From the Pastor
2nd Sunday of Advent - C
December 8, 2024

WHEN IS A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION NOT A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION? The Dicastery for Legislative Texts, a Department of the Roman Curia, the advisory body that assists the Holy Father in governing the Church, recently

responded to an inquiry from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. In 1992, a complementary norm stated that when "January 1 [Mary, Mother of God], August 15, [Assumption] or November 1 [All Saints] falls on Saturday or Monday" it is **NOT** a holy day of obligation. However, Christmas and, in the USA, our National Feast Day, December 8, The Immaculate Conception, are **always** holy days of obligation.

The two main reasons the other days that fall on Saturdays or Mondays are **NOT** holy days of obligation are: 1] there are too few Priests to celebrate all the Masses needed in 48 hours so all could fulfill **both** obligations, and the Church cannot oblige us to do what we cannot do. 2] Anticipatory Masses [commonly called 'Vigil Masses'] **cannot** fulfill **both** that particular Sunday **AND** the Solemnity; a Mass can only fulfill one day or the other.

In the USA, most Solemnities and Feasts of the Lord that fall on Sunday [each country has its own obligatory days] take precedence over the Ordinary Time [OT] Sunday Orations and Readings of that day. In 2025, it will happen the most often in any year: 2/2: Presentation of the Lord; 6/29: Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles; 9/14: Exaltation of the Holy Cross; 11/02: All Souls Day; and 11/09: The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. On all these OT Sundays, the Solemnity or Feast of the Lord will be celebrated, **NOT** the OT Sunday. Again, Christmas and the Immaculate Conception, as our National Feast Day, are **always** holy days of obligation. Here's where it gets messy.

The Sundays of *Advent* and *Christmastime*, *Lent* and *Easter*, and all of *Holy Week* and *Easter Week*, are 'privileged' days; when a *Solemnity* or a *Feast of the Lord* falls on these days, that *Solemnity* or *Feast* is transferred to the nearest non-privileged day. Recently, the *Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the BVM, March 19*, fell

on a Lenten Sunday, so it was transferred to the next day. The Annunciation of the Lord, March 25, fell during Holy Week, and was moved to the next available day, which was April 8: the Monday after the 2nd Sunday of Easter. [Some joked that Jesus was a 'preemie' last year, with only 261 days, rather than 275 days, between His Virginal Conception in the womb of the BVM and His Nativity or Birth. [A 'true' preemie is at least 3 weeks early.] This also happens in Ireland on their National Feast Day, Saint Patrick's Day; when it falls on a Lenten Sunday or during Holy Week, it is transferred to another day.

Anyway, it was assumed that, when a holy day of obligation is **transferred**, the obligation to attend holy Mass is **NOT** transferred. However, when some questioned this custom that has been in effect in the USA since 1992, our Bishops sought clarification from the Dicastery for Legislative Texts. They responded: the canonical statements that govern such situations do **not** allow for the obligation to be abrogated or 'lifted.' So, when holy day of obligation is transferred, the obligation to participate in holy Mass remains ... but wait, there's more ...

While Canon Law permits **PASTORS** to dispense those who, for a valid reason, are unable to participate in a holy day of obligation Mass, such a dispensation may not be needed. For all who, due to the demands of work, school, or other obligations, cannot attend holy Mass on these days, can deal with it themselves. Those **TRULY** unable to participate in holy Mass on a holy day of obligation can choose other options, like spending time in prayer. The same is true for those unable to abstain from meat when required to do so in Lent; they can perform another penitential act or abstain another day.

This may be confusing to those who want a 'black and white' world, which does not exist. It assumes that we will act **honestly** and **maturely**, doing all we can to fulfil all obligations, without looking for shortcuts or excuses. So, while I hope to see you at holy Mass this Monday, know that, if you are **truly** unable to attend holy Mass, our Blessed Mother will be pleased with **whatever** you do to celebrate her Immaculate Conception?

Have I acknowledged the quality of all people, regardless of their educational background, lifestyle, spirituality, political party, economic situation, physical or emotional condition, race or nationality?

Do I do all I am called to do so everyone, in every age and place, will call me blessed?

Have I taken credit for what I have not done? Have I denied my own participation in the evil that takes place in my community, my Church, my family, my Country, or any associations?

"He has thrown down the rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the lowly."
