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne with charity and missionary zeal, and gave her the desire to make you known among all peoples, grant us to follow her way and fill us with that same love and zeal to extend your Kingdom to the ends of the earth. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

RUGGED FRONTIERSWOMAN. It is difficult to think how harsh and hazardous sailing across the Atlantic on ship to New Orleans in 1818, and then by steamboat to Saint Louis, Louisiana, was ... in full habit, no less! Her mission was to teach French immigrants, yet she tried to learn English and the language of the local Native Americans who affectionately named her, "Ouah-kah-kanum-ad," - "Woman-who-prays-always." For 34 years, she founded schools, convents and a novitiate. She died on November 18, 1852, and was canonized July 3, 1988, by Saint John Paul II. Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, pray for us.

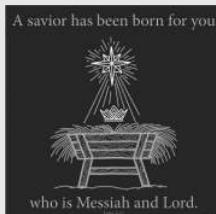

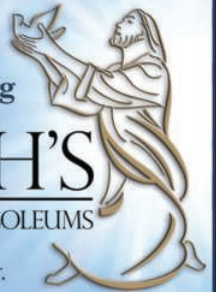
