**From the Pastor
1st Sunday of Advent - C
November 28, 2021**

NOVEMBER: MONTH OF ALL SOULS. In the last of our five-part Month of All Souls series on the Prayers for the Dead, we reflect on the very brief Rite of Final Commendation for an Infant. In Advent we are reminded that we will meet the Christ born for us at Christmas at His Second Coming - or our own death, whichever comes first. Holy Mother Church has an Order for the Blessing of Parents after a Miscarriage, which we plan to reflect on next year. But she also provides a tender Rite for infants who die while still in their mother's womb, during childbirth, or shortly thereafter.

From experience, having conducted these Rites, I know that these holy rituals can bring closure and comfort, hope and healing to those who have endured this most difficult and challenging of crosses. For the most part, I will let our Church speak for herself, and will only briefly comment on what, in her wisdom and experience, she offers for these most trying, painful and faith-questioning times. We begin with the Introduction to the Rite of Final Commendation for an Infant.

Rite of Final Commendation for an Infant - Intro

Dear friends, in the face of death all human wisdom fails. Yet the Lord teaches us, by the three days he spent in the tomb, that death has no hold over us. Christ has conquered death; his dying and rising have redeemed us. Even in our sorrow for the loss of this little child, we believe that, one short sleep past, he/she shall wake eternally.

ONE SHORT SLEEP PAST. As we often say, life goes so quickly; and the life of a centenarian is but a drop in the bucket compared to eternity! And so, this *Rite* begins by gently guiding us to take the *LONG* view of reality. Admitting that death is an enigma that can throw even the most faith-filled into a dismal misery, the *Church* quickly redirects our minds and hearts to the *Lord Jesus*, who not only *endured* death, but *conquered* death. So, every cemetery or final resting place of our beloved dead becomes - not just a sign or symbol of death - but also a promise: that we who have died in *Christ* will rise with Him on the *Last Day*.

"The Rite then continues with a Blessing and Litany imploring God's mercy.

Final Commendation/Infant - Blessing of the Body

Trusting in Jesus, the loving Savior, who gathered children into his arms and blessed the little ones, we now commend this infant [N.] to that same embrace of love, in the hope that he/she will rejoice and be happy in the presence of Christ. May the Angels and Saints lead him/her to the place of light and peace where one day we will be brought together again. Lord Jesus, lovingly receive this little child; bless him/her and take him/her to your Father. We ask this in hope, and we pray: Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

LET THE CHILDREN COME TO ME. Jesus grew indignant when some tried to keep children from Him. Would He not also embrace any child, from conception to the age of reason, who dies, even before Baptism? Offer these orations for all deceased babies and their loved ones.

Prayer of Commendation for an Infant - A

Tender Shepherd of the flock, N. now lies cradled in your love. Soothe the hearts of his/her parents and bring peace to their lives. Enlighten their faith and give hope to their hearts. Loving God, grant mercy to your entire family in this time of suffering. Comfort us with the hope that this child [N.] lives with you and your Son, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. Amen.

Prayer of Commendation for an Infant - B

Lord God, ever-caring and gentle, we commit to your love this little one, who brought joy to our lives for so short a time. Enfold him/her in eternal life. for the naming of an unnamed child, add: [Lord, you formed this child in the womb; you have known it by name before time began. We now wish to name this little one N. a name we shall treasure in our hearts for ever.] We pray for these parents who are saddened by the loss of their baby. Give them courage and help them in their pain and grief. May they all meet one day in the joy and peace of your kingdom. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

AN EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON THE TWO GREAT COMMANDMENTS (part one)

The Lord said: "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart."

Do I put my relationship with God first, above all things: my career and leisure time, my home and possessions - even above other people?

Do I allow the Lord to be my loving Father by entrusting all my joys and sorrows to God?

Do I leave God out of my life by not making time for regular private prayer or for worshipping with other Christians?

Do I rely on God's grace to avoid temptation and on the Church to restore me to grace?

Do I make important choices or decisions without first listening - as God speaks to me through prayer and Scripture, Church teaching and sacred liturgy?

Do I heed God's call to be a temple of His Spirit, an instrument of His grace, and channel of His loving forgiveness?

Do I truly become what I receive: the Body and Blood of Christ?

Do I act on my faith by allowing God and Church teaching to influence what I say and do, how I vote, form my values and my conscience?

Do I offer back to the Lord and His Church what God has entrusted to me: my time, talents, and the treasures I earn through the blessings and abilities God freely gives to me?

The Lord says "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Do I hurt or neglect my family, or withhold love from those closest to me?

Am I too guarded or afraid to reach out, too withdrawn in my own pursuits to hear and respond to the needs of others?

Do I argue too easily, deliberately hurt others, fail to ask for forgiveness, express my apologies, or take responsibility for my mistakes?

Do I withhold forgiveness or hold grudges, or demand from others what I refuse to them?

Do I hurt or neglect my friends or neighbors, my fellow parishioners or co-workers, my fellow citizens in this country?

Do I respect people of every race or language, nation or way of life?

Do I strive to be a peacemaker, or do I add more fuel to the fire?

Do I speak up for the rights of others, or do I remain mute and inactive in the face of injustice, falsehood, prejudice or apathy.

Do I defend and uphold the dignity of every person, born or unborn, young or old, polite or demanding, friend or enemy, healthy or sick, self-sufficient or needy?

Do I lead others to - or away from - God and His Church - by my words or example?

Am I known for my honesty and integrity, faithfulness to my word and Christian values?

Christ our Lord says: "Be perfect as your Father is perfect."

Do I take care of my body and my soul by exercising and eating properly, controlling my desires and feelings?

Do I engage in regular times of prayer, read the Bible and meditate on it?

Do I patiently accept sorrows and disappointments, and 'offer them up' so as to "fill up what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ?"

Do I maintain sensible boundaries and limitations so as not to damage my health or the wellbeing of others?

Do I keep my promises and vows, especially those made before God and His Church in Baptism and Confirmation, Matrimony and Holy Orders?

Do I practice the spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, of devotions and sacred customs?

Do I dishonor my own body - or the body of anyone else - in any way?

Do I protect myself from what could bring me harm in the marketplace and recreational places, in the media and on the internet?

Do I strive to live by Christian ideals, relying on the presence of God within me, or am I enslaved to any ungodly forces?
