

From the Pastor  
2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of  
Advent - B  
December 10, 2023

**PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD.** November is the Month of All Souls, but the first part of Advent also highlights human mortality and death. While the focus of LATE Advent, December 17-

24, is our Lord's FIRST Coming, at Christmas ... the weeks of 'early' Advent emphasize our need to be ready to meet Christ at His SECOND Coming or Return in Glory ... to prepare for the end of ALL time or at the end of our own time on earth - whichever comes first!

All are not granted sufficient time to prepare to 'meet their Maker.' In last week's bulletin article, we reflected on the Collect used at funerals for those who die young - and on 10/17/2021, on the one used for those who died suddenly.

Today, we reflect on the Collect used at funerals of those who had many months, years or even decades to prepare for death, from Masses for the Dead: #8: 'For One Who Suffered a Long Illness.' Pray it, then read my thoughts about such sad situations.

**Collect - Masses for the Dead: #8  
For One Who Suffered a Long Illness**

O God, who called your servant N.  
to serve you in affliction and sickness,  
grant, we pray, that he/she, who  
followed your Son's example of suffering,  
may also receive the reward of his glory.  
Who lives and reigns ... for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Scriptures offer us great hope! Our First Reading [Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11] promises us God's gentle embrace, comfort, and tender, consoling words. In our Second Reading, our first Pope assures us that God can use even life's misfortunes to draw us closer to Himself. [2 Peter 3:8-14] And in the Gospel, Saint John the Baptist assures us that a mighty Savior is coming to help us. However, when a debilitating or slowly progressing illness strikes, the faithful can be derailed, deluged by doubts, and drawn to despair. Even Jesus, while on the Cross, asked, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" [Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34]

**"...WHEN YOUR FAITH IS TESTED..."** These words come from an Apostle's Letter. "Consider it all joy ... when you encounter various trials, for you

know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. And let perseverance be perfect, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing." [James 1:3-4] In His Beatitudes, Jesus proclaimed "Blessed" all who suffer because of their faith, which often happens to those who trust in God's love, even while enduring pain or sickness. [Cf. Matthew 5:10-12] This stark reality is not only true for those who are sick and dying; it is also true for their caregivers and loved ones, who also suffer, and the health care professionals who face frustration as their best efforts fail.

It is heart-wrenching to hear the sick confess that they want to die rather than be a burden to others. It is equally sad to hear others confess that they are praying for their sick loved one to die, which may not be sinful but an act of faith. Often, at funerals for those who suffered a long illness, I am aware that some mourners have a sense of relief that the ordeal is over ... and a hefty sense of guilt that they could have done more, been more patient, or not prayed that it would be over. These natural feelings need the supernatural grace which God and His Church can provide to those open to divine forgiveness, understanding and wisdom. And a source of this heavenly help is the Catholic Church's Funeral Rites.

Very few bravely stood at the foot of the Cross: our Blessed Mother, the Beloved Disciple, whom we presume was the Apostle John, and a few female disciples. Yet the Risen Lord forgave the other Apostles, who had abandoned Him in His time of need. We pray that our deceased loved ones, whom we may have disappointed, also forgive us. And we trust that our Blessed Mother and all the Angels and Saints always accompany all of us, at all times, especially when we are suffering in sickness or pain - and are dying.

**OUR FINAL REWARD.** As the last line of this oration requests, we pray that those who accept suffering as Christ did, with patient trust, will also share in 'the reward of his glory.' We also pray that those who journeyed with them through the dark valley of death will also share in the reward promised to those who follow Christ's example on suffering and acceptance. May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.



Sign-up sheets are posted in the Sacristy for **MASSES FOR CHRISTMAS**, for anyone who serves at Mass as Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, Lector, Usher, or Altar Server. **Please sign-up for the Mass that you will be attending!**

Before coming to *Confession*, use an '*Examen*' [below] to examine your conscience. Begin with your state in life [*i.e.*, married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last *Confession*; list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: *i.e.*, impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; pray the *Act of Contrition* AFTER you leave

### A BIBLICAL EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

*"The LORD God ... called to the man and asked him:*

*'Where are you?'*

*He answered, 'I heard you in the garden; but I was afraid, because I was naked, so I hid.'*  
[Genesis 3:9-10]

Am I growing in my capacity for truly loving, honest and mutually-respectful relationships?

Am I honest with myself? Am I honest with those I love? Am I honest with God?

Do I need to grow in courage, and in my ability to deal with conflict in honest, respectful and constructive ways?

Am I so afraid of God - or of what He asks of me - that I try to hide from the LORD or from the Church's rites and rituals?

Am I a respectful, dependable person, in whom others see another Christ?

Do I think of my activity - family, work, leisure - as ways to serve God and bring God's presence into the world?

*"Lord, you have probed me, you know me: you know when I sit and stand; you understand my thoughts from afar. You formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb. My very self you know."* [Psalm 139:1-2, 13, 14b]

Do I misuse the gifts God has entrusted to me: All my talents? All my treasure? All my knowledge? All my abilities and skills?

Do I use God's gift of my sexuality for manipulation or pleasure rather than an expression of mature, committed, monogamous love?

Have I taken seriously God's personal call to me - to be holy - to be His child in every sense of the word - by participating weekly in the Sunday Eucharist and other religious services?

Have I taken the time to pray and to allow God's love to touch me?

Am I aware of the sacredness of earth and life; do I build my life upon that awareness?

Do I avail myself to the sacramental grace that comes to us in the Most Holy Eucharist and in Confession, Penance or Reconciliation?

*"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love."*  
[John 15:9-10a]

Do I do all I can to bring Christ's compassion and justice into my little part of the world, through all I say and do?

Do I have a genuine love and concern for others? Or have I hardened my heart toward certain people, or refused to reach out to those whom I have hurt?

Am I living a life committed to justice?

Do I participate actively in community and political life, making all my decisions according to the Gospel?

Have I succumbed to prejudice, bigotry or any form of degradation of people?

Am I growing in my capacity for steadfast and committed love: of myself, of my family and of my friends?

Am I also growing in my capacity for steadfast and committed love for the poorest and for the most rejected, in whom God is also present?

Loving God, your mercy is our hope: welcome us to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

### ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SIN

Make us a living sign of your love for all to see: people reconciled with you and with each other.

Make us grow in your peace: and seek to spread it throughout the world.

In forgiving our sins help us to love others and to forgive their sins against us.

Give light to our darkness: and lead us by your truth.

In your mercy free us from the past: and enable us to begin a new life of holiness.

Overcome the harm our sinfulness has brought us: and guide us back into the ways of love and peace.
