**PRAYERS FOR OUR  
BELOVED DEAD.** As we  
bring another liturgical  
year to its end by honoring

**Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe**, we also bring the **Month of All Souls** to its end by reflecting on another set of orations for **Masses** offered on the **Anniversary of Death**, set 'E'. Again, we adapted the orations to make them singular or plural and put references to the 'anniversary' in brackets for you to omit so you can use these orations for your intentions. May all our beloved dead be welcomed into the **eternal and universal Kingdom of truth and life, holiness and grace, justice, love and peace!**

**Collect - For the Dead: Other Prayers on the  
Anniversary**

O God of all forgiveness, grant to the soul  
of your **servant[s] [N., N., etc.]**,  
[whose anniversary we celebrate,]  
a place of refreshment, of blessed rest  
and resplendent light.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. **Amen.**

**WHAT WILL HEAVEN BE LIKE?** Short answer: we do not know; it has not been revealed to us. However, **God** has given us clues, which the **Church** echoes in her prayers for the dead. This **Collect** mentions three heavenly delights: **refreshment, rest and light**. As **Psalm 23** reminds us, the **Lord** has prepared a **banquet**, a table overflowing with "**juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines.**" [Isaiah 25:6b] where we will be anointed with **soothing oil**. The image of a **wedding feast** was often used by **Jesus** to prepare us for what [hopefully!] awaits us.

The **Good Shepherd** also promises to lead us to **green pastures and still waters**, where no enemy can harm us - not even death itself. And if we had passed through any dark valleys [and who hasn't!], **Jesus** will be at our side to bring us safely through them and into His own house ... which the **Bible** describes in this radiant image: "**The city had no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb.**" [Revelation 21:23] With all this awaiting us, all the more reason to seek **God's** forgiveness and mercy for ourselves and for our departed loved ones.

**Prayer over the Offerings - Other Prayers/  
Anniversary**

May both our prayer and our offering  
be pleasing to you, O Lord,  
that your **servant[s] [N., N., etc.]**,  
for whose salvation they are offered,  
may gain through them  
the fullness of your redemption.  
Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

**FULLNESS OF REDEMPTION.** The **Psalmist** also assures us: "**For with the LORD is mercy, with him is plenteous redemption, And he will redeem Israel from all its sins.**" [Psalm 130:7b-8] As the **New Israel**, the **Church** can trust that as our ancestors passed through the **Red Sea** and into the **Promised Land**, **God** will lead us through the **waters of Baptism** and into **Heaven**. This oration also highlights the efficacy of our prayers and good deeds, our sacrifices and offerings. Since **God** has made our redemption a 'team effort' - with **Jesus**, our **Captain**, leading the way and winning the game for us, we must now do our part so that we and our beloved dead can more worthily share in the graces He won for us.

**Prayer after Communion - Other Prayers/Anniversary**

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that  
the soul of your **servant[s] [N., N., etc.]**,  
for whom we have offered  
this sacrifice to your majesty,  
may by the power of this Sacrament  
be cleansed of all sins  
and receive from your mercy  
the happiness of perpetual light.  
Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

**THE POWER OF THIS SACRAMENT.** The most graced gift we can give to the dead is to have **holy Mass** offered for them: a **Funeral Mass** and by arranging a **Mass Intention** for them. On her deathbed, **Saint Monica** told her son, the future **Saint Augustine**, over whom she shed countless tears that led to his conversion, "**Bury my body wherever you will; let not care of it cause you any concern. One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be.**" So, at **holy Mass**, in every **Universal Prayer** and in every **Eucharistic Prayer**, there is an **intention for the dead**. May they rest in peace.

Begin with your state in life [i.e., married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the Prayer of Absolution; pray the Act of Contrition AFTER you leave.*

Do I need to grow in courage, and in my ability  
to deal with conflict in honest, respectful  
and constructive ways?

Am I so afraid of God - or of what He asks of me -  
that I try to hide from the LORD  
or from the Church's rites and rituals?

Am I a respectful, dependable person,  
in whom others see another Christ?

Do I think of my activity - family, work, leisure -  
as ways to serve God and  
bring God's presence into the world?

"LORD, you have probed me, you know me:  
you know when I sit and stand; you understand my  
thoughts from afar. You formed my inmost being;  
you knit me in my mother's womb.

My very self you know." [Psalm 139:1-2, 13, 14b]

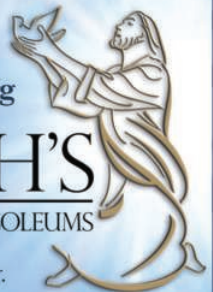
