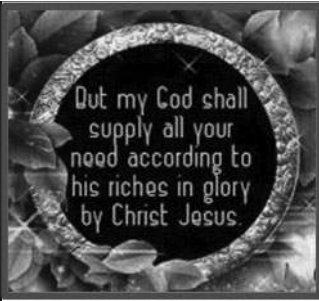

From the Pastor
1st Sunday of
Advent - C
[Thanksgiving Weekend]
December 1, 2024

GOD SHALL PROVIDE FOR ALL OUR NEEDS. As we bring another liturgical

year to its end, and enter the holy preparation time of **Advent**, we also pause to give thanks on this **Thanksgiving** weekend. The above quote is taken from one of **Saint Paul's Letters**: "My God will fully supply whatever you need, in accord with his glorious riches in Christ

Jesus." [Philippians 4:19] So, even as we give thanks, we boldly ask for even more ... but in the way our **Lord** wants us to ask, as we try to explain in these reflections on the following orations. They are taken from the first of two **Votive Masses** offered 'For Any Need.'

Collect - For Any Need - 48-A
O God, our refuge in trials,
our strength in sickness, our comfort in sorrow,
spare your people, we pray, that,
though rightly chastised now by affliction,
they may find relief at last
through your loving mercy.
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

WE OFTEN PUNISH OURSELVES. We are quick to say, "God is punishing me/you for ...", but we do not know if God truly wills to punish us - or is letting us pay the price for our choices. **Sacred Scripture** suggests it is often the **latter**. For the **Ten Commandments**, biblical ordinances and dictates, and **Church disciplines** and regulations all attest to **God's** desire to keep us from harming ourselves and others. However, whatever the causes of our sufferings may be, **God** provides the remedy, the medicine, the cure, for all that ails us. First, we must come to the **Lord** in prayer, ideally through the **Sacraments**; they are the main ways **God** strengthens and comforts us in our afflictions.

This oration calls to mind the image of a fearful, hurting child who has run into his or her father's arms. What loving father would not want his children to pour out their hearts, express every concern or problem, and make any request? Earthly fathers cannot always provide for their child's every want or need, and may, with good intention, even offer what may not be best for their child - but not our **Heavenly Father** who truly does know best! So, while we can pray for **our** will to be done, we must accept **God's** will.

Prayer over the Offerings - For Any Need - 48-A
Accept in compassion, Lord, we pray,
the offerings of your family,
that under your protective care
they may never lose what they have received
but attain the gifts that are eternal.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

ATTAIN GIFTS THAT ARE ETERNAL. In this passing world, we only fool ourselves when we think that earthly things will bring us lasting joy. As **Jesus** noted, we do need 'creature-comforts' and other necessities, for of them He said: "Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness." [Matthew 6:32b-33a] For only the things of heaven last forever and can bring us eternal joy. May we never allow our quest for all that **this** world offers keep us from entering and enjoying the delights of the **world-to-come**.

Prayer after Communion - For Any Need - 48-A
We pray, O Lord, that in receiving your Sacrament
we may experience help
in mind and body, so that,
kept safe in both, we may glory
in the fullness of heavenly healing.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

HELP IN MIND AND BODY. A conversation I have had all too often with the parents of school-aged children goes something like this. "Father, the **Church** makes too many demands on kids: religious formation classes, sacramental prep, and so on ... my boys are not going to be **Priests**; my girls will not be **Nuns** ... they need time for sports and other activities." First, I begin my response by simply asking for the same respect they give to their kids' coaches or instructors, whose requests or demands are rarely even questioned. Then I add that they are less likely to make the **Olympics** or major leagues than they are to become **Priests** or **Nuns**. I also point out that they will, in all probability, face dilemmas and issues that can only be faced with a firm faith in **God**. Lastly, I state what we often forget: we must all die and give an account of our life to the **Lord**. Do we use our time on earth to prepare our minds and bodies for eternity in heaven?

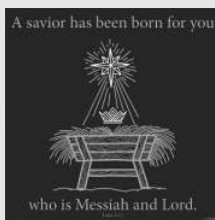

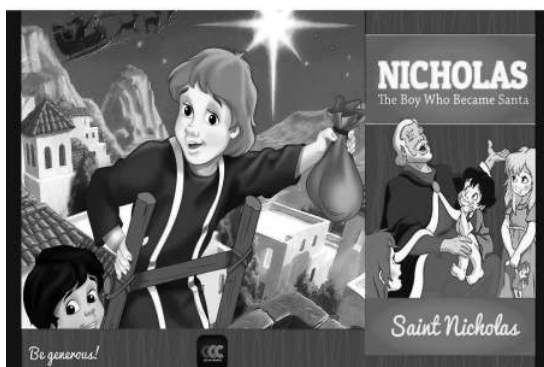
